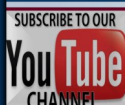

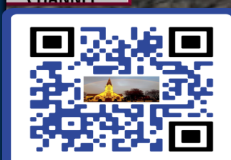

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

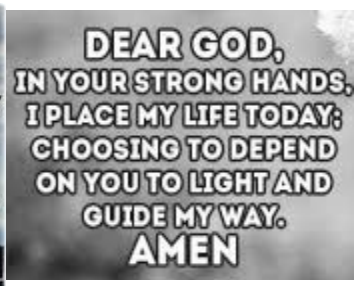
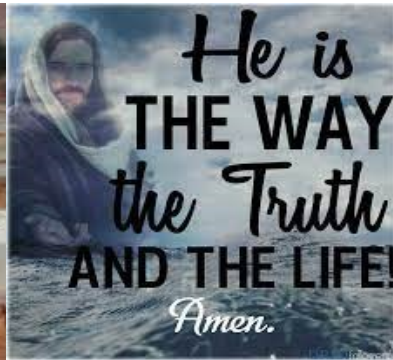
Recently, I went through a period of spiritual dryness, and I questioned my ability to make faith the central tenet of my life. Although I had always loved reading Scripture, I felt I needed reassurance that God was truly present with me. So I did what many people do: I asked God for a sign that he was real. Nothing happened. The sky didn't open; doves and rays of light didn't magically appear announcing God's presence. Although I didn't receive what I envisioned as a "heavenly sign," I looked down at the Bible in my hands and realized that God's word, handed down through the millennia, had been my companion all this time and was indeed the "sign" I was looking for. Which is why Jesus' question to Philip in today's Gospel struck a chord with me: "Have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me?" If Jesus asked me this same question, I want to be able to answer, "Yes, Lord, I know you through your sacred word, through partaking of the Eucharist and through the strength and guidance of the Holy Spirit who is with me each and every day."

ACTION Faith is rarely a straight path – sometimes there are sharp curves, steep hills, or roadblocks. If you feel lost or could use someone to talk to about faith, reach out to your parish and ask about contacting a spiritual director. *Come, Holy Spirit, and fill me with your grace.*

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

What does "knowing Jesus" mean for me in my everyday life? It means hearing his words and acting on them: "I am the way and the truth and the life ... If you know me, then you will also know my Father." In following Christ, we know that Jesus is in the Father and the Father is in him. Jesus Christ is God! And as we heard in the second reading from Peter, we are not Christians on a lonely road; we are living stones that form a spiritual house. We are "called out of darkness into his wonderful light," as he describes it. Therefore, let us not be afraid to lean on our fellow Christians when we need support. And then, of course, we turn to Jesus, the cornerstone, the bedrock of our faith, and rejoice in his love for us.

Leadership matters! The Blessed Mother played a significant leadership role in the Upper Room, the place where the disciples gathered after the resurrection of Jesus. She helped to guide them in their new role as leaders of the early church to receive the Holy Spirit to continue the salvific mission of Jesus on earth. (Act1:14). She was a source of comfort, support, and guidance for the disciples and now for us, and she helped to ensure that the teachings of Jesus would be preserved for future generations.

Between May 13 and October 13, 1917, three Portuguese children received apparitions of Our Lady near Fatima, a city 110 miles north of Lisbon. Mary asked the children to pray the Rosary for world peace, for the end of World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia. As a parish, I invite you to heed the words of our Holy Mother and pray the **Rosary daily during May at 8.25 am** in the church and invite you to join us for Holy Mass on May 13, Saturday, at 5 pm followed by a candle-light procession. On Mother's Day, we invite you to join us for **May Crowning** and honor Blessed Mother, our spiritual mother, and all our earthly mothers for their role in our lives.

Remember that Rosaries are not just decorations. Battles have been won because people prayed the Rosary! Hearts converted, Satan defeated, illnesses cured, and even some impossible intentions answered. Life can only be blessed if we start praying the Rosary. So take up your beads, take the time daily, and pray the Rosary! St. Josemaria Escriva teaches us, "The holy Rosary is a powerful weapon. Use it confidently, and you'll be amazed at the results."

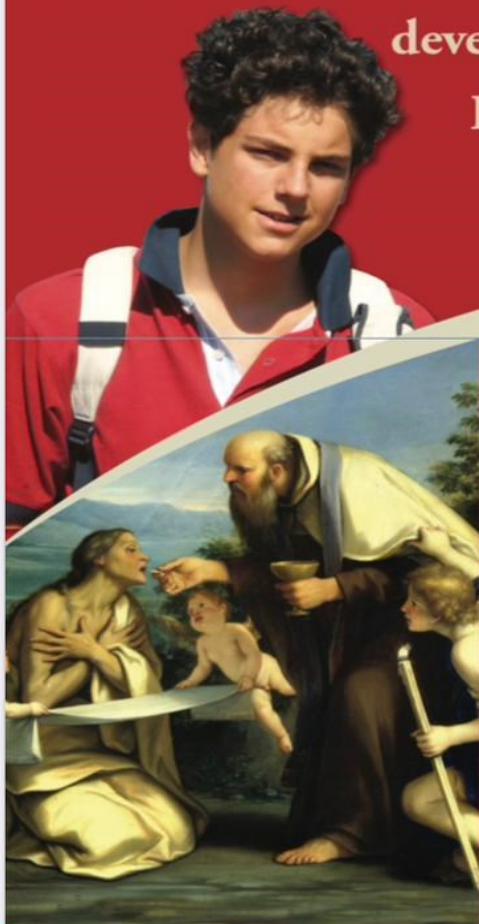

One Minute Meditations

Act in confidence

Jesus does not want us to be troubled by worldly concerns.

"My peace I give you" (John 14:27). When you feel

yourself starting to worry or stew about a difficult situation (or person), act out your belief that your prayer for resolution will be answered. Substitute positive, cheerful thoughts for negative ones. God is in control.



Your Lenten change

Lent is a time when we make changes that bring us closer to God. During Lent, many of us fast from our favorite food or drink, and approach Easter a little lighter in spirit and in body. Don't forget that a Lenten change can continue beyond Easter. Consider continuing your Lenten fast on Fridays throughout the year, or for a week each month, for example. Find ways to make your Lenten change permanent.

Rest and relax

God expects us to be sure to rest. *"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest"* (Matthew 11:28).



Welcome all God's children

God loves each of us uniquely and fiercely no matter where we come from or how we look. Those of us who follow Him know that it's not just important to love each other. It's God's law.

Celebrate diversity. Invite foreigners or people who are different from you to your home or church. Jesus

was once a foreigner in a strange land and was grateful for the hospitality He received. There is great diversity in the Communion of Saints.

Practice patience. It can be tough to listen to someone with a speech impediment or a heavy accent. Imagine, though, how grateful that

person will be when you offer your attention. Perhaps it would help to imagine the face of Christ in the face before you.

Counsel the ignorant. Someone from another country, background, or with different abilities than yours might behave in what looks like an inconsiderate way out of ignorance or limitations. He might appreciate being informed.

Speak up. Don't stay quiet when you witness prejudice,

and be positive about diversity if friends or relatives start criticizing others' faith, cultures or abilities.

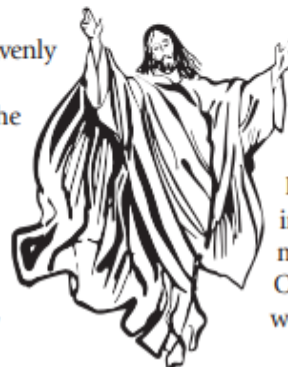
Act with love. The God of love gave of Himself so we could be reunited with Him. We share that love when we assume the best of others and look for the good in all God's children.



Why Do Catholics Do That?

Why do Catholics celebrate the Ascension?

Jesus' Ascension into heavenly glory is good news. Sacred Scripture explains that in the Ascension, Jesus, the High Priest, entered the heavenly temple to pray for us with the Father (Hebrews 9:24). Secondly, from his throne in heaven,



Jesus sends us the Holy Spirit, who keeps us connected to Him, especially in the Eucharist. Lastly, since Christ entered into eternal glory, we as the members of His Body, the Church, may hope to follow if we remain faithful to Him.

Take good care of yourself. You belong to God.

Taking care of ourselves can become a low priority in the midst of other obligations. Yet caring for our bodies and minds is a duty we have to God. He needs us strong and healthy so we can help build up His kingdom.

Body: What you put into your body is even more important than what you put on it. Take steps to make your diet healthier and more nourishing. Avoid drugs or excessive alcohol. Doctors urge daily exercise and eight hours of sleep each night.



Mind: Become picky about what you feed your mind, too. What you watch, read, and listen to influences the way you look at the world. Evidence shows that it's hard to regularly watch violent shows or movies and still be a calm and happy person. Programs or movies that portray infidelity or promiscuity as acceptable behaviors eventually dull our sense of sin. Feed your mind positive, Gospel-centered images that will build you up and inspire you. Surround yourself with people who do the same.

from Scripture

John 20:19-23, "Receive the Holy Spirit"

This Gospel passage gives us a glimpse of how the apostles spent their first Easter Sunday – hiding in a locked room.

They were terrified the Romans would find them and execute them. To their surprise and great relief, Jesus appeared to them in glory and spoke words of peace. He showed them His glorious wounds as "living proof" of His Resurrection.

Then Jesus gave them a mission: "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained" establishing the Sacrament of Penance (John 20:23). He gave them the Holy Spirit, anticipating the feast of



Pentecost. Now, having authority to forgive sins, the apostles and their successors could continue

Jesus' work after He returned to heaven.

Jesus' appearance to His apostles reveals the fullness of God's mercy. He also sent the Holy Spirit to them. He descended powerfully on Pentecost, the birthday of the Church. That same

Spirit is gifted to us in Baptism and dwells in our souls. Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal God's love to you and help you become more like Christ each day.

Feasts & Celebrations

May 3 – Sts. Philip and James (1st Century). St. Philip was born in Bethsaida and followed John the Baptist before he followed Christ. After the Ascension, St. Philip preached in Asia Minor, where he was martyred. St. James, son of Alphaeus, was also one of the twelve Apostles.

May 10 - St. John of Ávila (1569). Born to wealthy, pious parents, St. John left a budding career as a lawyer to become a priest. At the request of his bishop, he worked and preached to renew the faith of Catholics in Andalusia.

May 18 – Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord (1st Century). This solemnity marks the completion of Jesus' mission of salvation and His triumphant entry into heaven. *Note: In many dioceses, observance of Ascension has been moved to the following Sunday.*

May 25 – St. Mary Magdalene de' Pazzi (1607). Born to a distinguished Florentine family, Catherine de' Pazzi became a Carmelite nun.

Upon making vows, she experienced ecstasies, and became a mystic and a healer.



Q & A What is the meaning of the Miraculous Medal?

The Miraculous Medal, given to St. Catherine Labouré in 1830, was designed by the Blessed Mother to teach us three things:

Mary prays for us: The medal's front reads: *O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee.* We don't



pray to her; she prays for us! Of course, we can go directly to Jesus anytime. In fact, Mary's role is to bring us to Jesus as swiftly and safely as possible.

Evil can be defeated: Mary is shown crushing Satan's head, recalling the prophecy of his defeat (Genesis 3:15). Mary's humble "yes" to God paved the way for Christ's victory over death, sin, and evil. When we give God our "yes," then Christ's victory bears fruit in our lives.

Grace is always available: St. Catherine asked why only some of the gemstones in Mary's rings radiated light. Her answer? The dim gems symbolize "the graces for which souls forget to ask." God's grace is always available to us. All we have to do is ask.

Quien me ha visto a mí ha visto al Padre. ¿Cómo dices tú: “Muéstranos al Padre”? ¿No crees que yo estoy en el Padre, y el Padre en mí? Lo que yo os digo no lo hablo por cuenta propia. El Padre, que permanece en mí, él mismo hace las obras. Creedme: yo estoy en el Padre y el Padre en mí. Si no, creed a las obras. En verdad, en verdad os digo: el que cree en mí, también él hará las obras que yo hago, y aun mayores, porque yo me voy al Padre».

Palabra del Señor / Gloria a ti Señor Jesús

Papa Francisco—Tres Puertas 5/16/2014

Es Jesús mismo quien nos dice «que Él es el camino: Yo soy el camino, la verdad y la vida. Todo. Yo te doy la vida, yo me manifiesto como verdad y si tú vienes conmigo, soy el camino». He aquí entonces que para conocer a quien se presenta como «camino, verdad y vida», es necesario ponerse «en camino». Es más, «el conocimiento de Jesús es el trabajo más importante de nuestra vida». También porque conociéndole se llega a conocer al Padre.

Pero, se preguntó el Pontífice, ¿cómo podemos conocer a Jesús?».

De aquí la indicación de las tres puertas que hay que abrir para «conocer a Jesús». La primera —orar— «el estudio sin la oración no sirve. Los grandes teólogos hacen teología de rodillas». Sí, «con el estudio nos acercamos un poco, sin la oración jamás conoceremos a Jesús».

La segunda —celebrar— ya que también la oración sola «no basta; es necesaria la alegría de la celebración: celebrar a Jesús en sus sacramentos, porque ahí nos da la vida, nos da la fuerza, nos da la comida, nos da el consuelo, nos da la alianza, nos da la misión. Sin la celebración de los sacramentos no llegaremos a conocer a Jesús. Y esto es propio de la Iglesia».

Finalmente, para abrir la tercera puerta, -la de la imitación de Cristo-, la consigna es coger el Evangelio para descubrir allí «qué hizo Él, cómo era su vida, qué nos dijo, qué nos enseñó», para poder «intentar imitarle».

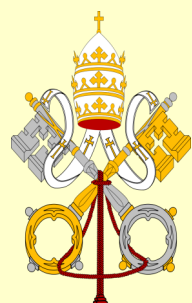
