**GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE**

When Samuel hears the Lord speak in today's first reading, he mistakes it as Eli calling out to him in the temple. The third time Samuel asks if he called, Eli is wise enough to realize what is going on and guides Samuel: "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." Samuel required guidance because he "was not familiar with the Lord, because the Lord had not revealed anything to him as yet." In a similar way does the Apostle Andrew come to the Lord. In today's Gospel, Andrew didn't know who Jesus was until John the Baptist told him: "Behold, the Lamb of God." Andrew then began to follow Jesus, and to bring others to him. There may be times when we, like both of these men, need someone else to help us hear the call of the Lord clearly, or see his presence among us. Those who serve the Lord in this way are a great gift to us, and enable us to be that gift for others. Pray for the grace to hear what we need to hear, to see what we need to see, and to say to others, "come, we have found the Messiah."

**GO EVANGELIZE**

**PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT**

Despite our best efforts, the time and attention we give to our lives of faith can ebb and flow. Sometimes we can feel so connected with God that we sense his presence everywhere. But there may also be times when God feels distant and we struggle to hear his voice. Notice in today's readings how Samuel "was not familiar with the Lord" but was sleeping in the temple, close to the ark; notice how Andrew was hanging around John the Baptist and immediately followed Christ when told who he was. We can see that, already before "knowing," is a "desire to know." The Lord created us, formed us into being, and calls us to a relationship with him. We are drawn to him even before we can see or know what he has revealed to us. He is our source, and our ultimate end. We seek eternal life with Christ and a path of holiness to help us on our way. The stories of Samuel and the disciple Andrew impress upon us that God is always near and calling to us - we simply must give him the opportunity to speak, sometimes when we least expect it.

**INVITATION**

We are all called to a life of holiness. But it's not always easy to grow in holiness and strengthen one's relationship with God on our own. Consider reaching out to your parish and asking about spiritual direction - a spiritual director will help you fine tune your ears to be more attentive to the Lord's voice.

In today's first reading, God called young Samuel in a special way. Samuel's life had been dedicated to God, and because he was willing to follow God's plan, God made Samuel a holy prophet.

In the Gospel reading, Saint John the Baptist tells his followers that Jesus is the Messiah. Two of them decided to follow Jesus, and one of them, Andrew, went and got his brother Simon. When Simon went to follow Him, Jesus told him that his name would now be "Cephas," or "Peter," which means 'rock.' God had a special plan for Simon Peter. He was to become the leader of the Church- the first pope!

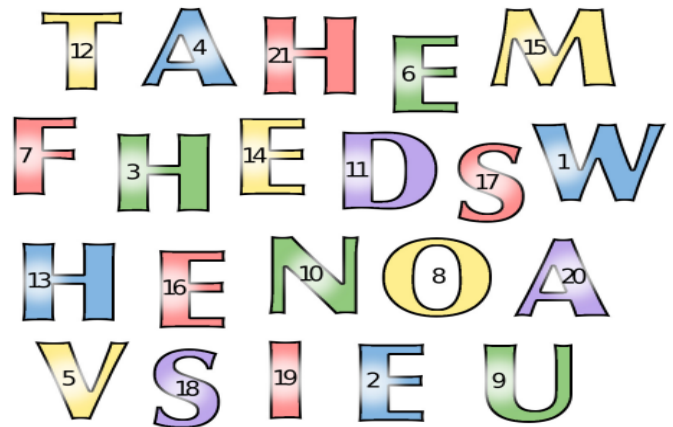

Jonah 3:1-5,10; Ps 25:4-9; 1 Corinthians 7:29-31; Mark 1:14-20

**No better time than now**

This Sunday's Gospel reading is a call to surrender ourselves fully to God. "NOW is the time of fulfillment" - not just 2000 years ago, not at the Second Coming of Christ, but right now in your life when and where you need Jesus the most.

"The kingdom of God is at hand" - what you need from the Lord is right here, at hand, ready for you.

"Repent, and believe in the gospel" means "Come follow Me and learn from Me to become like Me." For the first disciples, it meant dropping whatever they were doing to spend so much time with Jesus that their whole lives were forever affected. And this is what it means for you and for me: We have to put aside our own agendas and busy schedules to spend more time following Jesus wherever he leads us.

In the modern world, we have become more dependent on our technological devices than on Jesus. Many of us cannot even go on vacation without remaining accessible to their employers via the cell phone. Somehow, we need to find a way to take a stand against this. It's one of the social justice teachings of the Church: We are actually called by God to rebel against working on Sundays and other days of rest. Why? Because we need to spend that time with Jesus getting renewed, restored and re-energized.

Unfortunately, Jesus doesn't walk through the door and circle dates on our calendar and write "Rest with Jesus" so that we can plan ahead. We have to follow his lead at a moment's notice - every moment. To experience the kingdom of God on the earthly side of heaven, we have to be willing to drop everything to follow Jesus into unfamiliar places at unexpected times. We have to learn to follow his lead even in situations where his way is the surprising way.

**Questions for Personal Reflection:**

What's on your to-do list? What keeps you busy? What are your goals for the future? What are you dreaming of? If Jesus has a different plan for your day or for your life, how easily could you switch over to new ideas and plans?

**Questions for Community Faith Sharing:**

What are some of the nets you've abandoned in the past in order to follow Jesus? How difficult was that to do? Are you happy about it now? Why? How was this an experience of the kingdom of God on earth?

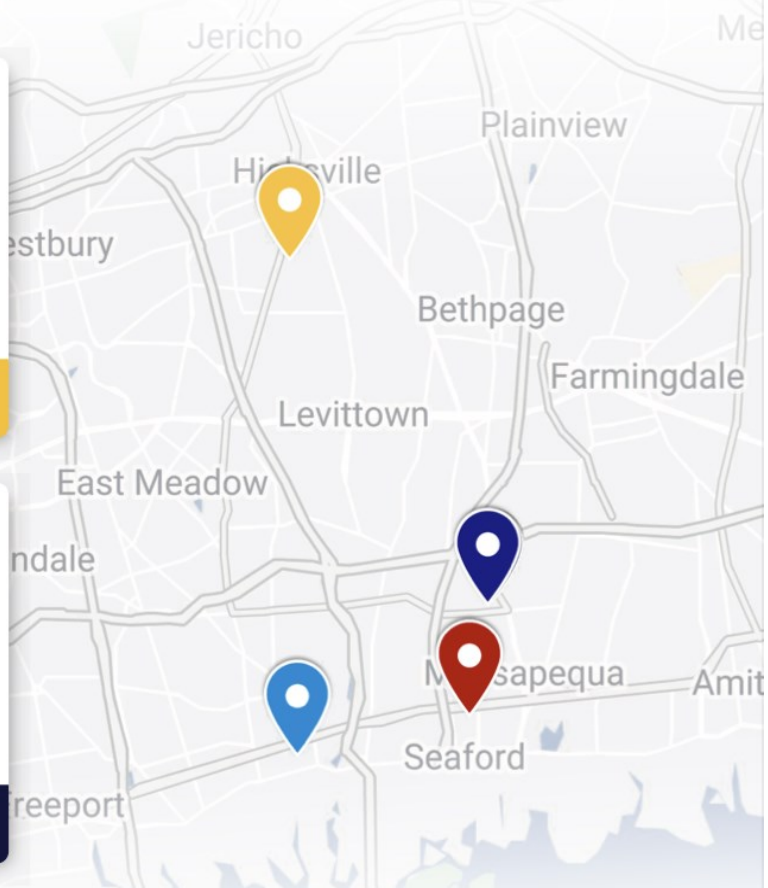

## Meditaciones breves

### Santa Margarita Bourgeoys

Nacida en Troyes, Francia, en 1620, santa Margarita

se consagró muy temprano a Dios y deseaba ser misionera.

Fue presentada al alcalde de Ville Marie (la actual Montreal) en Canadá y, por invitación de este, santa Margarita viajó al Nuevo Mundo para enseñar. Fundó con otras mujeres la Congregación de Nuestra Señora de Montreal, una orden sin clausura dedicada a la enseñanza que fue aprobada en 1676. A su muerte en 1700 era conocida como "Madre de la Colonia".



### Celebre la vida

Enero es el mes durante el cual nuestra Iglesia celebra la vida. En este mes reconocemos que todos somos reflejos de Dios y que para él tenemos un gran valor desde el momento de la concepción hasta la muerte natural. Celebrar la vida significa estar a favor del ser humano cada día del año.

## Este año, no descuide la "sola cosa necesaria"

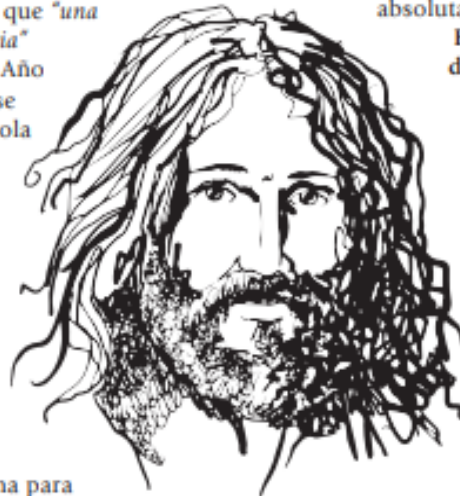
Cuando santa Marta se quejó a Jesús porque su hermana, María, estaba sentada a los pies de Jesús en vez de ayudarla a atenderlo, Jesús corrigió a Marta por olvidar que *"una sola cosa es necesaria"* (Lucas 10:42). En Año Nuevo, propóngase no descuidar la "sola cosa necesaria" y cultivar una relación íntima con Jesús.

Construya una "capilla interior". Mientras predicaba por el mundo, santa Catalina de Siena tenía una "capilla interior" en su alma para hablar con Dios, con el corazón en la mano. Jesús nos instó a que hagamos lo mismo (Mateo 6:6). Bloquee el mundo durante algún tiempo y refúgiase cada día en su capilla interior.

Siéntese a sus pies. María creía en Jesús y le dio lo mejor de sí misma. Él debe ser nuestra esperanza, nuestra salvación, nuestro todo. Esto es absolutamente necesario.

Encuéntrelo en los demás. La madre Teresa dijo: "Si no puedes oír a Jesús en el silencio de tu propio corazón, no serás capaz de oírlo cuando dice "Tengo sed" en los corazones de los pobres". Cuanto más nos acerquemos a Dios, mejor lo "veremos" y lo amaremos en los demás.

Sírvalo. Aunque María no se ocupaba de Cristo como Marta, lo estaba sirviendo en un modo más profundo y más auténtico. Nadie sirve a Cristo mejor que escuchando sus palabras y cumpliendo su voluntad.

## ¿Por qué fue bautizado Jesús?

Aunque Jesús estaba libre de pecado le permitió a san Juan Bautista que lo bautizara para cumplir *"todo como debe hacerse"* (Mateo 3:15). Con este gesto Jesús indicaba su disposición a quitarnos los pecados por su muerte y traernos vida nueva por su resurrección.



Además, mediante su bautismo, Jesús estableció el sacramento del Bautismo, el sacramento por el que somos santificados y recreados como hijos de Dios. Somos místicamente bautizados en la muerte de Jesús para ser alzados por él en la gloria.

# Recuperar el Nombre

El mes de enero tradicionalmente se dedica a honrar el santo nombre de Jesús. ¿Qué podemos hacer para recuperar la reverencia por su nombre en una cultura que lo considera solo una palabra más?

**Incline la cabeza.** *"Para que al nombre de Jesús se doble toda rodilla en el cielo, en la tierra y en los abismos"* (Filipenses 2:10). Haga una leve y reverente inclinación de cabeza cuando oiga el nombre de Jesús en público, en la TV o en películas.

**Ofrezca una oración.** No vacile en pedir a otras personas que no usen mal el nombre de Dios o de



Jesús. Si no responden, ofrezca una oración como reparación: "Ante ti me arrodillo y te ofrezco reparación; compensaré por todas las blasfemias contra tu santo nombre".

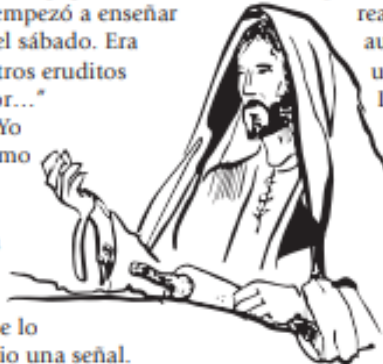
**No normalice la blasfemia.** Preste atención a los medios de comunicación que mira, escucha o con los que canta. Evite canciones, programas o películas donde se ofende el nombre de Jesús. Somos llamados a aspirar a la santidad, no a lo mundanal. Especialmente es una forma de darle a Cristo la reverencia y el respeto que se merece.

## de las **E**scrituras

### Marcos 1:21-28, Lo que Dios dice sucede

En este pasaje evangélico, Jesús y sus apóstoles entraron en la sinagoga de Cafarnaúm donde Jesús empezó a enseñar durante las asambleas del sábado. Era costumbre que los maestros eruditos dijieran: "Así dice el Señor..." Jesús, en cambio, dijo: "Yo les digo..." Enseñaba como quien habla con la autoridad de Dios.

Su autoridad tranquila impresionó a sus oyentes. Cuando empezaban a preguntarse lo que quería decir, él les dio una señal. Demostró aún más su autoridad realizando un exorcismo. Los espíritus malos que se habían apoderado de un desgraciado en la sinagoga reconocieron quién era Jesús. A pesar de su resistencia



tuvieron que obedecerlo cuando les ordenó que salieran del hombre. En realidad, el poder y la autoridad de Dios no son una mera formalidad. Lo que Dios dice, sucede. Nuestro amable y benévolo Salvador es también nuestro poderoso e impresionante Señor. Como segunda persona de la Trinidad, Jesús tiene suprema majestad y nosotros nos presentaremos ante él un día para ser juzgados. Sí, él es nuestro divino salvador y mediador. Pero si decimos "Jesús es Señor", es porque le damos nuestra lealtad y nuestra obediencia.

## **P & R** Qué hacer cuando la oración parece apática

"No me siento cercano a Dios". "¿De verdad escucha?" Lo cierto es que Dios nos sigue con amor y quiere compartir su júbilo con nosotros (*Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica*, #1). Sin embargo, hasta la más apasionada vida de oración puede parecer apática. Ponga a prueba estas sugerencias para mantener viva su plegaria:



**Cultive la gratitud.** Aunque Dios no nos abandona nunca, cosas como la salud o el humor pueden afectar nuestra oración. San Alfonso Liguori recomendaba: "Recuerde a menudo el amor en lo que Dios ha hecho por usted". Repasar nuestras bendiciones nos ayuda a apreciar el amor de Dios conforme avanza el tiempo.

**No se demore en pedir ayuda.** El corazón de Dios siempre está abierto para nosotros. La "buena" oración tiene lugar cuando somos sinceros con él. Esto es un ejercicio de fe, que él recompensa con generosidad.

**Trátele con amor.** Dios quiere una relación de amor, respeto y lealtad con cada uno de nosotros. Si la oración parece vacía, intente tratar a Dios con el amor, la consideración y la ternura que usted da y recibe de las personas cercanas a usted. ¡Verá la diferencia!

## Fiestas y celebraciones

**1 de enero** – Solemnidad de María, Santa Madre de Dios. Cuando celebramos esta fiesta, honramos a María, pero también reconocemos a Jesús como verdadero Dios y verdadero hombre.

**8 de enero** – Bautismo del Señor (siglo I). Jesús comenzó su vida pública siendo bautizado por san Juan Bautista. Jesús tenía que ser bautizado para cumplir "todo como debe hacerse" (Mateo 3:15). Fue también cuando Dios revela que Jesús es su "Hijo, el Amado" (Mateo 3:17).

**26 de enero** – Santa Paula (404). Tras

la muerte de su esposo – un senador romano llamado Toxocio – santa Paula abandonó su acomodado estilo de vida por el evangelio, dedicándose a la oración, a la pobreza y a las obras de caridad. También fue amiga de san Jerónimo a quien apoyó cuando traducía la Vulgata.

**31 de enero** – San Juan Bosco (1888). Conmovido por los apuros de los jóvenes abandonados de Roma, san Juan abrió el Oratorio de san Francisco de Sales, estableciendo talleres de fabricación de calzado y de sastrería. En 1859 fundó los Salesianos que se dedicaron a la educación y a las misiones.

## Evangelio según San Juan (Jn. 1, 35-42)

En aquel tiempo, estaba Juan el Bautista con dos de sus discípulos, y fijando los ojos en Jesús, que pasaba, dijo: "Éste es el Cordero de Dios". Los dos discípulos, al oír estas palabras, siguieron a Jesús. Él se volvió hacia ellos, y viendo que lo seguían, les preguntó: "¿Qué buscan?" Ellos le contestaron: "¿Dónde vives, Rabi?" (Rabi significa 'maestro'). Él les dijo: "Vengan a ver". Fueron, pues, vieron dónde vivía y se quedaron con él ese día. Eran como



las cuatro de la tarde. Andrés, hermano de Simón Pedro, era uno de los dos que oyeron lo que Juan el Bautista decía y siguieron a Jesús. El primero a quien encontró Andrés, fue a su hermano Simón, y le dijo: "Hemos encontrado al Mesías" (que quiere decir 'el Ungido'). Lo llevó a donde estaba Jesús y éste, fijando en él la mirada, le dijo: "Tú eres Simón, hijo de Juan. Tú te llamarás Kefás" (que significa Pedro, es decir 'roca'). Palabra del Señor / Gloria a ti Señor Jesús

### De la Homilía 19 de San Juan Crisóstomo

*Jesús fijó en Pedro su mirada y le dijo: Tú eres Simón, hijo de Juan. Tú te llamarás Kefas, que significa Pedro o Piedra. Comienza aquí Jesús a revelar su divinidad poco a poco y sin sentir, mediante las predicciones. Así procedió con Natanael y con la mujer samaritana.*

*«Tú eres Simón, hijo de Juan; desde ahora te llamarás Cefas, es decir Pedro». Este fue el nombre que Cristo dio a Simón. A Santiago y a su hermano los llamará «hijos del trueno» (Mc 3, 17). ¿Por qué estos cambios de nombre? Para mostrar que él, Jesús, es el mismo que había establecido la antigua alianza, que había cambiado el nombre de Abram en Abraham, el de Sarai en Sara, el de Jacob en Israel (Gn 17,5s; 32,29). Y había dado también el nombre a distintas personas ya antes de su nacimiento: Isaac, Sansón, los hijos de Isaías y de Oseas. Hoy día tenemos un nombre muy superior a todos los demás; es el nombre de «cristiano» –el nombre que hace de nosotros hijos de Dios, amigos de Dios, un solo cuerpo con él. ¿Hay algún otro nombre capaz de hacernos ardorosos en la virtud, llenarnos de celo, incentivarnos a hacer el bien? Guardémonos muy mucho de hacer cualquier cosa indigna de este nombre tan grande y tan bello, unido al nombre de el mismo Jesucristo.
