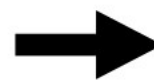

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Vineyards were important to the socio-economic structure and well-being of the ancient near east peoples. It would be disastrous for someone to plant and then cultivate a vineyard only for it to be overrun by wild grapes. It would have to be destroyed in order for it to be replanted and recover, which would be financially impossible for most people of that era. So when Isaiah prophesies about God’s plan for his vineyard – that is, his people, Israel – it is attention-worthy for its radical nature. Isaiah says that even with all of the Lord’s care and cultivation, his people have failed to grow, and they have devolved into idolatry and disobedience. So the Lord will bring his vineyard to ruin. Here’s the good news contained (but unspoken in these verses) in that prophecy, however: The Lord will “start over,” with a new covenant. And the Word which he sends forth in his Son will be the vine from which all other branches will arise and flourish. Though he will be killed for his message as prophets and messengers before him were, the Son in his victory over death will be the one who gives us the inheritance other tenants have sought. As Jesus himself says in today’s Gospel “the stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone.” And on this cornerstone is built our salvation.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

There is much to love here on our earthly home – fragrant flowers, beautiful sunsets, and compassionate people. Still, it can be a place of great pain and sadness at times. It can be easy to feel angry and resentful when we encounter the imperfections of the world – when we experience heartache, loss, disappointment. Although working in the Lord’s vineyard can be both joyful and heartbreaking, it is up to us to do our best to help it produce fruit until it is time to head to our heavenly home. It is our inheritance, as Christ has made us coheirs with him. St. Paul encourages us to “Have no anxiety at all.” Surely, that is easier said than done, but the great Apostle tells us that by our prayers and petitions, “the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.”

PRAY When we pray to God, we should follow the example of the saints who came before us. St. Paul notes: “Keep on doing what you have learned and received and heard and seen in me. Then the God of peace will be with you.” Our prayers are a time to make requests of God but also should be used for thanksgiving. As St. Paul directs, we should make note of all those things that are true, just, lovely, or otherwise worthy of praise.

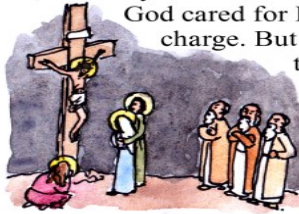

When the owner sent his son, they killed the son because they thought they would be able to take the vineyard if the son was dead.



This story is about God's people. For hundreds of years God cared for His people, leaving leaders in charge. But when He sent His Son Jesus, the leaders did not respect Him. In fact, they killed Him on the cross! God's people were like the vineyard and the leaders were like the tenants who killed the son.



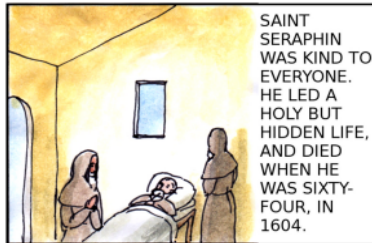
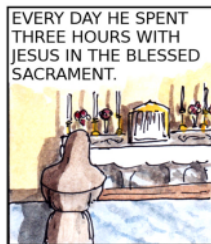
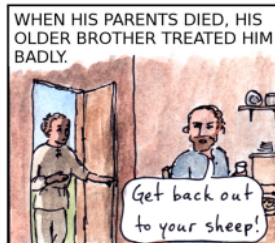

Good News Reflection

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time October 15, 2023

How to handle fakers

In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus addresses the problem of fakers, i.e., people who try to win his friendship by being religious and showing up for the banquet of the Eucharist (Mass) while refusing to enter into a genuine relationship with God.

You know the type: They are friendly as long as it works to their own advantage. They do good deeds but only when it's convenient. They perform Catholic rituals perfectly during Mass but at home they don't even take time to pray. Their faith is so shallow that distractions easily keep them away from Mass. When a priest sins, they leave Catholicism. When their relationship with you requires sacrifice or repentance, they abandon you.

Those who have a genuine relationship with God are identified by the presence of God's love within them radiating outward and blessing others, especially when it's not easy to love.

Jesus shows us in today's parable how to handle the fakers. The invitation to join the party is open to everyone, but when people want only the fun of being a child of God and they ignore the hard work of sharing his love with others, God sets up boundaries against them.

Think of the people you've invited to your banquet table, i.e., into a healthy, Godly relationship, but they've tried to reshape it according to their unhealthiness and immorality. We should love them but not within harmful circumstances. We should do our own part to make the relationship healthy, but when others do not do their part, they've already abandoned the relationship.

God asks us to carry the cross of doing everything possible to invite them to repentance, conversion, and healing. However, healthy boundaries need to remain in place, and when our efforts are fruitless, eventually God says it's time to let go and move on.

And always, we're to go back out into the byroads to find those who genuinely value Godly friendships.

Questions for Personal Reflection:

How many Godly, healthy friendships do you really have? Where can you go to find more people who want to be in a holy, Christ-centered, faith-building relationship with you?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

What makes a friendship truly good? How do you know when the time has come to say no to an unhealthy, unholy relationship? How have you handled it? Where have you gone to find support and healing and growth?



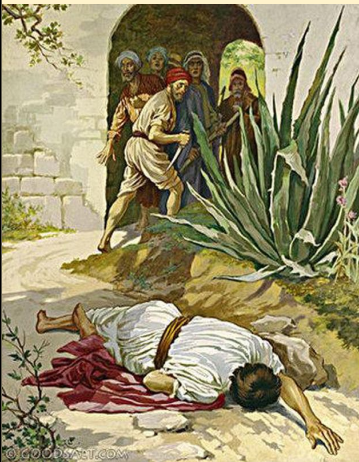

Evangelio según San Mateo (Mt. 21, 33-43)



En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a los sumos sacerdotes y a los ancianos del pueblo esta parábola:

"Había una vez un propietario que plantó un viñedo, lo rodeó con una cerca, cavó un lagar en él, construyó una torre para el vigilante y luego lo alquiló a unos viñadores y se fue de viaje. Llegado el tiempo de la vendimia, envió a sus criados para pedir su parte de los frutos a los viñadores; pero éstos se apoderaron de los criados, golpearon a uno, mataron a otro y a otro más lo apedrearon. Envió de nuevo a otros criados, en mayor

número que los primeros, y los trataron del mismo modo. Por último, les mandó a su propio hijo, pensando: 'A mi hijo lo respetarán'. Pero cuando los viñadores lo vieron, se dijeron unos a otros: 'Éste es el heredero. Vamos a matarlo y nos quedaremos con su herencia'. Le echaron mano, lo sacaron del viñedo y lo mataron. Ahora, díganme: cuando vuelva el dueño del viñedo, ¿qué hará con esos viñadores?" Ellos le respondieron: "Dará muerte terrible a esos desalmados y arrendará el viñedo a otros viñadores, que le entreguen los frutos a su tiempo". Entonces Jesús les dijo: "¿No han leído nunca en la Escritura: *La piedra que desecharon los constructores, es ahora la piedra angular. Esto es obra del Señor y es un prodigio admirable?* Por esta razón les digo que les será quitado a ustedes el Reino de Dios y se le dará a un pueblo que produzca sus frutos". **Palabra del Señor / Gloria a ti Señor Jesús**

Reflexion del Papa Francisco

La imagen de la viña es clara, representa al pueblo que el Señor ha elegido y formado con tanto cuidado; los siervos mandados por el propietario son los profetas, enviados por Dios, mientras que el hijo es una figura de Jesús. Y así como fueron rechazados los profetas, también Cristo fue rechazado y asesinado. Con esta dura parábola, Jesús pone a sus interlocutores frente a su responsabilidad, y lo hace con extrema claridad. Pero no pensemos que esta advertencia valga solamente para los que rechazaron a Jesús en aquella época. Vale para todos los tiempos, incluido el nuestro. También hoy Dios espera los frutos de su viña de aquellos que ha enviado a trabajar en ella. A todos nosotros. En cada época, los que tienen autoridad, cualquier autoridad, incluso en la Iglesia, en el pueblo de Dios pueden sentir la tentación de seguir su propio interés en lugar del de Dios. Y Jesús dice que la verdadera autoridad se cumple cuando se presta servicio, está en servir, no en explotar a los demás. La viña es del Señor, no nuestra. La autoridad es un servicio, y como tal debe ser ejercida, para el bien de todos y para la difusión del Evangelio. (Angelus 4 de octubre de 2020)

San Juan XXIII

Angelo Giuseppe Roncalli nació en una familia humilde de agricultores en Bérghamo, Italia. Con su ordenación al sacerdocio en 1904 comenzó su vida de servicio a la Iglesia como secretario del obispo, capellán militar, cardenal patriarca de Venecia y, finalmente, papa. Visitaba con frecuencia a los pobres, los enfermos y los encarcelados. Dedicó su breve papado a mejorar las relaciones con la Iglesia Ortodoxa. Se le recuerda sobre todo por haber inaugurado el Concilio Vaticano Segundo. Murió en 1963.



Elijan las diversiones con cuidado

Una dieta regular de espectáculos violentos, medios de comunicación deshumanizantes o lecturas explícitas nos vuelve más cómodos con la violencia y el sexo. 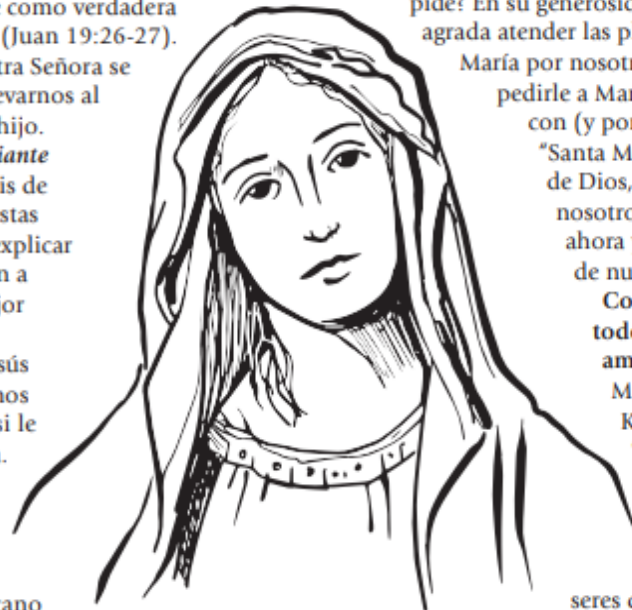


Su Madre para las nuestras

Cuando estaba en la Tierra, Jesús se entregó por completo – hasta su vida – en beneficio nuestro por amor. También nos dio a su madre como verdadera madre nuestra (Juan 19:26-27).

A su vez, Nuestra Señora se esfuerza por llevarnos al corazón de su hijo.

"A Jesús mediante María". San Luis de Montfort usó estas palabras para explicar que la devoción a María es la mejor manera de acercarnos a Jesús porque María nos llevará a Jesús si le pedimos ayuda. Cuando el pecado nos tienta, o sentimos desánimo o secano espiritual, dejemos que María nos lleve de la mano y nos lleve a Jesús.



Nuestro camino a Jesús. Tenemos un mediador en Cristo (1 Timoteo 2:5). ¿Y qué hijo rechaza lo que su madre le pide? En su generosidad, a Dios le agrada atender las plegarias de

María por nosotros. Podemos pedirle a María que rece con (y por) nosotros: "Santa María, Madre de Dios, reza por nosotros, pecadores, ahora y en la hora de nuestra muerte".

Confiémosle todo lo que amamos. San Maximiliano Kolbe escribió:

"Confiemos a Nuestra Señora a todos nuestros seres queridos y

ella, la mejor de las madres, los ayudará del mejor modo posible".

¿Por qué hacen eso los católicos?

¿Por qué tienen dos versiones del credo los católicos?

Ambos credos resumen las creencias de los católicos, pero fueron escritos en épocas distintas con propósitos distintos. El Credo de los Apóstoles es el resumen de las creencias de la Iglesia primitiva. El Credo de Nicea es la forma ampliada del Credo de los



Apóstoles, con origen en dos concilios eclesiásticos (Nicea, 325 d.C.; Constantinopla, 381 d.C.) para combatir el arrianismo que declaraba que Jesús no era Dios, sino una especie de gran santo. El Credo de Nicea hace hincapié en la divinidad de Jesús, su filiación divina y la divinidad del Espíritu Santo.

“Ángel de Dios, mi querido guardián...”

“Junto a cada creyente hay un ángel protector y pastor que lo guía hacia la vida”, dijo san Basilio. La Iglesia nos enseña que cada uno de nosotros tenemos un ángel guardián, encargado de guiarnos y protegernos hasta la muerte (*Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica*, #336). Jesús dijo: “Sus ángeles en el Cielo contemplan sin cesar la cara de mi Padre del Cielo.” (Mateo 18:10). Aproveche la influyente protección de su ángel para crecer en virtud y santidad:

Confíe en su guardián. Los ángeles custodios no nos leen la mente, pero nos observan con atención. Cuanto más les contemos, más nos protegen y mejor



pueden ayudarnos a queelijamos bien y evitemos el pecado.

Pida ayuda. Nuestro ángel custodio puede ayudarnos a tomar decisiones difíciles, a resolver conflictos, y protege especialmente nuestras almas. Intercede por nosotros, y nos ayuda a preparar nuestras almas para el momento en que nos presentemos ante Dios.

Respete el poder del guardián. Los ángeles son criaturas poderosas, creadas por Dios para que nos cuiden. No son responsables ante nosotros pero están listos para ayudarnos a llegar al Cielo.

Mateo 22:34-40, Jesús tiene las respuestas justas

En su primer encuentro con Jesús, los fariseos querían atraparlo intentando que él dijera algo en contradicción a la ley judía. Así podría ser detenido y silenciado.

El abogado que enviaron sabía que muchas generaciones de judíos habían debatido en vano sobre qué era lo más importante. Fingiendo que buscaban la opinión de Jesús, el abogado le pidió que eligiera cuál de los 613 mandamientos de la ley judía era el más importante.

Jesús los silenció a todos diciendo que todo comienza y termina con el amor, el amor a Dios y el amor a los demás. Amar a Dios es amarse los unos a los otros. Estas

leyes están en el centro de todas las otras leyes. Ni siquiera los fariseos podían debatir eso.



A pesar de que es fácil amar a Dios, es más difícil amar a los otros. Esto implica incluir a gente que excluimos o evitamos por inclinación natural.

Jesús amaba a las prostitutas, a los ladrones, a los leprosos, incluso a sus enemigos políticos. El verdadero amor al prójimo se mide por cómo tratamos a los pobres, a los vulnerables y a nuestros enemigos. Así es como Dios nos ama y nos pide que nosotros hagamos lo mismo.

P & R ¿Pueden los católicos celebrar Halloween?

Los católicos pueden celebrar Halloween como una fiesta con raíces cristianas. En el año 835, el papa Gregorio IV trasladó la conmemoración de Todos los Mártires (más tarde Día de Todos los Santos) del 13 de mayo al 1 de noviembre. La noche anterior se conocía como “Noche Santa”



o “All Hallow’s Even” en inglés y finalmente Halloween. Los aldeanos visitaban los hogares del pueblo y recogían aportaciones para la fiesta del día siguiente, el Día de Todos los Santos. A

los que no aportaban nada se les podía gastar una broma.

Los católicos disfrutaban disfrazándose y repartiendo dulces, pero es importante evitar la glorificación del mal, la muerte y el demonio. Aprovechen la fiesta para informarse sobre un santo que no conocen o recoger comida para los pobres.

En resumen, Halloween es una oportunidad para celebrar la generosidad, la amistad y la comunidad. Es el umbral del día en que recordamos a los creyentes que han ido al Cielo antes que nosotros y la esperanza que tenemos de seguirlos. Rezamos también por las almas del Purgatorio para fortalecerlas durante su purificación antes de entrar al Cielo.

7 de octubre – Nuestra Señora del Rosario. El papa Gregorio XIII estableció esta festividad porque se creía que los cristianos consiguieron una victoria crucial en la batalla de Lepanto después de rezar el rosario.

9 de octubre – San Juan Leonardi (1609). Nacido en 1543 en Lucca, Italia, san Juan dedicó su sacerdocio sirviendo en hospitales y prisiones y enseñando la fe. Fundó los Clérigos Regulares de la Madre de Dios y ayudó a establecer la Congregación de la Doctrina Cristiana.

16 de octubre – Santa Eduvigis

(1243). Hija del duque de Croacia, Eduvigis se casó con el duque Enrique de Silesia. Juntos fundaron un convento, hospitales y monasterios. Tras la muerte de su esposo, Eduvigis se hizo monja cisterciense y dedicó su fortuna a las obras de caridad.

28 de octubre – Santos Simón y Judas (siglo I). San Simón era miembro de los zelotes, judíos que creían que el mesías los liberaría de la opresión política. San Judas era pescador. Tras ser llamados por Jesús a ser sus apóstoles, viajaron a Persia donde predicaron el evangelio hasta su martirio.

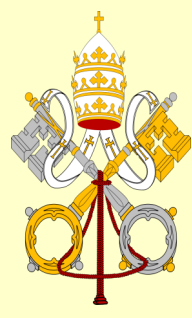
