

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Just two weeks ago, when Christians walked around all day with a cross of ashes on our foreheads, we may have received puzzled looks. Who bothers with fasting and almsgiving for 40 whole days? Many of us live with great abundance in this country; the only time we actually *need* to fast might be for lab work. With this in mind, it's helpful to remember the *why:* because Christ sacrificed himself for us, and he calls his followers to participate in his redemptive mission through our own sacrifices. Without sacrifice, we simply cannot be like Christ, nor will we see our own transfiguration in the resurrection to come. So Lent is a blessed season of reorienting our lives to Christian sacrifice: that of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Perhaps this season can also dispel some of the complacency that has a tendency to creep into our lives. The poor and hungry and disenfranchised still exist, and Christ depends on us to be his hands and feet to serve them. But how can we serve them if we do not embrace Christ's example as a living sacrifice? Ask the Lord for the grace to see and hear what he is asking us to do for him.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Today's readings show an incredible arc from Abraham's willingness to sacrifice his son for God to Christ's Transfiguration after his Passion. Without Abraham's willingness to give up that which he wanted most and finally obtained, he would not have earned his greatest blessing from God in having countless descendants; and without Christ's sacrifice on the cross, all of mankind would not have been saved. Maybe we aren't called to great sacrifices such as these in our own lives, but we as Christians are called to offer our lives as a living sacrifice to our family, our neighbor, those in need, and God himself. Lent is a reminder not only to help us reorient our lives to God and his call for our lives, but to live it, too. By our own witness and prayer we have the ability to help bring others to the Lord and his promise of eternal life.

ACCOMPANY What is something you have always appreciated being done for you? What is a specific sacrifice, large or small, that you know has been made on your behalf? Make an effort this week to identify a specific need you know someone has, pray for that person/need, and offer to God a sacrifice of treasure, time or even your suffering for the fulfillment of that need.

Later on, when Jesus was taken away and killed, the apostles were very sad. But some of them





May our hearts be ablaze with holy zeal for Christ's mercy, love, and truth!

Jesus strongly reacted in Jerusalem when He drove out the money changers in the Temple. Remembering the psalm from Scripture, "Zeal for your house will consume me," imagine the disciples witnessing their beloved leader's assertive rampage of the temple that day. He was chasing away all that wasn't right and holy in the sanctuary of God. Jesus' righteous anger and firm actions were a clear sign from the beginning of His ministry that He would fiercely protect God's house, His truths, and teachings. He was serious about His mission to teach us to know God, to love Him, and to serve Him. Jesus showed us we could trust Him to keep us on the right path to heaven.

Just as Jesus was consumed with zeal for the Father's house in the Jerusalem Temple, He is also serious about His pursuit and protection of our souls, the temple of the Holy Spirit. He wants to keep us on track to our goal of heaven. Jesus suffered and died for our sins and then resurrected from the dead so that we may have the hope of everlasting life in heaven.

If something or someone is blocking our relationship with God, making us less loving and less willing to sacrifice our selfish desires, Jesus will send the Holy Spirit to help us surrender our hearts to His Holy Will. He will pursue us with zealous passion; all we need to do is be open, listen, and follow Him. Jesus' passionate invitation and promise of heaven are there in front of us, but we must decide to answer His call, make our path straight, follow His Way to heaven, and lead others to join us.

A consistent prayer life, studying Sacred Scripture, participation in the Mass, and frequent reception of the Sacraments, along with love and service to others, are sure ways to cooperate with God's grace and strengthen our virtue and sanctity. This will surely lead to a zealous life for God and will likely draw others to Christ, too.

Questions for Personal Reflection:

What do you need to drive out of your life to help you stay on the sure-footed path of God's Holy Will? In what ways are you ready to commit your life and total trust more fully to the Lord?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

How has someone else's zeal for Christ drawn you closer in your own walk with Christ? How are you showing zeal for Christ through the living example of your relationships and life?

Evangelio según San Marcos (Mc. 9, 2-10)



En aquel tiempo, Jesús tomó aparte a Pedro, a Santiago y a Juan, subió con ellos a un monte alto y se transfiguró en su presencia. Sus vestiduras se pusieron esplendorosamente blancas, con una blancura que nadie puede lograr sobre la tierra. Después se les aparecieron Elías y Moisés, conversando con Jesús.

Entonces Pedro le dijo a Jesús: "Maestro, iqué a gusto estamos aquí! Hagamos tres chozas, una para ti, otra para Moisés y otra para Elías". En realidad no sabía lo que decía, porque estaban asustados. Se formó entonces una nube, que los cubrió

con su sombra, y de esta nube salió una voz

que decía: "Éste es mi Hijo amado; escúchenlo". En ese momento miraron alrededor y no vieron a nadie sino a Jesús, que estaba solo con ellos. Cuando bajaban de la montaña, Jesús les mandó que no contaran a nadie lo que habían visto, hasta que el Hijo del hombre resucitara de entre los muertos. Sermón de Francisco de Sales:

Orar es escuchar y obedecer 02/28/1614

Sin duda, la oración es el medio por el que se llega a la perfección y de él dice San Bernardo que los sobrepasa a todos. Nosotros conoceremos que nuestra oración es buena y que avanzamos en ella si, cuando salimos, tenemos a imitación de nuestro Señor, la cara resplandeciente como el sol y los vestidos blancos como la nieve. Quiero decir, si nuestro rostro reluce con la caridad y nuestro cuerpo con la castidad.

La caridad es la pureza del alma y la castidad es la caridad del cuerpo. Si salís de la oración con la cara triste y enfurruñada, se verá enseguida que no habéis hecho la oración como se debe. En la oración aprendemos a hacer bien lo que hacemos. Nuestro Señor se ponía siempre en oración antes de hacer algo grande; se retiraba en soledad a la montaña. Antes de comenzar su predicación y la conversión de las almas, se retiró durante cuarenta días. En el pasaje de hoy, le vemos transfigurarse y dejar ver un reflejo de su gloria a sus tres Apóstoles. Y se oyó la voz del Padre diciendo: «Este es mi Hijo, el Amado, escuchadle.» El supremo grado de la oración y por tanto de la perfección es, pues, obedecer al Padre y escuchar al Hijo. Cuando los Apóstoles se levantaron, porque habían caído al suelo, no vieron más que a Jesús sólo. Este es el grado supremo de la perfección: no ver más que a nuestro Señor en todo lo que hacemos.

No hay que ver más que a Dios, buscarle sólo a Él, no tener más afectos que el suyo y así seremos felices. Las almas que han llegado a este grado de perfección ponen un cuidado muy particular en procurar estar siempre cerca de nuestro Señor crucificado en el Calvario, porque allí le encuentran más solo que en ninguna otra parte.
