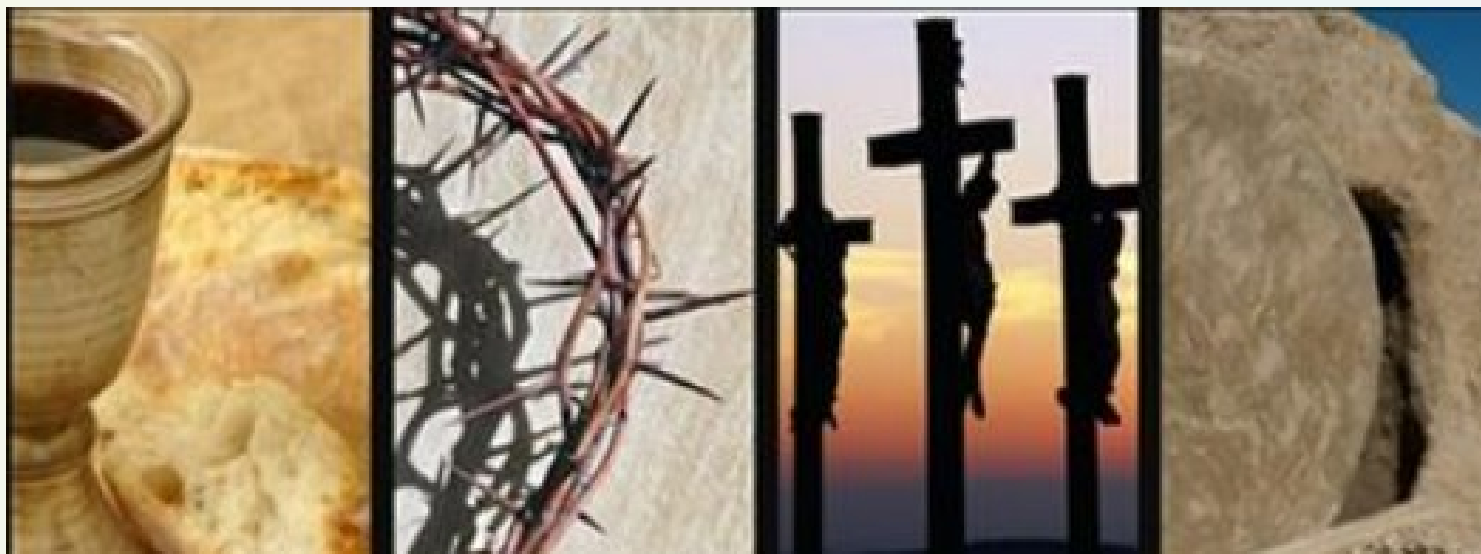

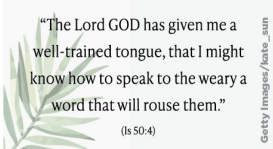

GROW AS A DISCIPLE

PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

“The Lord God has given me a well-trained tongue, that I might know how to speak to the weary a word that will rouse them.” This sentence from our first reading is taken from one of the four “Songs of the Suffering Servant” in Isaiah. The New Testament identifies this Servant as Jesus, and we know that Jesus accepted the suffering that was foretold in the verses that follow this one: “I gave my back to those who beat me ... my face I did not hide from insults and spitting.” As aspiring servants of God on this Palm Sunday, the most holy of days when we hear Mark’s account of Jesus’ passion, how does this sentence speak to us? What does it mean to have a well-trained tongue? To me it is a call to speak to the Lord in prayer as well as to speak the Good News of the Gospel whenever and wherever we can.

PRAY “Abba, Father, all things are possible to you. Take this cup away from me, but not what I will but what you will.” These words from today’s passion narrative demonstrate Jesus’ complete, obedient surrender of his will to his Father’s divine will. As flawed human beings, we will never be able to perfectly emulate our Savior’s actions, but what better way to begin Holy Week than to try? Through prayer, strive to surrender yourself to God this week by trusting him completely, and striving to do his will with humility and Christ-like obedience.

GO EVANGELIZE

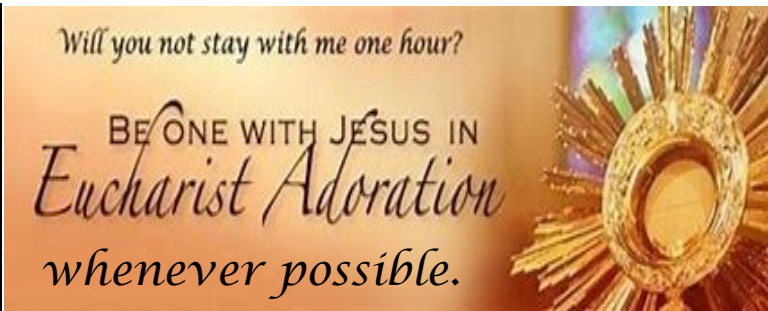
PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

How can we gain the confidence to believe that our tongue is “well-trained”? We know we are all given the gifts of the Holy Spirit, and we must trust in that promise and invoke his presence often. Who knows? A kind word or gesture from us may just “speak” to a weary person who is struggling. Paul writes that in his passion, Jesus “emptied himself” in the hours before his death and “[became] obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.” Paul’s next words give us the answer to our question above: “Because of this, God greatly exalted him and bestowed on him the name which is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend ... and every tongue confess [emphasis added] that Jesus Christ is Lord.” The fullness of the kingdom will be realized only when Jesus comes again. But in the meantime, we have the Eucharist that Jesus instituted at the Last Supper to sustain us and give us strength for our task to confess Jesus Christ as Lord and spread the kingdom of God one day at a time.

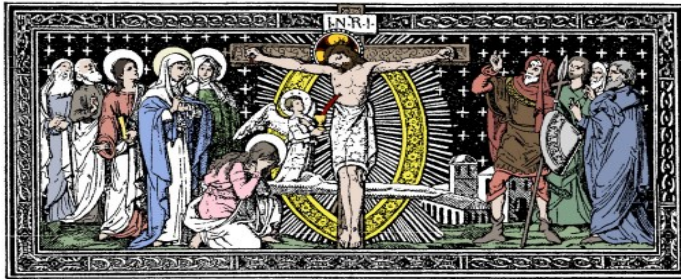


Holy Week

**Prepare for the upcoming Sunday
March 31, 2024, Easter Sunday**



Pray: Almighty Father, thank you for loving us through the gift of your son, Jesus Christ, who rose from the dead to redeem the world. Ignite our hearts and transform us through the Holy Spirit to be sincere, joyous, and faithful witnesses to others of your great love and hope. Amen.

Acts 10:34a,37-43; Ps 118:1-2,16-17,22-23; Col 3:1-4 or 1 Cor 5:6b-8; Jn 20:1-9 or Mk 16:1-7

Christ is Risen! Christ is Truly Risen! Alleluia, Alleluia!

Mary Magdalene, Peter, and John accompanied Jesus on his final mission and were key witnesses to his inspirational teachings, astonishing miracles, traumatic suffering, and excruciating death on the cross. They were three of Jesus' most intimate friends and, besides his mother, they seemed to know him the best. We see in Scripture how Jesus tried to prepare those he loved for what was going to happen. Still, on that Easter morning when first confronted with the empty tomb, their human weakness and broken hearts gave way to sadness, suspicion, and fear. It would take them a little while before they would fully understand that Jesus had to rise from the dead through the saving power of God and then Scripture would be fulfilled.

When we love Jesus with all our hearts and are sincerely trying to follow him, we must trust him and the Holy Spirit to help us be patient and guide our understanding of things we don't quite understand so we can stay in line with God's holy will for our lives. Is life giving you challenges? Are people in your life disappointing you or has grief, pain, illness, or other misfortune come your way somehow? Everyone has crosses we must bear at different seasons of our lives, and we are called to carry them with faith and trust even when we don't understand everything just yet.

We are also called to love others and share our faith with them as well. Sometimes it is our very crosses that connect us to the people to whom we are being led to share the Gospel of Christ! By holding intimately close to Jesus and trusting him, just as his closest disciples did in today's Gospel, we show what it means to be "Easter people." We know that God will turn our hurts and sacrifices into something beautiful in time and we, too, will rise.

Questions for Personal Reflection:

How can you share the love of Christ by helping someone you know carry their cross? What can you do to allow Christ to carry more of the load of your cross? Can you recognize when Christ is working through others to help carry your cross?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

When something bad in your life turned out good, how did this affect your faith in God? How have you experienced a time when you saw and believed as the disciple John did? Think about a time when you prayed, and things did not go as you wanted. As God always brings something good out of bad for those who believe and have faith, what good things did you discover?

DECREE

DESIGNATING A SOLEMN FEAST FOR THE IMPARTING OF THE PONTIFICAL BLESSING WITH A PLENARY INDULGENCE

Whereas the diocesan bishop possesses the right to bestow the papal blessing with a plenary indulgence, using the prescribed formulary, three times a year on solemn feasts that he will designate (cf. Decree *Diversis ex locis* of the S. Apostolic Penitentiary, 12-14-1985, *AAS* 78 [1986] 293-294);


In accordance with canons 992-997 of the Code of Canon Law, I hereby decree that the pontifical blessing with a plenary indulgence attached will be imparted at the celebration of the Chrism Mass at Saint Agnes Cathedral on March 26, 2024.

The following conditions must be fulfilled in order to obtain the plenary indulgence:

- 1) Detachment from all sin, even venial.
- 2) Confession of sins in the Sacrament of Penance.
- 3) Reception of Holy Communion.
- 4) Prayer for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff.

Having fulfilled these conditions, the faithful who attend this Mass and receive this blessing will benefit from the indulgence along with those who participate through radio, television, or livestreaming.

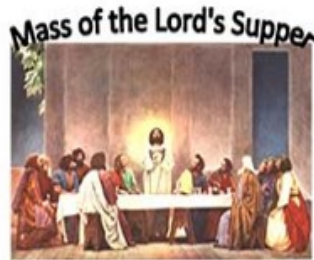

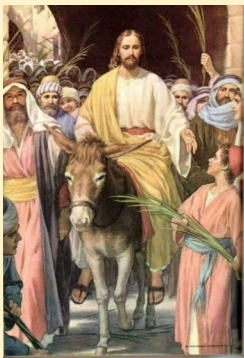

COMUNIDAD HISPANA

Evangelio según San Marcos (Jn 12, 20-33)



Durante la próxima semana, la liturgia quiere ser estrictamente obediente a la sucesión de los acontecimientos. Precisamente los acontecimientos, que se desarrollaron en Jerusalén hace poco menos de dos mil años, deciden que ésta sea la Semana Santa, la Semana de la Pasión del Señor.

El domingo de hoy permanece estrechamente unido con el acontecimiento que tuvo lugar cuando Jesús se acercó a Jerusalén para cumplir allí todo lo que había sido anunciado por los Profetas. Precisamente en este día los discípulos, por orden del Maestro, le llevaron un borriquillo, después de haber solicitado poderlo tomar prestado por cierto tiempo. Y Jesús se sentó sobre él para que se cumpliera también aquel detalle de los escritos proféticos. En efecto, así dice el

Profeta Zacarías: «Alégrate sobremanera, hija de Sión, grita exultante, hija de Jerusalén. He aquí que viene a ti tu Rey, justo y victorioso, humilde, montado en un asno, en un pollino de asna» (9, 9). Entonces, también la gente que se trasladaba a Jerusalén con motivo de las fiestas — la gente que veía los hechos que Jesús realizaba y escuchaba sus palabras — manifestando la fe mesiánica que El había despertado, gritaba: «¡Hosanna! ¡Bendito el que viene en el nombre del Señor! ¡Bendito el reino que viene de David, nuestro Padre! ¡Hosanna en las alturas!» (Mc 11, 9-10). Nosotros repetimos estas palabras en cada Misa cuando se acerca el momento de la transustanciación.

Así, pues, en el camino hacia la Ciudad Santa, cerca de la entrada de Jerusalén, surge ante nosotros la escena del triunfo entusiasmante: «Muchos extendían sus mantos sobre el camino, otros cortaban follaje de los campos» (Mc 11, 8) ... Los gritos: «¡Hosanna!» «¡Bendito el que viene en el nombre del Señor!», parecían ser expresión del encuentro ahora ya cercano de los corazones humanos con la eterna Elección. En medio de esta alegría que precede a las solemnidades pascuales, Jesús está recogido y silencioso. Es plenamente consciente de que el encuentro de los corazones humanos con la eterna Elección no sucederá mediante los «hosannas», sino mediante la cruz... Hoy leemos la narración de la Pasión del Señor, según Marcos. En ella está la descripción completa de los acontecimientos que se irán sucediendo en el curso de esta semana. Y en cierto sentido, constituyen su programa. Nos detenemos con recogimiento ante esta narración. Es difícil conocer estos sucesos de otro modo. Aunque los sepamos de memoria, siempre volvemos a escucharlos con el mismo recogimiento. Recuerdo con qué atención escuchaban los niños cuando siendo yo todavía joven sacerdote les contaba la Pasión del Señor. Era siempre una catequesis completamente distinta de las otras. La Iglesia, pues, no cesa de leer nuevamente la narración de la Pasión de Cristo, y desea que esta descripción permanezca en nuestra conciencia y en nuestro corazón. En esta semana estamos llamados a una solidaridad particular con Jesucristo: «Varón de dolores» (Is 53, 3).

Así, pues, junto a la figura de este Mesías, que el Israel de la Antigua Alianza esperaba y, más aún, que parecía haber alcanzado ya con la propia fe en el momento de la entrada en Jerusalén, la liturgia de hoy nos presenta al mismo tiempo otra figura. La descrita por los Profetas, de modo particular por Isaías:

«He dado mis espaldas a los que me herían... sabiendo que no sería confundido» (Is 50, 6-7). Cristo viene a Jerusalén para que se cumplan en El estas palabras, para realizar la figura del «Siervo de Yavé», mediante la cual el Profeta, ocho siglos antes, había revelado la intención de Dios. El «Siervo de Yavé»: el Mesías, el descendiente de David, pero en quien se cumple el «hosanna» del pueblo, pero el que es sometido a la más terrible prueba: «Búrlanse de mí cuantos me ven..., libréle, sálvele, pues dice que le es grato» (Sal 21, 8-9).

En cambio, no mediante la «liberación» del oprobio, sino precisamente mediante la obediencia hasta la muerte, mediante la cruz, debía realizarse el designio eterno del amor.

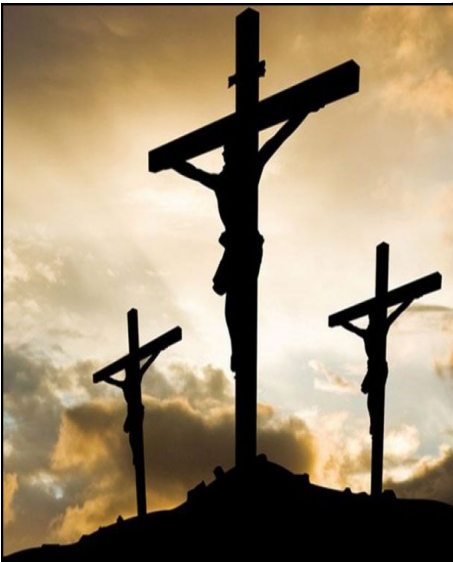

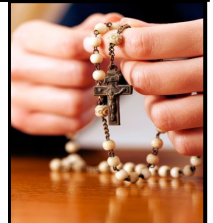
