GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

When I was a kid, my older siblings used to tell me what to do (no surprise there!) and often backed up their, ahem, "commands," by saying, "Mom and Dad said so." Interestingly, sometimes that statement was not true (!), and I would get the right information - what to do and the correct way to do it - directly from my parents. My experience is not unlike that of the Israelites in today's first reading. As they escaped from bondage in Egypt and followed the Lord through the guidance of Moses, they developed their own ways of doing things, listened to the wrong people and acted as if they were indeed conveying truth. But the Lord steps in to correct them, and in "a direct, unmediated communication" of truth to them, gives them commandments to follow. (USCCB commentary) These instructions for how to live a moral life in relationship with God and with one another are the basis of the covenant they made there with the Lord. They are the foundation of the new history as the perfect, unmediated communication of God.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

How do you envision Jesus? It's easy to think of him as kind and easy-going - the type of person who never lets his feathers get ruffled, no matter how many times the Pharisees question and challenge him. However, we see a different side of Jesus today - one in which he is flipping over tables and brandishing a whip. He is driving out those who are using his Father's house as a place to make money rather than as a place to worship. In the drama of that scene, let's not overlook what comes next in the reading. The people there at the temple, obviously taken aback by what they have seen, ask for a sign to justify what authority Jesus has to drive people out of the temple. Jesus says, "Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." That confused people then, but we know today that the true temple is Jesus and that his rising from the dead would be the sign they sought. Just as the commandcovenant in which we partake through Jesus Christ, who came into our ments of God have authority, so does Jesus who came as perfect obedience to those commandments to help us follow them ourselves.

PRAY It's easy for us to think we're doing a good job keeping the Lord's commandments, but at the same time the line between right and wrong can seem blurred at times and we may relax a bit on some of their finer points. Try this week to dig deep within ourselves and turn to prayer for the strength to do what is right, seeking the wisdom of God rather than relying on human wisdom.

We should always behave respectfully in church, and remember that Jesus is really there in the tabernacle. We can show our respect by walking quietly, not talking inside the Church unless it is



necessary, and by paying attention when Mass is going on. Maybe you can be a good example to your friends of how to act in church!

Follow the Light of the World into Eternal Life

God's love is more than we can ever imagine. Through God's infinite and merciful love, He sent his only beloved Son, Jesus, to Earth to teach us how to love. He sacrificed his Son to suffer and die a cruel death on the cross to save us from eternal death and damnation for our sins and the sins of Adam and Eve. He sent the Holy Spirit to guide us out of darkness and promised that if we believed, we would be rewarded with true happiness in heaven.

What an amazing gift this is! Through our faith and commitment to Jesus, we can be assured that God, who knows everything about us, including our faults and imperfections, loves us and promises us salvation rather than judgment for our failings!

But what is meant by the words "everyone who believes in Him?" The action word "believes" is much more than merely saying, "I accept Jesus as my Lord and Savior." Real belief in Jesus involves turning one's life over to Jesus and His teachings. It means making Jesus the center of our lives. It's a commitment to surrender one's selfish ways and to love others the way Christ loves.

It is still true today that many people continue to stay in the darkness rather than have their sins exposed in the light. Sometimes it is self-denial, and they are afraid to confront their own sins. Other times, they don't want to admit to others that they are struggling. They fear that changing will be too hard. If only they would trust our most gracious and merciful God, who forgives and restores our souls when we offer our lives to Him.

We show belief when we come into the light and see, accept, and live in the truth of Jesus and His teachings. When we are true believers, our works of love will be Christ-like. Those who believe in Christ love Him and *want* to be like Him. Our good works will be done out of pure love and gratefulness for our God. Our belief – our faith in Christ – will go hand in hand with our actions – our works – to save us, and we will reach out to bring the Good News to others, too.

Questions for Personal Reflection:

How do you live your life in a way that others can see that you believe God loves you and He loves them, too? In what areas of your life must you continue trusting in the love and light of Christ to transform you out of darkness?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

How can you clearly and simply communicate the Gospel message of God's saving grace through Jesus to others? How can you sincerely share your testimony to show your personal need for a Savior?



COMUNIDAD HISPANA

Evangelio según San Juan (Jn. 2, 13-25)



Cuando se acercaba la Pascua de los judíos, Jesús llegó a Jerusalén y encontró en el templo a los vendedores de bueyes, ovejas y palomas, y a los cambistas con sus mesas. Entonces hizo un látigo de cordeles y los echó del templo, con todo

y sus ovejas y bueyes; a los cambistas les volcó las mesas y les tiró al suelo las monedas; y a los que vendían palomas les dijo: "Quiten todo de aquí y no conviertan en un mercado la casa de mi Padre". En ese momento, sus discípulos se acordaron de lo que estaba escrito: El celo de tu casa me devora. Después intervinieron los judíos para preguntarle: "¿Qué señal nos das de que tienes autoridad para actuar así?" Jesús les respondió: "Destruyan este templo y en tres días lo reconstruiré". Replicaron los judíos: "Cuarenta y seis años se ha llevado la construcción del templo, ¿y tú lo vas a levantar en tres días?" Pero él hablaba del templo de su cuerpo. Por eso, cuando resucitó Jesús de entre los muertos, se acordaron sus discípulos de que había dicho aquello y creyeron en la Escritura y en las palabras que Jesús había dicho. Mientras estuvo en Jerusalén para las fiestas de Pascua, muchos creyeron en él, al ver los prodigios que hacía. Pero Jesús no se fiaba de ellos, porque los conocía a todos y no necesitaba que nadie le descubriera lo que es el hombre, porque él sabía lo que hay en el hombre.

Para qué se va al templo (Reflexión Papa Francisco)

El templo es un lugar donde la comunidad va a rezar, a alabar al Señor, a darle gracias, pero sobre todo a adorar: en el templo se adora al Señor. Y este es el punto importante. También, esto es válido para las ceremonias litúrgicas, ¿qué es más importante? Lo más importante es la adoración: toda la comunidad reunida mira al altar donde se celebra el sacrificio y adora. Pero, yo creo - humildemente lo digo - que nosotros cristianos quizá hemos perdido un poco el sentido de la adoración y pensamos: vamos al templo, nos reunimos como hermanos - jes bueno, es bonito! - pero el centro está donde está Dios. Y nosotros adoramos a Dios. ... Jesús purifica el templo reprendiendo: «Está escrito: mi casa será casa de oración» y «no de otra cosa. El templo es un lugar sagrado. Y nosotros debemos entrar allí, en la sacralidad que nos lleva a la adoración. No hay otra cosa»... También nosotros —afirmó— debemos purificarnos continuamente porque somos pecadores: purificarnos con la oración, con la penitencia, con el sacramento de la reconciliación, con la Eucaristía».
