GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Several years ago I went to a shopping mall with my six-year-old son, and I could tell he was overwhelmed by the fast-moving crowds; he stuck close to my side. Not long into our trip, he turned a corner and, suddenly, his face lit up. He pointed at a young boy ahead. "That's James! I know him! He's in my class!" he exclaimed, and ran up to talk to him. Out of the sea of strangers was someone he *knew*, and who knew him. That changed the whole experience for him. Today's readings are all about that kind of knowing. In the Gospel Jesus tells us that, like a good shepherd, he knows his flock and they know him. How comforting it is to know that Jesus not only knows each one of us, but he willingly chose to lay down his life for each one of us as the ultimate sacrifice of love. But how do we get to know our Good Shepherd better? By immersing ourselves in Scripture and prayer and seeking a personal relationship with him. If we stay close to the Lord, we'll know his voice when we hear it - in the quiet of our prayer, in the everyday promptings of the Spirit in our decision-making, and even, in the midst of all the noise, as the calming and guiding voice leading us along the right path.

PRAY Spending time in prayer and reading the Scriptures are essential in order to get to know the voice of Jesus. Read the Gospels this week, even a chapter a day, and contemplate what passages stand out for you. Pray about it at Mass. The Scriptures and the sacraments are how Jesus speaks to us, like a good shepherd speaks to his flock so the sheep will know his voice and follow it.

GO EVANGELIZE

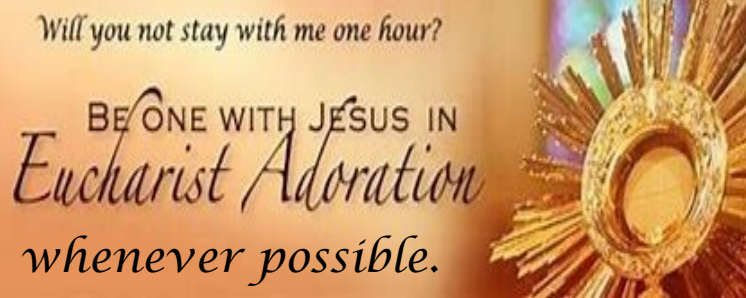
PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Being known is one of the most fundamental human and spiritual needs. When my son recognized his friend, he also instinctively recognized - without being able to articulate it - this need, in the midst of the anonymity of the mall. And his reaction was so pure: "I know him, and he knows me!" But he didn't leave it at that; he went to engage with his friend. He *encountered* his friend. This is what Christ desires for, and with us - not just to know us, to simply recognize us from afar, but for us to want to encounter him! We are meant to be in community; Jesus is always here for us: in the Church, in the sacraments, in Scriptures and in our hearts.

This Sunday is called Good Shepherd Sunday because in the Gospel reading Jesus tells His friends that He is the Good Shepherd who loves His sheep.

When sheep are out grazing in open fields, the shepherd watches them and protects them from hurting themselves, getting lost, or being killed by wild animals. Jesus looks after us like a shepherd looks after his sheep. He gave us the Church so we could know what is good for us, and He protects us from being ruined by the devil by giving us grace in the sacraments.



Now, Jesus did something that an ordinary shepherd would not do. Besides guiding and protecting us, He died to save us! Because He died for our sins, all of His sheep can now go to Heaven where they will be happy forever! How blessed we are to have such a loving Shepherd!

All Branches Must Cling to the Vine to Blossom and Bear Fruit

What a beautiful metaphor Christ shared in the Upper Room! Jesus was trying to help His disciples understand the gift of Divine Grace and how the lives of Christians must stay joined to the glorified life of Jesus to be nourished, sustained, and grow to fruitfulness.

Like any master gardener of a vineyard, God our Father delights in each of us whom He plants in His garden. He is passionate about our growth, and He wants us to reach the fruitful potential of our souls in this life so that we may fulfill our purpose in His vineyard here on earth.

He fertilizes the soil to help us grow. He waters, weeds, and prunes our vines to help us become all we were meant to be. God knows the beautiful fruitfulness and growth that we can experience in His perfect plan. He watches over each of His vines with loving care.

Our souls are made to be the perfect reflection of Christ. God the Father, with the help of the Holy Spirit, watches over us with loving guidance and protection and wants our souls to grow in love and holiness. There are times in the garden of our lives when enemies slip in and threaten the beauty and very existence of our spiritual lives. If one isn't careful, bad soil, pests, predators, parasites, dryness, and weeds can be very destructive. We will only bear fruit if we are pruned of everything unhealthy to our souls, and we must be sure to cling fast to the vine of Christ who strengthens us.

Our spiritual lives are dependent on the gift of Divine Grace and our souls are nourished and sustained by the love of Christ. It is vital that we trust Him with our whole hearts to do whatever is needed in our lives for our best growth. We must trust Christ and always stick close to Him.

As much as plants need air, sunshine, and water, a branch is just as reliant upon the vine. Without the vine – Jesus – our souls will shrivel and die. Letting go of our own selfish wills – by fully surrendering to God's Holy Will and trusting His pruning and weeding in our lives – will surely help our souls blossom, bear fruit, and become all we were made to be by our Father.

Questions for Personal Reflection:

How can you welcome and accept God's pruning when it feels so unpleasant? In what ways is God pruning and shaping you into His Image? Do you see the difference this pruning is making in your walk with Christ?

Questions for Community Faith Sharing:

How can we ensure that God gets the glory for our fruit?

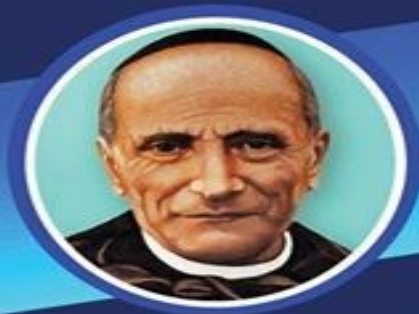
World Day of Prayer for Vocations

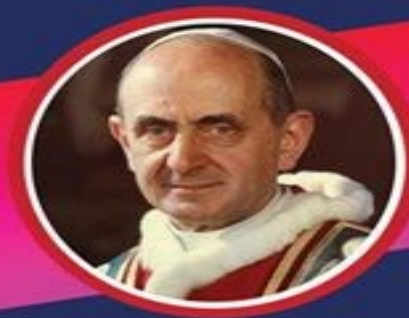
The World Day of Prayer for Vocations is celebrated every year to pray for more priestly and consecrated vocations.

Evangelio según San Juan (Jn 10, 11-18)



En aquel tiempo, Jesús dijo a los fariseos: “Yo soy el buen pastor. El buen pastor da la vida por sus ovejas. En cambio, el asalariado, el que no es el pastor ni el dueño de las ovejas, cuando ve venir al lobo, abandona las ovejas y huye; el lobo se arroja sobre ellas y las dispersa, porque a un asalariado no le importan las ovejas. Yo soy el buen pastor, porque conozco a mis ovejas y ellas me conocen a mí, así como el Padre me conoce a mí y yo conozco al Padre. Yo doy la vida por mis ovejas. Tengo además otras

ovejas que no son de este redil y es necesario que las traiga también a ellas; escucharán mi voz y habrá un solo rebaño y un solo pastor. El Padre me ama porque doy mi vida para volverla a tomar. Nadie me la quita; yo la doy porque quiero. Tengo poder para darla y lo tengo también para volverla a tomar. Éste es el mandato que he recibido de mi Padre”.

Palabra del Señor, Gloria a ti Señor Jesús.

Reflexión de Papa Francisco —Plaza de San Pedro Regina Coeli Domingo, 8 de mayo de 2022

En primer lugar las ovejas escuchan la voz del pastor. La iniciativa viene siempre del Señor; todo parte de su gracia: es Él que nos llama a la comunión con Él. Pero esta comunión nace si nosotros nos abrimos a la escucha; si permanecemos sordos no nos puede dar esta comunión. Abrirse a la escucha porque escuchar significa disponibilidad, significa docilidad, significa tiempo dedicado al diálogo. Hoy estamos abrumados por las palabras y por la prisa de tener que decir o hacer algo siempre; es más, cuántas veces dos personas están hablando y una no espera que la otra termine el pensamiento, la corta a mitad de camino, responde... Pero si no la deja hablar, no hay escucha. Este es un mal de nuestro tiempo. Hoy estamos abrumados por las palabras, por la prisa de tener que decir siempre algo, tenemos miedo del silencio. ¡Cuánto cuesta escucharse! ¡Escucharse hasta el final, dejar que el otro se exprese, escucharse en familia, escucharse en la escuela, escucharse en el trabajo, e incluso en la Iglesia! Pero para el Señor sobre todo es necesario escuchar. Él es la Palabra del Padre y el cristiano es hijo de la escucha, llamado a vivir con la Palabra de Dios al alcance de la mano... Escuchar a Jesús se convierte así en el camino para descubrir que Él nos conoce. Este es el segundo verbo, que se refiere al buen pastor: Él conoce a sus ovejas. Pero esto no significa solo que sabe muchas cosas sobre nosotros: conocer en sentido bíblico quiere decir también amar. Quiere decir que el Señor, mientras “nos lee dentro”, nos quiere, no nos condena. Si le escuchamos, descubrimos esto, que el Señor nos ama. El camino para descubrir el amor del Señor es escucharlo. Entonces la relación con Él ya no será impersonal, fría o de fachada. Jesús busca una cálida amistad, una confianza, una intimidad. Quiere donarnos un conocimiento nuevo y maravilloso: el de sabernos siempre amados por Él y por tanto nunca dejados solos a nosotros mismos. Estando con el buen pastor se vive la experiencia de la que habla el Salmo: «Aunque pase por valle tenebroso, ningún mal temeré, porque tú vas conmigo» (Sal 23,4).

FIESTA DEL EVANGELISTA SAN MARCOS (25 DE ABRIL)

San Marcos es considerado como "el taquígrafo" de san Pedro. Su Evangelio fue escrito entre los años 50 y 60. Según la tradición, transcribió la predicación de Pedro, dirigida principalmente a los primeros cristianos de Roma, sin elaborarla o adaptarla a un esquema personal. Por eso, su Evangelio posee gran vivacidad y claridad. Escribió en griego, la lengua más hablada en aquellos tiempos, con el objetivo de demostrar el poder de Jesucristo, Hijo de Dios, que se manifestó en numerosos milagros. El evangelista Marcos murió probablemente entre los años 68 y 72, en Alejandría de Egipto. En los Actos de Marco (del siglo IV) está escrito que un 24 de abril los paganos lo arrastraron por las calles de Alejandría, atado con cuerdas por el cuello, y luego lo arrojaron a la cárcel. Allí fue confortado por un ángel. Al día siguiente sufrió el mismo tormento, y murió. La Basílica romana de San Marcos, en el centro histórico, testimonia su presencia: se dice que fue erigida en el lugar en el que estaba la casa en la que vivió el evangelista.
