

# Belong More Deeply

# **Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time** Sunday, February 19, 2017

**Theme:** God's love invites us to wholeness. Breaking Open the Word Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel Reading Mt 5:38-48

Jesus said to his disciples: You have heard that it was said, An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth. But I say to you, offer no resistance to one who is evil. When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one as well. If anyone wants to go to law with you over your tunic, hand over your cloak as well. Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go for two miles. Give to the one who asks of you, and do not turn your back on one who wants to borrow. You have heard that it was said, You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy. But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what recompense will you have? Do not the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet your brothers only, what is unusual about that? Do not the pagans do the same? So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect."

Step One: Listen to the Word: When you hear the word enemy, what or who do you think fits that definition? How do you turn the other cheek? What does that mean to you? How complete is your love for that enemy?

## Step Two: Look into your Life

Question for Children: What can you do at home or school to show that you follow Jesus' Commandments? Question for Youth: Do you think Jesus was serious when he said to love your enemies? Why or why not? Question for Adults: Have you ever told someone to do something for his/her own well being? Do you accept God's laws in the same spirit of love and concern?

#### SIX MORE YEARS

I want to thank Bishop Murphy for allowing me to serve you as your Shepherd in Hicksville. I also want to welcome Bishop John O. Barres as our 5<sup>th</sup> Diocesan Bishop of Rockville Centre. I look forward to working with him in whatever capacity possible in helping to spread God's Kingdom here on Long Island. Our prayers and blessings go to Bishop Barres who has a fondness for our youth and evangelization of the Gospel.

Finally, we will build on our outreach to the poor, seniors, the sick and the homebound. We also need to help grow some of our other ministries or see if they need to change like the Rosary Society, Nocturnal Adoration, St. Anne's Prayer Group, Men's Prayer Group and the Charismatic Prayer Ministry. My hope is that you will help me in these tasks. They cannot be done by one pastor or person alone.

May God bless you and Mary keep you and your families always. May we remember to always do things for the greater glory of God. *St. Ignatius Loyola, pray for us!*

# Weekly Church Envelopes






# Don't Forget Your Baby Bottle!

Pensamos que nuestra libertad está por encima de todo, y ciertamente es sagrada, pero tristemente olvidamos que esa libertad es un don de Dios mismo, que es Él quien nos la ha regalado para que haciendo un responsable y recto uso de la misma podamos realizarnos verdaderamente y alcanzar el fin último para el cual Él nos ha creado: la dicha, la felicidad.

Lamentablemente no llegamos a comprender que su Ley, sus Mandamientos, no buscan limitarnos, sino todo lo contrario, buscan señalarnos el camino para llegar finalmente al destino que todos anhelamos: la plenitud humana, la felicidad, la dicha que no acabe nunca. Es como cuando emprendemos viaje en automóvil por una carretera riesgosa: los carteles nos van indicando, señalando cuándo hay una curva peligrosa, cuándo hay que disminuir la velocidad, cuándo hay que parar, cuándo hay que tomar precauciones porque pasamos por una zona de derrumbes, cuándo la pista se torna resbalosa, cuándo debemos estar atentos para no desbarrancarnos por un precipicio. Todas esas señales restrictivas están puestas allí como advertencia, buscan cuidar nuestra vida para que lleguemos felizmente a nuestro destino. Necio será aquel que en vez de seguir la indicación de doblar a la derecha se le antoje doblar a la izquierda, por pura rebeldía, por pensar que él tiene un camino mejor. Lo único que hace es dirigirse al abismo. Él mismo se destruye, destruye su vida y la de aquellos que lo acompañan.

Así es la Ley de Dios: contiene restricciones, ciertamente, pero son advertencias para el ser humano, para que no se destruya a sí mismo y no haga daño a otros haciendo un uso caprichoso de su libertad. Son señales para que puedas llegar a tu feliz destino, mereciendo finalmente «lo que ni el ojo vio, ni el oído oyó, ni al corazón del hombre llegó, lo que Dios preparó para los que le aman».
