#### CHURCH ETIQUETE DURING LENT

#### **FAST AND ABSTINENCE**

All Catholics who have reached their fourteenth year are bound to abstain entirely from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. All Catholics between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine inclusive are also bound to observe the law of fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This means limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Two other light meals, which together do not equal a full meal, may be taken during the day.

#### SAINT PATRICK'S DAY FRIDAY, MARCH 17, 2017

Bishop Barres has given a dispensation, from the obligation of abstaining from meat, to all Catholics in the Diocese of Rockville Centre on the feast of Saint Patrick (Friday, March 17, 2017). The obligation to abstain from meat can be fulfilled on another date or Catholics can adopt another form of penance of the individual's choosing.

#### FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT MATTHEW 4:1-11

#### LENT- A TIME FOR THE DESERT

If you ever been to a desert you know that it is barren, dry, dusty, hot in the day and cold at night. However, you also notice some plants and flowers that somehow survive the desert's extreme elements. This is because their roots are found to be deep in the ground, reaching out for the springs of water which lie underneath.

Brothers and sisters we have begun our journey into the desert with Jesus as we have begun our liturgical season of Lent. The word **Lent** means **spring** meaning to spring forth toward something new. Lent reminds us that we have this special retreat time to spring forth toward a new birth and new life given to us by Jesus Christ.

But, like those plants and flowers that survive in the desert, we need to make sure our roots look for and are planted in Jesus Christ, who is the source of our life from which the living waters flow and in whom alone we will find our way.

The Church gives us the tools of prayer, fasting and almsgiving (charity) to help us look for the living water in Christ.

Prayer is the time where we can talk to and listen to Jesus. Maybe instead of watching the television or going on social media, we can spend the time to look at the daily scriptures or a passage from the bible, read it and think about it for 10 minutes or so. We can go to daily Mass and Sunday Mass. We can pray the rosary or the stations of the cross, which we offer here on Fridays at 7:30pm. We can also go to special events like the Mission beginning March 13<sup>th.</sup> and celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation.

With Fasting, the church asks us to eat one main meal and two smaller ones on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. However, we can also take other times not to eat as much as we normally do or to give up a favorite food or drink. This is not just to go on a diet, but to clear the deck help simplify our lives, making it easier for Jesus to enter into our hearts.

Also to identify with those who are physically and spiritually hungry.

It is difficult to figure out what we hunger in our society today. Our main hunger is for God whether we know it or not. However, as a society, if we don't know what to fill our lives with, we often satisfy that hunger with other things that pull us down. May we go hungry this Lent so that we might find out what we truly need and show others what a just world would look like.

Finally, almsgiving helps us focus on establishing a right relationship with God and one another. One way to give is through our collection. Due to the weather, the collections have been down. Please try to give just a little bit more. If you are giving to our campaign, please don't forget the regular parish collection. May prayer, fasting and charity be done out of love and not just out of habit. That makes the difference in helping us overcome the temptations of life.

These past two weeks have been a sad time for my mom, family and me with the passing our dad (Stan, Stacky or Doc). He lived his life to the fullest till almost 90. While being an Optometrist, he helped people to see in more ways than one. The 4 ½ hour lines of people at his wake spoke volumes of his life that I never knew or took for granted.





# COMUNIDAD HISPANA

MISERICORDIA, SEÑOR: HEMOS PECADO

I DE CUARESMA

La primera gran lección del pasaje evangélico del Domingo es ésta: no podemos olvidar que tenemos un adversario invisible, el Diablo, que «ronda como león rugiente, buscando a quién devorar». De él enseñaba el Papa Pablo VI: «el mal que existe en el mundo es el resultado de la intervención en nosotros y en nuestra sociedad de un agente oscuro y enemigo, el Demonio. El mal no es ya sólo una deficiencia, sino un ser vivo, espiritual, pervertido y pervertidor. Terrible realidad, misteriosa y que causa miedo». Él busca tu ruina, y no descansa en su intento.

La segunda gran lección es ésta: es por medio de la tentación como el Demonio busca apartarnos de Dios, fuente de nuestra vida y felicidad. La tentación es una sugerencia a obrar en contra de lo que Dios enseña. Por la tentación el Diablo introduce en el corazón del hombre el veneno de la desconfianza en Dios, haciéndolo

aparecer como enemigo de su felicidad y realización: "¿Cómo es posible que Dios te haya prohibido...?". Al mismo tiempo la tentación aparece como confiable, y se hace tremendamente atractiva porque promete a la criatura humana "ser como dios", es decir, alcanzar el poder, la gloria y la felicidad si en vez de Dios adora a otros "dioses", a los ídolos del poseer-placer, del tener o del poder, o adorando incluso al mismo Satanás. Cristo al ser tentado en el desierto nos enseña cómo podemos también nosotros desbaratar la fuerza seductora de las tentaciones: oponer a la sugestión del Maligno la enseñanza divina. A diferencia de Eva el Señor Jesús no entra en diálogo con el tentador buscando "aclararle" el malentendido. En vez de presentarle sus propios razonamientos, el Señor responde a cada una de las sugestiones del Diablo oponiendo la Palabra divina que Él ha acogido en su mente y corazón. Su método es contundente. No da pie a que la tentación siga avanzando. La enseñanza divina, la Palabra de Dios, se convierte ante la tentación en un escudo que permite detener y apagar los dardos encendidos del Maligno.
