

CHRIST RAISING US TO NEW LIFE TODAY

Most of us have experienced the death of a loved one. My family and I had the death of our dad and now our Uncle Al. It is not easy to cope with death, especially when it is your own loved one.

Sr. Joan Mitchell writes "We have only our experience with God in our world and in our holy history". The spiritual writer, Henry Nowen compares dying to the trust between trapeze artists. One lets go, trusting the other will catch him or her.

While we don't know what lies beyond death, we are given a hope that the God of both the living and the dead will bring us into new life through Jesus Christ. Our hope as Christians is that we have a God who will raise us up. We are companions in hope that the new life Jesus promises will be our own.

We see the power of this new life in Jesus in today's Gospel story on the raising of Lazarus. What strikes me, is that when Jesus first comes to the tomb, he does not say anything. He does not ask why or say this is God's will. He just weeps. He weeps because he knows the family's pain. He also has a sense of his own to come. This same Jesus weeps with us too, when we lose someone we love so much. But, we don't end at the weeping. Jesus raises Lazarus from the tomb and says "untie him and let him go." As we enter into the 5th Week of Lent, may we allow Jesus to untie us of our grief over all the deaths in our lives. May we also help untie others of their grief too by visiting them, making a phone call, a note and praying for them.

One thing that Martha did not understand yet, was that the resurrection happens now through our baptism. We don't have to wait until after death. Each of us begins that new life now if we fully believe in Jesus, ask for his help and allowing him to work through us today and the days to come.

REMOVING THE PARISH WHITE HOUSE





The Ecumenical counseling service and the Hope For Stroke organizations. Since then, the house has deteriorated. After much analysis and reflection with the Finance Committee and Pastoral Council, we have decided to take the house down. It will be less expensive to take it down than to do a renovation. The place is not conducive to a regular house or to offices in the way it is laid out today.


