Holy Communion Bread Cannot be Gluten-Free, Vatican says: Published July 11, 2017

Gluten-free communion bread will not be allowed in the Catholic Church, according to a new directive issued by the Vatican.

The Vatican said the wafers used to celebrate the Eucharist during Mass must contain gluten, a protein found in wheat, even if it is only a small amount

Hosts that are completely gluten-free are invalid matter for the celebration of the Eucharist," Cardinal Robert Sarah said in a letter to bishops last month and made public on Saturday.

Bread and wafers used in the celebration of the Eucharist "must be unleavened, purely of wheat, and recently made so that there is no danger of decomposition," Bishop Sarah said in the letter.

Recently, the bread has been made available for purchase in supermarkets, and even online. Bishop Sarah warned that buying the glutenfree kind would make it invalid.

Some religious leaders began offering glutenfree wafers because a growing number of congregants had celiac disease or gluten intolerance.

SACRIFICIAL GIVING

Sunday Sept., 10,2017 \$ 10,380 *Catholic University \$ 2,222 *Collection goes to the Diocese Sunday, Sep. 11, 2016 \$11,322 As flawed and fallen humans, all of us stand in need of forgiveness—forgiveness from God and forgiveness from others. Last Sunday Jesus taught us valuable lessons on interpersonal relationship and the need for mutual correction and counsel. This weekend's Gospel reading continues to deal with the crucial question of relationship in the Christian community, focusing on the need for forgiveness. How often should I forgive? Seven times? Seventy times seven? For Jesus, forgiveness is not a numerical game. To elucidate and expound that one should not put limits on forgiveness, he tells a power-packed parable, which is found only in Matthew's Gospel.

Jesus ends his parable with the words: "So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart." His teaching is loud and clear: unless you forgive, you will not be forgiven. Why should I forgive? Because I stand in need of forgiveness—forgiveness from God and forgiveness from others. God forgives me without any condition, without any limit. Forgiveness known must be shown. When my personal debt is cancelled, I must cancel others' debts. God will not forgive me if I do not forgive others. It is not that God puts a condition to his forgiving love, but that my unforgiving heart cannot receive God's forgiveness. To forgive is to be forgiven. The duty of mutual forgiveness is founded on the fact that we have received forgiveness from God seventy times seven. Every day of our lives we live in the gracious and gratuitous forgiveness of God. I must not forget to forgive. Remembering my sinfulness is remembering to forgive. The best lesson in life that you cannot forget is forgiveness.

Why should I forgive? To forgive and to be forgiven is a basic human need. It can be a very liberating and transforming experience. Notice the word give in forgive. When you forgive, you give someone a gift, the gift of freedom and new life. And you give yourself a grudge-free, stress-free and peaceful life. When you forgive, a heavy burden is lifted from your heart and you are set free. We all have the tendency to hold on to hurt and grudges. Forgiveness can be a hard thing to do, when the injury caused is personal and deep. Nursing anger, brooding grievance, harboring hatred, cherishing resentment, rehearsing revenge and exacting vengeance are dangerous for our physical, mental, emotional and spiritual health—indeed suicidal. When I forgive, I set a prisoner free and I discover that the prisoner is me. The greatest gift you can give yourself is forgiving others. Forgiving is the only way of being fair to yourself. Forgiveness brings freedom, healing, peace and growth.


Why should I forgive? There is no person on earth who does not need forgiveness. We all slip up and we all need to be forgiven. The person who wronged you is a human being like you, part of the sinful world. No one is perfect, including you. Awareness of your weak human nature and your propensity to sin, should lead you to forgive others. As someone said, sometimes the first step to forgiveness is understanding the other person is a complete idiot. And I am none the less. I stand in need of forgiveness. I forgive because I need to be forgiven. I remember what a Hindu friend of mine said to me one day, commending the forgiving attitude of Christians who were persecuted: "What I envy about you Christians is your extraordinary ability and capacity to forgive. I have nobody to forgive me."

Why should I forgive? Forgiveness is the bedrock and benchmark of what it is to be Christian. The heart and hallmark of Christianity is forgiving love. The name of our God is FORGIVENESS. Every page of the Old and the New Testaments bears testimony to who God is and how compassionate and merciful he is. Jesus, by his saving death on the cross, obtained absolute forgiveness of the entire debt of humanity. When you forgive, you bear witness to God's gracious and forgiving love. When you forgive, you touch hearts in ways words cannot describe. When you forgive, you walk in stride with God; you share his bountiful and benevolent love.

When was the last time you found it difficult to forgive someone? How did you feel when finally you forgave?





COMUNIDAD HISPANA

El Señor es compasivo y misericordioso

¿Quién, al recibir una ofensa, no siente el inmediato impulso interior de querer resarcirse? El dolor experimentado, el orgullo herido, la ira que se enciende en nosotros, nos impulsa a querer castigar o vengar de algún modo el daño recibido, creyendo que con hacer sufrir al otro "lo que me ha hecho sufrir a mí" podremos aliviar nuestro propio dolor o encontrar la paz.

¿Es posible ir en contra toda esa corriente interior de sentimientos tan fuertes que se despiertan en nosotros cuando nos hacen daño, cuando nos ofenden? ¿Es posible deponer el odio, resistir al deseo de venganza y purificar el corazón de todo resentimiento? Eso es lo que el Señor pide a sus discípulos: perdonar siempre a quien nos hace daño o nos ofende, incluso a quien lo hace reiteradamente, cada vez que se acerque arrepentido.

Pero podemos decir que el perdón lo debemos ofrecer incluso a aquél que no está arrepentido del daño que nos puede haber ocasionado, involuntaria o voluntariamente. Esto es más difícil aún, ciertamente. Mas de ello da ejemplo y lección el mismo Señor Jesús en la Cruz cuando reza e implora el perdón para aquellos que lo están crucificando sin misericordia, y que no muestran ningún tipo de arrepentimiento sino que están llenos de odio y malicia.

Ofrecer el perdón a quien nos ha hecho daño es un acto heroico que sólo puede brotar de un amor que es más grande que el mal. Este perdón no sólo es una puerta abierta al pecador para que pueda arrepentirse, corregirse y volver al buen camino. También es el camino que trae la paz a aquél que ha sufrido el daño o la ofensa. Quien se niega a perdonar y alimenta el resentimiento, el rencor y el deseo de venganza en su propio corazón, jamás encontrará la paz del espíritu. Quien cree que puede curar su herida y mitigar su dolor dirigiendo su odio y rencor hacia la persona que le ha causado un dolor y un daño acaso irreparable, tan sólo añade al daño recibido otro peor: su rencor es un veneno que se vuelve contra él mismo, la amargura envenena y mata su propia alma y se difunde a su alrededor, haciendo dura y desdichada la vida de quienes lo rodean por la amarqura que lleva en sí mismo. ¡Sólo el perdón ofrecido a quien nos ofende es capaz de curar las propias heridas! Quien ofrece el perdón, recibe a cambio la paz del propio corazón.

Quizá entendamos mejor lo dicho con una comparación: Si una serpiente venenosa te muerde, ¿irías tras ella, pensando para tus adentros: "cuando la mate, quedaré curado"? Sería de necios e insensatos pensar y actuar así, ¿verdad? Pero es exactamente lo que hacemos cuando alguien nos hace daño y damos paso al odio y al resentimiento en el corazón, buscando —aunque sólo sea en el pensamiento— devolver el daño recibido hasta quedar nosotros "resarcidos". Puede que en el momento "te sientas bien" matando a la serpiente a palazos, pero tú también morirás por el veneno que ha sido inoculado en ti. En cambio, quien perdona de corazón es como quien sin preocuparse por perseguir a la serpiente y sin perder un segundo va corriendo a la posta médica para buscar el antídoto y salvar así su propia vida. Perdonar toda ofensa o daño recibido, por muy grave que éste sea.
