





No escucha a Dios ciertamente quien no se habitúa a escucharlo día a día, teniendo con Él esos momentos y espacios de encuentro, de lectura y reflexión de su palabra. Necesitamos hacernos el hábito de tener momentos fuertes de oración, de pasar más ratos de oración en el Santísimo, de educarnos a

hacer silencio en el corazón en medio de tantas y tan exigentes actividades de cada día, necesitamos en algún momento del día hacer un alto. abstenernos de toda actividad para sentarnos a los pies del Señor y Ilegarnos a Él para escuchar las palabras de vida que brotan de sus labios y fluyen de su Corazón

rebosante de amor por nosotros. Si no le regalamos esos momentos, si no nos hacemos violencia y reordenamos nuestras prioridades de modo que no le demos al Señor solamente el tiempo que nos sobra -si es que nos sobra— sino un momento central de nuestra jornada, tampoco escucharemos su voz, tampoco Él nos regalará con la experiencia íntima de su presencia amorosa. En ese caso, seremos nosotros los únicos culpables de esa sordera que nos impide escuchar al Señor.

Pero no basta ponernos en la presencia del Señor, ante el Santísimo, o en un lugar silencioso y apartado, en mi cuarto o en un oratorio. También hay que hacer silencio en el corazón. ¡Cuantas veces entramos en la presencia del Señor cargados con vanas preocupaciones, abrumados con nuestros pendientes, agitados con mil ideas; apenas nos deshacemos de una distracción viene otra! ¡Cuánta bulla cargamos en nuestro interior y qué difícil se hace hacer silencio en esos momentos en que queremos ponernos ante el Señor! Y así, tan disipados como estamos pensando en todo menos en el Señor, en su presencia, en sus palabras, aquél precioso momento no pasa de ser sino un momento de escucharnos a nosotros mismos, de estar centrados en nuestros problemas, de reflexionar en miles de cosas que nada tienen que ver con lo que he venido a hacer: ponerme en la presencia del Señor, estarme con Él, meditar en su palabra, rumiarla, hacerla mía, dejarme iluminar por ella, apropiarme de ella al calor de la oración para que se convierta en un criterio firme de conducta.

En la que a nosotros nos toca, hagamos un serio y sostenido esfuerzo por buscar continuamente al Señor en la oración y procuremos hacer silencio en nuestro interior, para poder escuchar, acoger y dejarnos transformar por la palabra del Señor, por el Señor Jesús mismo que es la Palabra viva pronunciada por el Padre desde toda la eternidad, Palabra por la que todo vino a la existencia.
