**Fourth Sunday of Easter
April 22, 2018**

Theme: Jesus is the Good Shepherd.

Breaking Open the Word: Suggested text for faith sharing: Gospel Jn 10:11-18
*Jesus said: I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. A hired man, who is not a shepherd and whose sheep are not his own, sees a wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away, and the wolf catches and scatters them. This is because he works for pay and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I will lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. These also I must lead, and they will hear my voice, and there will be one flock, one shepherd.
 This is why the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down on my own. I have power to lay it down, and power to take it up again. This command I have received from my Father."*

Step One: Listen to the Word

As you hear this lovely reading about Jesus as shepherd, what words or phrases strike you? What in this reading touches your heart?

Step Two: Look into Your Life

Question for Children: Jesus tells us he is the Good Shepherd, but how do you experience God guiding and protecting you?

Question for Youth: How do you feel about Jesus' being your shepherd? What does it mean to you that he lays down his life for you?


Question for Adults: What qualities of God does the image of the Good Shepherd suggest? How do you experience God in this way?

BE A WITNESS OF THE RESURRECTION - Dr. MARTIN LUTHER KING, Jr.

Happy Easter Season Everyone! From Easter Sunday, April 1st to Pentecost, May 20th we are celebrating the Easter Season! Since the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ is the most momentous event of our Christian faith, the Church gives us 50 days to reflect, pray, witness and have a party! We have this Easter Season to remind us of how significant the Lord's resurrection is to our very faith and lives as Christians.

The readings reflect the significance of the resurrection in the life of the Church. In the Gospel of Luke this Sunday, the two disciples who have just encountered the risen Jesus on the road to Emmaus, have returned to the upper room only to find the rest of the disciples still locked in the upper room for fear that those who killed Jesus will also come for them. Jesus, however appears once again to assure his friends that he is truly risen and is victorious over death. He even proves his risen presence by eating and drinking with them at the table and allowing them to touch him. He then gives them a detailed recounting of how the prophecies from the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament) have been fulfilled by his passion, death and now the resurrection. Jesus is definitely not a ghost nor a risen corpse. He has a glorified body, one that we too will have one day after we die on this earth.

Jesus calls his disciples witnesses of these things, in which they are called to go out and challenge others to repent, be baptized and share in Christ's victory. We too are witnesses of the resurrection. We are to share the Good News, which will challenge others to live the life of Jesus and bring them to eternal life.

One person, who is a true witness of the risen Jesus, was Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Back on April 4th, the Nation commemorated the 50th Anniversary of his assassination in Memphis, Tennessee. Dr. King was in Memphis to give support to the striking sanitation workers who were marching for fair treatment in the work place and a decent wage. The Civil Rights Act of 1964 and the Voter Rights Act of 1965 were signs of hope that racial justice would stem the tide of racism that existed before and after the Civil War.

One hundred years since that conflict which tore the country apart over the issue of slavery, the evil of racism still festered in our country. Martin Luther King knew that and was determined to engage in peaceful protest even at the risk of his own life. That is what brought him to Memphis on that fateful day.

Bishop Barres recently wrote a pastoral letter marking this event. Bishop Barres states, *We do not simply mark the anniversary of the death of Dr. King for its historical significance. His example compels us to act in our own time and place. We must examine our consciences as individuals, as a church, and as a society asking for healing of our past sins against the sacredness of human life and our failures to recognize the dignity of others who are made in the image and likeness of God.*

The dream of racial equality that Dr. Martin Luther King embraced has yet to be fulfilled. It remains the task of this generation and future generations inspired by his vision and self-sacrifice. To respect others, no matter the race, color or creed, by our words and actions, makes us witnesses of the resurrection to future generations to come.



It includes freedom of worship but is also the right to evangelize, change their religion, have schools and charitable institutions, and conduct their jobs and businesses according to their conscience and religious beliefs.

Congress shall make no law respecting the establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; ... First Amendment to the Bill of Rights.







Cada Eucaristía es Emaús; cada momento en que escuchamos las Escrituras, es el camino a Emaús. Siempre vamos por ese camino, mientras Jesús nos habla y parte el pan de su amor. La Palabra da sentido a nuestras vidas, así como escuchar de Jesús las Escrituras fué para los discípulos; el partir el Pan de Vida, nos alimenta en la misma forma como Jesús hizo en la Última Cena con sus discípulos. Con la Palabra y el Pan, ellos fueron a las comunidades y al mundo, con sus relatos de cómo habían reconocido al Señor. La lectura diaria de los Evangelios, y el pan nuestro de cada día, pueden hacer lo mismo para nosotros.

Las huellas de nuestros pasos a lo largo de los caminos de nuestras vidas, son siempre acompañadas por los pasos de Jesús.
