SOME CHANGES IN OUR MASS PROCEDURES


Recently, I conducted a meeting with all of our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and our Ushers as to some changes in the procedures at Mass. For best understanding, I will refer to the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion as EMs. One of the most important liturgical documents that the Church should follow is known as the **General Instruction on the Roman Missal (GIRM)**. We are now in the Third Edition. Paragraphs 16, 17 & 18 of the General Instruction state that celebration of the Mass is the height of the Christian life. Therefore, everything that we do as Christians should flow to and from the Mass (16). The ministries and the faithful should draw the most fruits as possible from the Mass that Christ instituted when he gave us himself in his body and blood (17). In order to draw the most fruits (effects) from the Mass, paragraph 18 states that great care should be taken in the liturgy as expressed through signs, symbols and actions to encourage full and active participation to meet the spiritual needs of the faithful.

In following the directive in taking care of the liturgy, I decided, after some consultation, that some minor changes would take place at Mass so as to have a better flow to the liturgy here at St. Ignatius Loyola. These changes took effect on Saturday/Sunday April 28th/29th, 2018. The first change is the position of our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion at the altar when preparing to receive Holy Communion. Instead of standing behind the presiding priest at the Lamb of God, they are now standing at the side. While the EMHC have a special role in distributing Holy Communion, we do not want to give the impression that they are con-celebrating the Mass in any way. The second change is that the EMs are no longer going to stand in the handicapped section when they arrive as extra help in the distribution of Holy Communion in main aisle area. They will now be standing on the other side of the rail of the EMHCs who are in the center, so as to ensure a better flow of traffic up the main aisle and then back onto the side aisles.

The third change concerns when Holy Communion is brought back to the tabernacle. Sometimes, some of us like to stand whether near the tabernacle lingering or from a far, until the tabernacle door is closed and then we genuflect. While that is a nice gesture, it is not part of the practice of the Church at this point in the Mass. The only person or persons who are to genuflect to the tabernacle are those priests/deacons who are directly in front of the tabernacle placing the hosts inside. When we linger or genuflect with the priest/deacon from our seats, we are adding on a ritual within a ritual and drawing attention to ourselves whether we realize it or not. Nowhere in the celebration of the liturgy should any ministers or faithful at the Mass be "standing around" with no purpose or function. The EM's are to bring the hosts to the altar, bow slightly and then depart to the seat. Everyone else should be either sitting or kneeling, if they wish. It is not heathy to show pious showmanship as to who loves Jesus more. Jesus knows what it is our hearts. None of us should be adding anything or taking away anything that is stated in the liturgy in the General Instruction of the Roman Missal. It is not MY MASS, it is the CHURCH'S MASS.

Addressed to the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity, it is a powerful plea for the light and strength and love so sorely needed by every Christian. We invite you to pray this at home or in church. Copies of the Novena will be found in our church. May God bless you and Mary keep you and your families always. May we remember to always do things for the greater glory of God. *St. Ignatius Loyola, pray for us!* **Fr. Júnv, Pastor**

Motherhood The Ultimate Stewardship

May is traditionally connected with motherhood in both secular and religious realms in our society. Mothers Day is a major holiday for much of the retail and dining world and the greeting card and floral businesses get a significant bump each time the calendar closes in on that special Sunday. The Church's connection with motherhood, however, stretches back far beyond the establishment of the secular celebration of mothers – in fact, it dates to the foot of the cross.

"When Jesus saw his mother, and the disciple whom he loved standing near, he said to his mother, 'Woman, behold your son!' Then he said to the disciple, 'Behold your mother!' And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home." (John 19:26-27). By entrusting his mother to his beloved disciple, Saint John, Christ selected her to be the mother of all of us who are also his beloved disciples. We are doubly given Mary as our mother when Saint Paul instructs us that we are members of Christ's Body. Mary, the mother of Christ, then becomes the mother of all who are a part of his body. She rightly then is conferred with the title of "Mother of the Church." It is instructive for us, then, to explore more deeply the importance of this title and to consider what it means for us.

While mankind's fall in the Garden of Eden was precipitated by Eve's disobedience, it was Mary's complete obedience and cooperation with God that models for us the perfect discipleship that is the desire of every Christian. The Blessed Virgin Mary – "the New Eve" – served an instrumental role in giving Jesus his earthy life; she thus participates in a most profound way in Christ's gift of his grace and divine life to us, and made it possible to receive eternal life through his redemption.

More than simply a bystander or simply an actor in the history of salvation, Mary is much more. As Blessed John Cardinal Newman explains, "She had a meritorious share in bringing about our redemption." Further, Newman says, "She suffered more keen and intimate anguish at Our Lord's Passion and Crucifixion... by reason of being His Mother. Not in body, but in soul, she suffered a fellow passion; she was crucified with Him, the spear that pierced His breast pierced through her spirit."

In our quest to live lives of stewardship, we seek to use our gifts wisely and to share the blessings we have received with others. Mary is a perfect role model for us in this endeavor. Again examining Cardinal Newman's teaching, we find his assurance that Mary's intercession for us is characterized by a unique power, given her spiritual maternity. "While

Hoy escuchamos otra vez el mandamiento que Jesús dejó a sus discípulos: que se amen los unos a los otros como El les había amado. Es el punto clave de su enseñanza- un mensaje profundo que ya estamos acostumbrados a leer. Por eso, no tiene el impacto que debe tener, porque está lleno de desafíos no solamente al nivel personal, sino al nivel de la comunidad y de la Iglesia.

Jesús empezó su relato hablando del amor que el Padre le tiene a Él. Pero los primeros discípulos sabían que este amor del Padre no salvó a Jesús de su pasión y muerte. Pudieron entender que el amor era más un compromiso que una protección

del mal. El amor íntimo que existía entre Jesús y su Padre le ha llevado a Jesús a entregar todo, hasta su vida para quedar fiel a su Padre. Es un

amor que es

completamente libre de egoísmo. Es un amor que le llevó a dar su vida para el bien de todos.

Este amor es universal, libre de egoísmo, y compasivo. Cuando Jesús dijo, "Yo no les llamo siervos...a ustedes los llamo amigos, porque les ha dado a conocer todo lo que le he oído a mi Padre", el está diciendo que este amor no solamente destruye el abismo que existe entre esclavo y amo, pero que

destruye el abismo que existe entre Dios y la persona humana. El mandamiento es vivir esta clase de amor que se expresa en abrirse a recibir al extranjero, compartir con el necesitado en la mesa y soportar las cargas del otro.

Cornelio era un capitán del ejército, uno de los que habían crucificado a Jesús. Pedro tuvo dudas acerca de su deseo de seguirle a Cristo, recordando todo lo que había sufrido su amigo y maestro. Pero al ver que El Espíritu Santo se ha derramado sobre los paganos, el cambió de opinión y le ofreció las aguas del Bautismo.

Pedro tenía que aprender que el mensaje de Jesús extendía a gente con diferencias étnicas, religiosas y políticas. El mandamiento de amor nos impulsa a abrir el corazón a tales personas hoy en día. Tal vez estas personas no van a aceptar nuestra fe, pero debemos ofrecerles hospitalidad, apoyo, y ayuda cuando les encontramos. No era fácil en el tiempo de los primeros discípulos, y no es fácil hoy. Sin embargo, es el mensaje expresado en las lecturas sagradas de hoy.

En estos domingos después de la Pascua, la Iglesia nos ofrece mensajes de unidad, de servicio y de amor. La semana pasada hemos leído de la necesidad de producir frutos y hoy la necesidad de incluir en nuestro círculo de amigos a los que no nos parece, ni en idioma, en tradiciones, o en etnicidad. Como Jesús es la encarnación del amor del Padre, así, tenemos que ser la encarnación del amor de Jesús. En nuestra sociedad que está marcada por divisiones económicas, raciales y culturales, el mandamiento nos impulsa a vivir como modelos de amor que proclaman que la gracia de Dios es más grande que la presión de nuestra cultura.
