

In the Gospel today, we celebrate the birth of John the Baptist and everyone pondered the question: "What, then, will this child be? For surely the hand of the Lord was with him.





THE NATIVITY OF JOHN THE BAPTIST Luke 1:57-66,80

THE BIRTH OF JOHN THE BAPTIST- WHAT'S IN A NAME!

Today Sunday, June 24th, is a bit unusual because the Church is putting aside the Scripture readings for the 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time to celebrate a Nativity; The Birth of John the Baptist. Apart from the birth of Jesus at Christmas, the birthday of the Blessed Virgin Mary and that of John the Baptist, are the only two nativities celebrated in the Church. The role of these two figures are crucial in carrying out God's plan for the redemption of humanity from sin. They both are the land-scapes by which God chose to insert himself into our world in and through Jesus Christ.

John came to bear witness to the faithful servant of God who will as our first reading from Isaiah tells us, "the light to the nations". John played his role very well in acknowledging that Jesus is THE Messiah and the only messenger to prepare the way as we hear from the Acts of the Apostles. The birth of John the Baptist, as Luke describes, makes clear the reality that John was born to fulfill a noble role in God's predestined plan for the salvation of the world.

We see in Luke's Gospel that both Elizabeth and Zechariah trust in the role God has planned for John. That is why they named him John and not after the name of his father, as is traditionally held. This is to show that this child's mission is anything but normal.

The birth of a child is very special for the parents and the family. One of the most joyful roles of a parent is to choose a name for the child. This past Monday, I asked members of our Activities Committee, why do your children have the names they have? Why do you think you have your name. Much has to do with tradition, honor and carrying down the tradition of faith that was given to them by their parents.

Ask yourself, why was I given the name I have today? Ask your parents, if they are still living. My name originally was suppose to be Jeffrey. Imagine that. But, my parents decided on James. As a parent, ask yourself, why did I name my child(ren) the names they have today? No matter the name, each of us needs to remember that we are like John the Baptist, called to be pointers to Jesus Christ in our world. May we take this summer time to relish in the gift of life God has given us and remind ourselves how beloved we are in God's eyes. May we also relish in our name and use it for good so that ultimately our names will be as Revelation tells us, inscribed in the Book of Heaven.

PRAYER FOR RELIGIOUS LIBERTY

From June 21st thru July 4th, the Church once again focuses on Religious Liberty, the Fortnight for Freedom. Please say the prayer for religious liberty with us after each Mass during this time. Truth vs. Relativism:

Jesus said, "...and you will know the truth and the truth will set you free ..." (John 8:32)

Veritatis Splendor (The Splendor of Truth), was written by Pope John Paul II in 1993 and revolves around man's ability to discern good, the existence of evil, and the role of human freedom, human conscience and natural law. Pope John Paul II emphatically says that moral truth is knowable and there is no contradiction between freedom and following the truth.

Much of our modern culture is based on a belief in relativism which says there is no absolute truth and that truth is merely what a particular individual or culture happen to believe. Veritatis Splendor insists that moral law is universal across people in varying cultures and is, in fact, rooted in the human condition and natural law.





La vocación y misión de Juan Bautista nos permite reflexionar sobre la vocación y misión de cada ser humano. ¿Por qué existo? ¿Cuál es el sentido de mi vida? ¿Cuál es mi misión en el mundo? Son preguntas apremiantes y fundamentales que todo ser humano que llega al uso de razón se hace, preguntas que tú y yo nos hemos hecho o hacemos, con mucha intensidad, en algún momento

de nuestra vida. ¿Cómo podría yo

realizarme si no sé *quién soy*, *de donde vengo*ni *a donde voy*, si no sé *cuál es mi misión en el mundo?* Mientras no conozca las respuestas al misterio que soy yo mismo andaré sin rumbo, desorientado, perdido, dando vueltas en círculo a lo más.

Responder a estas preguntas es pues esencial, no simplemente para satisfacer una acuciante curiosidad, sino porque de su recta respuesta depende nuestra propia realización, depende que lleguemos a ser lo que estamos llamados a ser, depende por tanto nuestra propia felicidad y la de muchos otros también. Es capaz de realizarse y aportar a la realización de otros quien en Cristo descubre su identidad más profunda, su origen, su fin, el sentido de su existencia y su misión en el mundo.

Al mirar la vocación y misión del Bautista comprendemos —desde la razón iluminada por la fe— que la vida de todo ser humano es una *vocación* dada por Dios para una misión concreta.

La expresión vocación viene del latín vocare, que quiere decir *llamar*. Al decir vocación entendemos el *llamado* que Dios hace a su criatura humana, a cada uno de nosotros.

Ya nuestra misma vida es una *vocación*, un *llamado* que Dios nos ha hecho a salir de la nada para pasar a la existencia. Mas Dios no nos llama a la existencia como a un mineral, a una planta o a un animal, sino que nos crea *personas humanas*, capaces de entrar en diálogo y comunión con Él. ¡Más aún, a nosotros nos llama a participar de su misma vida y *naturaleza divina* (ver *2Pe* 1, 4), nos llama a «ser santos e inmaculados en su presencia, en el amor» (*Ef* 1, 4; ver *Lev* 11, 45)!

Pero junto a este llamado universal al que todos los seres humanos estamos llamados hay otro llamado particular. a cada cual Dios lo llama a ocupar un lugar particular y cumplir una misión específica en el mundo. Es en vistas a nuestra propia realización como personas humanas y misión en el mundo que Dios nos ha dado a cada uno, ya desde nuestra concepción, «como un germen, un conjunto de aptitudes y de cualidades para hacerlas fructificar; su floración, fruto de la educación recibida en el propio ambiente y del esfuerzo personal, permitirá a cada uno orientarse hacia el destino que le ha sido propuesto por el Creador» (S.S. Pablo VI, Populorum progressio, 15). ¿Para qué me pensó y formó Dios desde el seno de mi madre? ¿Para qué he nacido? ¿Cuál es el Plan que Dios tiene para mí? ¿Cuál es mi vocación? ¿Cuál mi misión en el mundo? Descubrir mi propia vocación y misión en el mundo, saber quién soy desde la mirada amorosa del Señor y conocer qué es lo que Dios me pide en sus amorosos designios es esencial no sólo para que yo pueda llegar a ser feliz, sino también para ayudar a muchas otras personas a ser felices. Muchos dependen de mi respuesta generosa al Plan de Dios. Por ello «es deber irrenunciable de cada uno
