


The Religious Education Office will be closed for the months of July and August. Registration forms will be available at the Rectory or on the parish website. Registration forms must be returned by June 30. After June 30 there will be a \$25 late fee charged.

All children who are attending the 1<sup>st</sup> grade through the 8<sup>th</sup> grade in the local public schools must be registered in the Religious Education Program.

In order to receive the Sacraments of Penance and First Holy Communion children must have 2 years of studies. Religion classes continue for the 3, 4, 5, 6, 7th grades. Students will be eligible to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation after 7 years of Religious Education studies.

### **EONTINUING OUR MISSION UPDATE-THE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN WHAT'S HAPPENING AROUND OUR FACILITIES**

I am filled with joy to inform all of you that we are doing very well in our CAPITAL CAMPAIGN project entitled CONTINUING OUR MISSION! Currently we have received \$1,150,217 of the paid pledges. Our goal as you know, is \$1,500,000. Because we have received more pledges, the goal is now \$1,579,669.23. We are only \$429,451.90 in reaching our total goal. My gratitude to all who are contributing to this crucial campaign. May God continue to perform the good works he has begun in you!

Currently, we still have some more work to do on our convent windows. These would be the windows used by Human Services and all those in the lower level of the convent. On another note, not used by Capital Campaign funds, a new concrete back porch stoop of the rectory was built. It was decaying from weather events over this past year and needed to be done as to prevent any risk to people coming in and out of the house. We also needed to place a new carpet in the rectory dining room and upstairs on the third floor. The carpets had been fraying. We thought it best to do it now, so as to prevent problems in the future.

Our next two projects are a new organ and a new parking lot. We are currently interviewing vendors as to see who would be best for these projects structurally and economically. When those items are approved by our Diocese, I will let you know.





**Independence Day - July 4, 1776**—The American Founders gathered in Philadelphia in 1776 to draft the Declaration of Independence, which dissolved the political ties that had bound the American people to Great Britain. A new nation was born, **free and independent.** 

The 56 Signers required remarkable courage since they knew they were committing treason against the British Crowne and that, if caught, they risked torture and death. Ultimately, 5 were captured and brutally tortured as traitors, 9 others died from wounds, some lost sons to battle or capture, and many had their homes and property pillaged and burned, while still others lost their fortunes in helping to fund the Continental Army.

These remarkable men of education and some means risked their security since they valued liberty more. "For the support of this declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of Divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other, our lives, our fortunes, and our sacred honor."

#### Who were these 56 brave men?

48 were native-born Americans and 8 were born in Britain. They were lawyers and jurists, merchants, farmers and plantation owners, a teacher, a musician, a printer, 4 had been full-time preachers, and more were sons of clergymen. 24 held seminary degrees or Bible school degrees. Most belonged to the Anglican Church while others belonged to various Protestant denominations and there was one Roman Catholic

They would each agree with Thomas Jefferson that "God who gave us life gave us liberty."

## COMUNIDAD HISPANA



El ser humano sabe que el sufrimiento humano no es un bien, sino un mal. ¿Quién, en su sano juicio, quiere el sufrimiento para sí?
El masoquismo, deleitarse en el propio sufrimiento tomándolo como un placer, es propio de un espíritu enfermo. Nuestra sensibilidad trata de evadir el sufrimiento. Tampoco lo queremos para nuestros seres queridos: nos duele verlos sufrir, nos duele su dolor. El amor genera una solidaridad en el dolor.

En el esfuerzo por paliar el dolor, por calmarlo o eliminarlo, se ha inventado la anestesia, los sedantes, los calmantes.

La droga, el alcohol, la búsqueda de placer, etc., se han convertido también en modos fáciles de olvidar el dolor y evadir el sufrimiento sicológico, aunque sea por un instante, aún cuando luego vuelva con peor insidia. Hay quien ante un dolor insostenible y una situación desesperada piensa incluso en acabar su sufrimiento poniendo fin a su propia vida, o a la de aquellos a quienes ve sufrir tanto y no puede ayudar. ¿Quién no ha escuchado la terrible historia de alguna madre que, desesperada y agobiada por su situación de pobreza, de hambre y abandono total, tomó la decisión de envenenar a sus hijos y suicidarse luego ella misma?

Es natural que le pidamos a Dios que aparte de nosotros el cáliz del sufrimiento, que nos libre de la cruz, del dolor que puede llevar a extremos a veces insoportables. ¡El mismo Hijo de Dios también rezó así al Padre: «aparta de mí este cáliz» (*Lc* 22, 42)! Pero, también el Señor Jesús nos enseña que al mismo tiempo hemos de añadir a nuestra intensa súplica un acto de total confianza en Dios y adhesión a sus designios: «pero no se haga mi voluntad, sino la tuya» (*Lc* 22, 42). Si a pesar de nuestra intensa súplica la cruz permanece allí, haciéndonos sufrir lo indecible; si no somos liberados de nuestro sufrimiento en ese instante, hemos de confiar plenamente en que Dios sacará mucho más fruto del grano que al caer en tierra sufre y muere (ver *Jn* 12, 24). Esa esperanza nos alienta a buscar en el Señor la fortaleza interior y a abrazarnos a la cruz con fe, con paciencia y con la profunda confianza de que de ese sufrimiento que experimento Dios sabrá sacar muchos bienes que yo, por ahora, no puedo vislumbrar.

Pidámosle al Señor con fe que nos libre de la carga de la enfermedad y del mal que se hace presente en nuestras vidas. Acudamos a Él con fe en momentos de sufrimiento y desesperación, tal y como lo hicieron Jairo, la hemorroisa o tantos otros. Pero pidámosle también que, si tiene a bien permitir que pasemos por el crisol del dolor, nos haga fuertes y valientes para cargar con el peso de la cruz sin desesperar, sin desalentarnos, sin rebelarnos caprichosamente contra Dios como si Él fuese el culpable de todos nuestros males o un sádico que le gusta vernos sufrir. No es así. Dios verdaderamente nos ama, y nos pide confiar en Él, en sus promesas, en el amor que nos tiene, en su preocupación por nosotros, por nuestro destino, presente y eterno. También nosotros, como San Pablo, hemos de confiar en las promesas de Dios y estar convencidos de que «la leve tribulación de un momento nos produce, sobre toda medida, un pesado caudal de gloria eterna, a cuantos no ponemos nuestros ojos en las cosas visibles, sino en las invisibles; pues las cosas visibles son pasajeras, mas las invisibles
