Pilgrims, Thanksgiving, and a Failed Experiment: Part 1

A Quick History: The *Mayflower* set sail from England on Sept. 6, 1620, and arrived at Cape Cod on Nov. 11, 1620. The ship moved on to Plymouth with its 102 Pilgrims and on Nov. 21, 1620, they drafted and signed the *Mayflower Compact*, a legal document, "in the presence of God, and of one another, (to) covenant and combine ourselves together into a civil body politic."

Weakened from the 65 day voyage and unprepared for the harsh winter, by spring, half had died from starvation and disease. Fortunately, with the help of local Native Americans (Indians), the 53 remaining Pilgrims learned to plant and harvested an abundant crop by fall. Thus, the First Thanksgiving was to celebrate a successful harvest and give thanks to God.

The Experiment: The Pilgrims decided that their new community would create a collectivist model of governance where all labor was communal, with men raising crops for all families, not just their own, and women engaged in domestic chores for their neighbors. Few did more than the minimal because the incentive to excel was destroyed. Within two years, the result was shortages and starvation. The Pilgrims' Governor, William Bradford, described the folly of collectivism, "For this community was found to breed much confusion and discontent and retard much employment that would have been to their benefit and comfort. ."Gov. Bradford also spoke about another problem from this created famine - thievery. "much was stolen both by night and day..."

33rd SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME Matthew 13: 24-32



The following is the Thanksgiving Proclamation as given by President Abraham Lincoln on October 20, 1864. Please take some time with your family to read and reflect over his words. They are as meaningful today as they were back in the 19th Century.

One thing to think about from this Sunday's Gospel is asking ourselves this questions, in all that I do in my life, am I helping God to build his kingdom or am I standing in the way? God will judge us on that at the end of our time. One great way to build God's Kingdom is be thankful not just on Thanksgiving Day but every day. Another way is to celebrate Thanksgiving ! While I realize our cultural circumstances, we have only ourselves to blame if we make this Thanksgiving a shopping day. The stores and websites will be there. Family and friends are temporary. While there are jobs that demand people to be there, I often think of those families who are separated

due to our consumer demand. We can set the pace. It starts first with you and me. From all of us here at St. Ignatius Loyola; staff, sisters and your priests, have a blessed and joyous Thanksgiving! May God bless you and Mary keep you and your families. May we strive to do all things for the greater glory of God. St. Ignatius Loyola, pray for us! Fr. Jim, Pastor

A Thanksgiving Proclamation by Abraham Lincoln President Lincoln emphasized a national day of thanks

It is the duty of the nations as well as of men to own their dependence upon the over ruling power of God; to confess their sins and transgressions in humble sorrow, yet with assured hope that genuine repentance' will lead to mercy and pardon; and to recognize the sublime truth, announced in the Holy Scriptures and proven by all history, that those nations are blessed whose God is the LORD.

We know that by His divine law, nations, like individuals, are subject to punishments and chastisements in this world. May we not justly fear that the awful calamity of civil war which now desolates the land ,may be a punishment inflicted upon us for-our presumptuous sins; to the needful end of our national reformation as a whole people? We have been the recipients of the choicest bounties of heaven. We have been preserved these many years in peace and prosperity. We have grown in numbers, wealth and power as no other nation has ever grown.

But we have forgotten God. We-have forgotten the gracious hand-which preserved us in peace and multiplied and enriched and strengthened us, and we have vainly imagined in the deceitfulness of our hearts, that all these blessings were produced by some superior wisdom and virtue of our own. Intoxicated with unbroken success, we have become too self-sufficient to feel the necessity of redeeming and preserving grace, too proud to pray to the God that made us. It has seemed to me fit and proper that God should be solemnly, reverently, and gratefully acknowledged, as with one heart and one voice by the whole American people.

I do therefore invite my fellow citizens in every part of the United States, and also those who are at sea and those who are sojourning in foreign lands, to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November as a day of Thanksgiving and praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the heavens. And I recommend to them that, while offering up the ascriptions justly due to Him for such singular deliverances and blessings, they do also, with humble penitence for our national perverseness and disobedience, commend to His tender care all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners, or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife in which we are unavoidably engaged, and fervently implore the interposition of the Almighty hand to heal the wounds of the nation, and to restore it, as soon as may be consistent with the Divine purposes, to the full enjoyment of peace, harmony, tranquility, and union. **Done at the city of Washington, this 20th day of October, A.D. 1864, and of the Independence of the United States the eighty-ninth.** <u>Confirmandí</u>





Cuando nos hacemos parte de esfuerzos que anuncian que todos pertenecemos a la familia de Dios, ya sea en las alegrías y tristezas, debemos dar gracias por la comunidad de fe. Y cuando vemos la bondad de un individuo o un grupo, debemos bendecirla con gran entusiasmo.

Hoy, podemos empezar de nuevo, lamentando lo malo y proclamando lo bueno de nuestra comunidad. En esta nueva época de justicia, podemos servir como luz en la oscuridad y alegría de la tristeza. En nuestra época nueva, todos estamos llamados a ser profeta.
