5th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME LUKE 5:1-11

WE ARE ALL CALLED

This Sunday, we learn that each of us are called to serve the Lord in some capacity. The interesting thing is that both Isaiah and Peter, who are called, both feel unworthy. That is natural. No one is worthy for the Lord. However, the Lord has made himself worthy for us by being born into the world like us, embracing our humanity and giving us a share in his life.

Isaiah was very young when the Lord called him to serve. Israel was divided into two kingdoms, Judah and Israel. Both states were not following God's ways. So God chose the young Isaiah to lead the people back to him. Isaiah felt unworthy. Even though he may have felt unworthy, this was not an obstacle to God. God made Isaiah aware of his sinfulness and then cleansed him so that he could carry out his plan. God gave him the strength to speak his word, interpret his will and call his people and leaders to seek forgiveness and return to God's ways. At every Mass, right before the Gospel, the priest recalls this event by asking God to cleanse his lips or by praying over the Deacon for God to cleanse his lips so that they can worthily proclaim the Gospel.

Peter is similar to Isaiah in that he too was young and sinful. Peter was also probably more stubborn. Yet, after resisting Jesus' call to drop his nets, he finally listens to his call. That makes all the difference. When we listen to the Lord, great things will happen. We are all called to serve the Lord as Priests, Prophets and Kings from our Baptism. Read paragraph 31 of Lumen Gentium, the Constitution on the Church. There are some of us who are called in a particular way to become an ordained priest, deacon, or religious sister or brother. Jesus may be calling you to share your gifts and talents this way.

Do you know someone who may consider the ordained priesthood?

One special event in March is the retreat for young men ages 16-35 who may have a calling to the priesthood. Bishop John Barres will lead this retreat at the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception in Huntington, NY, March 8th through March 10th. There may be a member of your family or someone you know who may be a possible candidate for this retreat. If you know of someone, ask them to consider attending. Go out into the deep and bring others to Jesus. If we don't invite or encourage someone we know, they may never consider the priesthood. My dream was to serve as a meteorologist like Elliot Abrams of Accu-Weather. However, the Lord called me to serve him as a priest by helping people through the storms of life or to recognize his presence when all is bright. I am grateful to God for that. Here is a Prayer for us to catch people for Jesus like the disciples: - Father God, we want the hands of the true fisher of men. Lord, help us not to be afraid to go wherever the fish are. Let us not be afraid to get our hands dirty. Father help us not to just "catch and release" new converts, let us also be disciplers of people as well. Amen

COMUNIDAD HISPANA



Seguro que todos hemos visitado alguna de esas iglesias antiguas en las que en el ábside, pintado o en un mosaico, encima del altar, se ve la figura enorme de un Cristo. No está crucificado sino sentado en un trono. Tiene en sus manos los signos de la realeza. Y le rodean los apóstoles,

los ángeles y los santos. Es una representación de la corte celestial. Cristo en todo su poder. Esa representación se llama "Pantocrátor". Quería comunicar a

los que la veían la solemnidad, la majestad y la eternidad de Dios. Ante esa imagen, la respuesta del hombre es la que da Isaías en la primera lectura: "¡Ay de mí,

estoy perdido!" La majestad y el poder de Dios es tan grande que nos sentimos totalmente anulados ante él.

Pero el Evangelio nos cuenta otra historia. Nos cuenta una historia real. Algo que ha sucedido en nuestro mundo. Aquel Dios, que estaba representado en todo su poder y majestad, se ha bajado de su trono, se ha acercado a nosotros, se ha hecho uno de nosotros. Ha caminado por nuestras calles y habla nuestro idioma. Ha sentido el frío y el calor. Ha llorado y ha reido con nosotros. En Jesús Dios se hace carne, se encarna. Ésa es la historia, la gran historia, que nos cuenta el Evangelio. El Evangelio de hoy nos acerca a un momento de la vida de Jesús. Está

hablando de Dios a la gente, cerca del lago. El gentio es grande y pide a

Pedro que le deje subir a su barca para hablar desde ahí. Cuando termina, le invita a remar mar adentro para echar las redes. Ahí se produce la confusión. Ya habían estado toda la noche trabajando y no habían pescado nada. Pero en su nombre vuelven a echar las redes. Se produce el milagro. Y, curiosamente la reacción de Pedro es parecida a la del profeta Isaías en la primera lectura: "Apártate de mí, Señor, que soy un pecador". Pedro se da cuenta de que Jesús es algo más que un predicador, que un profeta. Jesús es Dios mismo. No es el Dios en poder de la primera lectura, pero es Dios. Es Dios cercano, hecho hombre, amable, lleno de compasión y misericordia.

Curiosamente también, Dios actúa del mismo modo tanto en la primera lectura como en Evangelio: salva, purifica, perdona y envía. El profeta se sentía perdido e impuro, Pedro se sentía pecador. A los dos, Dios les recoge, les levanta y les hace colaboradores de su plan de salvación. "No temas, desde ahora serás pescador de hombres". Para Isaías y para Pedro, y también para nosotros que escuchamos hoy estas lecturas, se abre un nuevo futuro más allá de nuestras limitaciones, de nuestros pecados. Dios nos llama a colaborar con él, a ser mensajeros y testigos de su amor y de su misericordía para todos los hombres y mujeres. Y todo eso por pura gracia y amor de Dios (segunda lectura).
