We have begun our Lenten journey and this is our first week. The readings from this first Sunday set the tone of the road we are to take. We see in Luke that Jesus is in the desert that is vast, abandoned and a lifeless place. The desert is an image of our inner lives known as a spiritual desert. Jesus shows us that we can turn the deserts of our lives into places where we encounter God.

While for 40 days in the desert, Jesus faces Satan who throws at him three temptations that Satan also throws at us. We can learn from Jesus how to say no to the temptations of life that lead us to sin. What is interesting to note is that Luke tells us that Jesus is already filled with the Holy Spirit from his Baptism in an earlier passion. The Holy Spirit leads Jesus into a confrontation with evil so that Jesus can resist and defeat evil in the power of the Spirit. This shows us that when we receive the Holy Spirit in Baptism and Confirmation, we too have the same power as Jesus to defeat evil.

Satan tempts Jesus in three ways. First Satan tests Jesus to be a divine showoff or a magician. Jesus rebuked Satan by saying that it is in God's word that we live and not on our own. In the second temptation, Satan offers Jesus the world and to be a hero as the people expected. Jesus refuses Satan by saying that he chooses to live Israel's greatest commandment to worship and serve God alone. In the third temptation, Satan tells Jesus to be a Messiah of popularity and success. Be a Messiah other than that willed by the Father. Jesus clings to the Father and obeys his mission all the way to the cross. In all three temptations, Jesus relies on God's Word alone. May this Lent teach us to do the same. When we feel overwhelmed and abandoned, go to Jesus ask him to help you because he knows what temptations are all about. A question we may ask ourselves is, what tactics does Satan use with me to try to get me to sin? How will I overcome and resist him in the power and name of Jesus?

I want to take this time to welcome Fr. Frank DeSiano, a Paulist Father, who will be leading us in our Lenten Mission this year. His theme is "**Being A Disciple Today**." I met Fr. Frank back in 2003 and I am happy to see him again. Fr. Frank is a talented priest who will help stir our hearts in ways that will motivate us to follow Jesus and encourage others to do the same. Come and join us for our Lenten Mission this week, **Monday to Wednesday 9:30am or 7:30 pm**, you surely will not be disappointed.





I grew up in East Meadow, and at 17 entered the Sisters of St. Dominic in Amityville. Since all of my education had been in public school, I



had to find a Dominican to sponsor me into the community. As it turned out, I visited St. Ignatius convent in Hicksville, where I met with Sister Venard, who became my sponsor! After my mother died, my father met a woman from Hicksville, and they were married at St. Ignatius in 1979!

Since entering the congregation, I have ministered in elementary education, religious education, ongoing formation for our sisters, and as a member of the Leadership Team of the congregation. I also spent two years as Vice President for Operations at Dominican Village, a senior community on the grounds of our Motherhouse in Amityville. In December of 2003, I was hired by Father Jerry Ringenback, and since then, I have coordinated Parish Social Ministry at St. Bernard's in Levittown. I have loved my time at St. Bernard's, especially working with wonderful volunteers, parishioners, and the people whom we are privileged to help—and, of course, people like Joe Samodulski!

I have ministered in the four counties of Long Island, and at present live with three other Dominican sisters in West Islip.

Domingo I de Cuaresma — Ciclo C COMUNIDAD HISPANA



Antiguamente, y también hoy en día, en los pueblos pequeños había que tener mucho cuidado con lo que se hacía y con las apariencias. Era importante que todos te viesen comportarte adecuadamente. En caso contrario, las comidillas y los comentarios comenzaban a circular con facilidad. Todo el mundo se sentía con la autoridad necesaria para entender el caso, desechar los argumentos de la defensa y dictar sentencia, generalmente condenatoria. En definitiva, todo el mundo se sentía con capacidad de ser juez. Y eso a veces a partir de datos mínimos, de hechos accidentales, que en realidad nada tenían que ver con lo que la persona era o vivía.

En la actualidad hacemos eso también con los conocidos, los amigos, los políticos, las estrellas del cine o, en general, con cualquier personaje público. Muchos hablan y parecen saber perfectamente lo que menganito o zutánito debería hacer o dejar de hacer. Muchos se atreven a dar consejos con una clarividencia tan absoluta que no entendemos cómo no han conseguido mayores triunfos en su propia vida. Sucede lo que dice el refrán: "Consejos vendo, que para mí no tengo". Los refranes no son otra cosa que el reflejo de la sabiduría popular. En el fondo la primera lectura de este domingo no es más que una acumulación de refranes o dichos. "Si se zarandea la criba, queda la cascarilla" es el comienzo del texto de hoy. Luego nos explica que en las palabras del hombre descubrimos su corazón y lo que hay en él. Es decir, que todas esas críticas y comentarios de que hemos hablado más arriba dicen más de la persona que hace el comentario que de la persona sobre la que se hace el comentario.

Jesús insiste en parecidas ideas. Jesús usa mucho el sentido común. No es extraño porque esa sabiduría popular tiene mucho de experiencia humana profunda. Y esa profundidad no puede estar anclada más que en Dios, que es nuestro creador. En ella Jesús encuentra las raíces de la sabiduría y de la relación del hombre con Dios.

La persona que señala y denuncia con tanta claridad la mota en el ojo ajeno y su disponibilidad (¿hipócrita quizá?) para ayudar a eliminarla, no hace más que poner al descubierto las pobrezas humanas de su propio corazón. Lo suyo, como dice Jesús, no es una mota sino una viga. Deberíamos aprender a ser muy prudentes a la hora de denunciar o condenar las acciones de nuestros hermanos. ¡Tenemos el tejado de cristal! Pero además deberíamos tener el valor de mirar dentro de nuestro corazón sin miedo y tratar de remover sinceramente la viga que seguramente tenemos. Así estaremos más ligeros para seguir a Jesús y amar a nuestros hermanos y hermanas.
