Banning "God" from Graduation Speeches

More than two centuries after Freedom of Religion and Freedom of Speech were enshrined in the First Amendment to the Constitution these rights are often in the news during Graduation season.

- * A H.S. graduating senior in PA, whose faith is a driving force behind everything she does, was told to leave any reference to her religious beliefs from her graduation speech.
- * A university in CO reversed its decision to remove a Bible verse from the graduation speech of a nursing student selected by her classmates to address the class.
- * An IL valedictorian was told just ten minutes before graduation that he would not be permitted to deliver his graduation speech because it was too religious.

Alliance Defending Freedom said, "It is ...well established that (school) officials cannot silence speech simply because it expresses a particular viewpoint, including a religious one."



Every day, people in our community are helped because of support from funds raised through the Catholic Ministries Appeal. Today, consider a Dad like Tom.

It was the weekend and I was at a local bar partying. That was my routine. Apparently the guy near me was partying harder and next thing I know we're in a bad fight. And in that one heated, drunken moment I lost everything. I was arrested for assault and sentenced to seven years in one of the worst prisons in New York State.



All I could keep thinking was, "This isn't possible. It can't be happening to me." But it was. When I got there I did everything I could to get out early. I took part in a prison substance abuse program because alcohol had been a mitigating circumstance in my case. I also served as an assistant to a college professor who taught classes for inmates, helping them earn high school diplomas. I loved the work and did that for four years. In the meantime I trained myself to read a book a day, joined a music program and taught myself to play guitar. But even with all my good behavior it was still five and a half years before I was released on parole

When I finally got back home to Long Island I tried hard to start life over but it was difficult. Not only did I have to find a job and a place to live, I had to reconnect with family and figure out who my real friends were. To make matters worse I was unhappy with the outpatient program I had been assigned to. I felt like I was just a number to them so I took a chance and transferred to Catholic Charities.

The change in atmosphere was like night and day. They had a more spiritual approach and didn't judge me for my past. In fact, they helped me understand that my experiences were valuable life lessons. I finally started feeling good about myself, like I was a part of the community. Today, I work a full time job, have a beautiful family and I haven't had a drink since 2010. It wasn't easy but the team at Catholic Charities gave me the get-up-and-go I needed to make a fresh start.



Cada día, personas de nuestra comunidad reciben ayuda que proviene de los fondos recaudados por la Campaña de Apoyo a los Ministerios Católicos. El día de hoy, conozca el caso Tom, un padre de familia.

Era fin de semana y como era mi costumbre, estaba en un bar, divirtiéndome. Al parecer, otro cliente que estaba cerca a mí había bebido más que yo, lo siguiente que recuerdo es que nos enfrascamos en tremenda pelea. En un momento de furia y embriaguez perdí todo lo que tenía. Causé lesiones graves y por ello fui arrestado y sentenciado a 7 años, a purgarlos en una de las peores cárceles del Estado de Nueva York.



Yo me repetía constantemente "Esto no es posible, esto no me puede estar pasando a mí". Pero en verdad sí me estaba sucediendo. Cuando llegué a la prisión hice todo lo que pude para completar mi condena lo más pronto posible. Estando en la cárcel, participé en un programa de tratamiento para el abuso de sustancias pues reconocí que yo bebía en exceso para atenuar circunstancias de mi vida. También hice la labor de asistente del profesor universitario quien daba clases a los presos, ayudándolos a obtener sus diplomas de escuela secundaria. Me encantaba mi trabajo y lo hice por cuatro años. Mientras tanto, me propuse leer un libro cada día, me uní al programa de música y de forma autodidacta aprendí a tocar la guitarra. Aún con mi mejor comportamiento tuve que purgar cinco años y medio, antes de conseguir salir en libertad condicional.

Cuando finalmente regresé a Long Island, traté de volver a iniciar una vida pero me fue difícil. No sólo tenía que encontrar un trabajo y un lugar para vivir, sino que también tenía que volver a conectarme con mi familia y reconocer quiénes eran mis verdaderos amigos. Para empeorar las cosas, yo no estaba contento con el programa ambulatorio al que me habían asignado. Sentía que para ellos yo sólo era uno más del montón, así que me arriesgué y me transferí a Caridades Católicas.

El cambio de ambiente para mí fue como ir de la noche al día. Aquí tenían un enfoque más espiritual y no me juzgaban por mi pasado. De hecho, me ayudaron a comprender que mis experiencias eran valiosas lecciones de vida. Finalmente comencé a sentirme bien conmigo mismo, a sentirme parte de la comunidad. Hoy, trabajo a tiempo completo, tengo una hermosa familia y desde el 2010 no he bebido ni una copa. No fue fácil, pero el equipo de Caridades Católicas me ayudó a dar los primeros pasos que necesitaba para tener un nuevo comienzo.
