# 14<sup>th</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

### **SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT**

While we are now in what used to be the lazy, hazy days of summer, there are some events that I ask all of us to pay attention to so that we are properly prepared when they occur. Recently, Bishop Barres and Mr. Tom Renker, head attorney for the Diocese of Rockville Centre, met with all the pastors of our Diocese to discuss new legislation for victims suffering from sexual abuse. This law could have a profound impact on our parishes and Diocese. There will be more information forthcoming as I receive it from Rockville Centre and will share it with you as best I can.

#### What is the Child Victims Act?

The Child Victims Act (CVA) is a law that was passed by the NY State assembly and legislature and signed by our Governor that will change the state's strict statue of limitations on sexual crimes against children. The CVA will open up a one year window to revive past claims of any age.

#### What doe the CVA Do?

The CVA does three main things: 1) extend New York's statue of limitations to allow for criminal charges against sexual abusers of children until their victims turn 28 for felony cases, up from the current age of 23; 2) allow victims to seek civil action against their abusers and institutions that enabled them until they turn 55; 3) open up a one year, one time only period, to allow all victims to seek civil action, regardless of how long ago the abuse occurred.

### Who will it affect?

This law will affect any organization that works with children and had a child molester as an employee, minister, or volunteer including churches, public and private schools, the Boy & Girl Scouts, day care centers, etc.

## When will the CVA go into effect?

The CVA will go into effect on August 14/15 and continue until August 14/15 of 2020.

#### What else does the CVA mean?

The CVA means that sexual abuse is not only limited to our church. As the Bishops of New York State, the CVA "now recognizes that child sexual abuse is an evil not just limited to one institution, but a tragic societal ill that must be addressed in every place where it exists."

#### What can I do?

While we are in the waiting period, the best thing you can do is pray that the passage of the Child Victims Act brings some measure of healing to all survivors by offering them a path of recourse and reconciliation. Please also pray for our church that we too will continue to heal and grow despite the darkness that seems to surround us.

I pray that during this 4<sup>th</sup> of July weekend we give thanks to God for our founding fathers and mothers who sacrificed their lives so that we can freely live, worship and express our faith whether in church or out in the public square. Please welcome Deacon Mañuel Ramos, who will speak to us about our Diocesan Mission in the Dominican Republic this weekend and Fr. Shelton Dias who has arrived. Fr. Andres and Fr. Frank will be away for the whole month of July.

May this summer be for you and your families a time of prayer and renewal. Remember to always do things for the greater glory of God. May God bless you and Mary keep you and your families always. *St. Ignatius Loyola, pray for us!*

**DREAM Act:** The Catholic Conference has long <u>supported this legislation</u> to enable undocumented people who were brought to America as children and have been productive, law-abiding members of society, to access certain state financial aid to enable them to attend college. Early in the legislative session, the legislature passed the bill and the governor signed it into law.

**Farmworkers Fair Labor Practices Act:** Just before the end of session, the <u>legislature passed</u> a bill <u>long supported</u> by the Catholic Conference to guarantee to farmworkers many of the rights enjoyed by every other sector of the workforce, including the right to collectively bargain, workers compensation and unemployment insurance, a day of rest every week, housing that conforms to the sanitary code, and overtime pay after 60 hours.

#### **Education**

**Substantial Equivalency Guidelines:** Late last year, the state Department of Education (SED) issued "guidelines" requiring public school districts to make site visits to most religious and independent schools to determine if their instruction was substantially equivalent to that of public schools, as is required by state law. Rather than address specific concerns that have been raised about a limited number of non-Catholic religious schools that might be shown to have deficiencies, SED chose to require *all* religious and independent schools to be evaluated by public schools on an on-going basis, putting public schools in a position to determine whether religious and independent schools in their districts could continue to operate. The Catholic school superintendents are happy to demonstrate the academic rigor of our schools as being equivalent or superior to public schools, but believe putting this task on our competitors is <u>inappropriate and unnecessary</u>. Lawsuits filed by Catholic, Jewish, and other schools <u>were successful</u> in having the guidelines thrown out, but now SED has introduced essentially the same rules in the form of regulations, which are currently in a public comment period. The Conference is working with the Board of Regents and is also pursuing a long-term legislative solution to the matter.

#### **Child Protection**

**Child Victim's Act:** This act passed the legislature in late January and was signed by the governor. It extends the civil statute of limitations for child sexual abuse to the victim's age 55, and the criminal statute of limitations to the victim's age 28. Further, it creates a one-year "window" where survivors can bring claims for old time-barred cases no matter how long ago. The Conference, which had long opposed the bill, removed opposition when legislators amended it to include survivors of abuse in public institutions. Previously, as we pointed out for many years, public schools and municipalities were shielded from the retroactive window due to a loophole in existing law. The Conference called on the legislature to completely eliminate the criminal statute of limitations and provide an opportunity for mediation to those who preferred it over litigation. The sponsors declined at the time, but legislation was taken up later in session to significantly extend criminal statutes of limitations for many sex crimes, including against minors.

**Erin's Law:** On the last night of the legislative session, New York became the 37<sup>th</sup> state to pass Erin's Law, which mandates age-appropriate curricula in grades K-8, which helps children, school staff and parents to spot grooming and other behaviors that may lead to abuse, and educates them on how to avoid and report abuse or potential abuse. The Catholic Conference <u>strongly supported</u> this legislation.

**Background Check Fee Increase:** Hidden away in state budget, which passed earlier this session, was an increase in the state fee for employee criminal background checks, bringing the total cost from \$65 per employee to \$95. The state should be promoting policies to encourage more businesses and not-for-profits to perform background checks. This will have the opposite effect, potentially at the expense of children. The Catholic Conference asks the state to revisit this issue in the next session and to pass legislation to reimburse not-for-profits for criminal background checks aimed at preventing child sexual abuse and other crimes.

#### **Other**

**Marijuana Legalization:** Gov. Cuomo came out strongly in favor of legalization of recreational marijuana this session, after years of holding the opposite viewpoint. The Catholic Conference <u>released a statement</u> in March opposing legalization. Fortunately, the measure was not passed this session. The legislature did, however, pass legislation effectively decriminalizing possession and expunging criminal records for low-level marijuana convictions.







5 de junio - San Bonifacio (754). Conocido como el "apóstol de Alemania", san Bonifacio fue un monje dedicado a predicar el evangelio en Alemania. Convirtió a muchos al cristianismo y restauró diócesis en Baviera, Turingia y Franconia.

17 de junio - Santa Emilia de Vialar (1856). Aristócrata francesa, santa Emilia usó el dinero de su herencia para fundar una orden religiosa, la Congregación de las Hermanas de san José de la Aparición. Cuidaban a los enfermos y fundaron escuelas en Europa, África y Asia.

23 de junio - Domingo del Corpus

Christi. En esta solemnidad celebramos la transformación del pan y el vino en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo en la Eucaristía. Esta solemnidad fue establecida por el papa Urbano IV en 1264 como respuesta a la necesidad de un día festivo dedicado a la Eucaristía.

29 de junio - Santos Pedro y Pablo (siglo I). Pedro, un humilde pescador transformado en algo extraordinario por la gracia de Dios, fue elegido por Jesús para dirigir la Iglesia. Saulo perseguía a la Iglesia en sus primeros tiempos, pero se convirtió en el gran apóstol Pablo, transformado también por la gracia.

# P ¿Qué es la culpa católica?"

La cultura de masas se suele referir negativamente a la "culpa católica", dando a entender que los católicos se sienten abrumados por su conciencia pesarosa de

> haber obrado mal. Lo cierto es que la culpa tiene una función. Nuestra conciencia es como la brújula en nuestro auto y la culpa es lo que nos dice que vamos por mal camino. Nos ayuda a recuperar el

rumbo en este caso hacia el Cielo.

Hay culpa buena y culpa mala. La culpa buena es la que sentimos cuando hacemos algo a propósito a sabiendas de que está mal, es decir, si pecamos. El pecado daña nuestra relación con Dios y es perjudicial para nosotros. La culpa "sana" requiere que el corazón se arrepienta y que cambiemos de comportamiento. Para los católicos la culpa debería desaparecer cuando se recibe el perdón en la confesión.

Sin embargo, la culpa que no se corresponde con el pecado, o seguir sintiendo culpa por los pecados ya confesados, es culpa mala. Esta culpa "inútil" niega la bondad de Dios, su misericordia y su poder para salvar. También nos quita la paz y la alegría. Si usted forceja con la culpa mala, pida ayuda a un sacerdote, a un consejero o a un amigo en quien confíe.


