Mass with Cremated Remains

- The Urn Carrier will be placed in the middle aisle at the first diamond by the Greeter.
- The family will meet in the back of the Church (Broadway) as usual.
- The Urn will be placed on the Urn Carrier by a family member, greeter or Funeral Director.
- The Urn will be blessed by the priest in the back of the Church.
- One family member or the Funeral Director while processing with the Urn Carrier will follow the priest and the altar servers to the foot of the altar, turn the Carrier to face the congregation and rest it over the Cross on the floor.
- Family members will follow the Urn Carrier to the foot of the Altar.
- A picture may be placed on the Urn Carrier by a family member, up to an 8x10 preferred, any larger and an easel will be needed.
- Flowers may be placed by a family member on or in front of the Urn Carrier depending upon the size of the floral arrangement. Please keep the arrangement on the small size such as a small vase, small spray or circlet of flowers.
- A religious object, such as Rosary or Prayer book may be placed on the Urn Carrier.
- The family will then take their seats and the Mass will continue as usual.
- After final Commendation and prayer, the Urn Carrier will be recessed back up the aisle by family member or Funeral Director.
- The family will take the urn to its place of rest.





Para la reflexión

¿Cómo miras y valoras a los que no pertenecen a tu familia, a tu nación, a tu raza? ¿Das por sentado que son peores que los tuyos? ¿Qué valores positivos encuentras en ellos? ¿Qué podrías hacer para establecer relación o amistad con algunos de ellos? ¿Crees que te ayudaría a romper la desconfianza y vencer los prejuicios?

La propuesta de las lecturas de hoy es otra bien distinta. En línea con el mensaje evangélico del Reino de Dios. Se nos habla de la hospitalidad. La primera lectura, del libro del Génesis, nos muestra a Abrahán, el patriarca, que no sólo acoge a los que le piden hospitalidad sino que suplica a aquellos tres hombres que se queden en su casa y que coman de su mesa. La hospitalidad para aquellos pueblos era un deber sagrado y al visitante se le debía todo el respeto del mundo. Era como si fuera el mismo Dios el que visitaba la casa. Al texto del Evangelio se le han dado muchas explicaciones, pero generalmente se nos ha olvidado la más sencilla: Marta y María acogieron al Señor en su casa. Ese es el punto de partida sin el que aquel pequeño rifi-rafe entre Marta y Maria nunca habría sucedido.

Hoy tendríamos que recuperar la virtud de la hospitalidad. Frente a los vecinos del piso o apartamento de enfrente. Pero también frente a los vecinos del sur que llaman a las puertas de nuestra nación pidiendo un trabajo que les asegure el pan y el futuro a ellos y a sus familias. También frente a los que no creen en nuestra misma religión y frente a los que no pertenecen a nuestra raza ni hablan nuestra lengua. Todos somos hermanos y hermanas. Todos pertenecemos a la familia de Dios. La encarnación de Jesús ha convertido a cada hombre y mujer en el mejor y más pleno sacramento de la presencia de Dios entre nosotros. Acogerlo, compartir con él o con ella lo que tenemos significa acoger al mismo Dios que nos viene a visitar, hacer realidad el Reino en nuestro mundo, dar cumplimiento a la voluntad de Dios que quiere que todos nos sentemos a la misma mesa para compartir la vida que él nos ha regalado.
