

### CAPITAL CAMPAIGN-CONTINUING OUR MISSION-ALMOST THERE

As of September 17, 2019 the amount that we have reached in paid pledges of our Capital Campaign is \$1,458,073.34. we have reached approximately 97% of our goal. Congratulations and a big thank you to all who have completed their pledges. While we are edging closer to the goal of 1.5 million, much of the pledges have trickled off because many have been completed. I thank those who are still giving and urge to continue to do so. Also, for you who have not given yet to the campaign, you too can still be a part of this. Our campaign is about equal sacrifice, not equal giving! Please contact Jeanne or Dave in the Business Office to sign up and donate. As a reminder, the campaign's purpose is to 1) severely lower our debt of \$2.8 million that has accumulated over many years and 2) help us with improving our infrastructure. During this month, a company called Sentry will be here to install a fire alarm for our church. In addition, they will also place cameras around the front of the church property for our security. This is your dollars at work! I thank you again for your sacrifice and your financial gifts.

While our campaign is still going on, our Sunday collections have tanked. Two weeks ago, our Sunday collection was only \$6,251. This is abominably low compared to our average Sunday collection of about \$11,000 each week. If we keep operating like this, St. Ignatius will incur another severe debt that will eventually cripple our operations. I am sincerely asking each of you to give to our Sunday collection from your heart to help us pay our bills, employ our employees and to continue to spread the good news of the Gospel. One of my main jobs as Pastor is to keep the doors of St. Ignatius Loyola open. But I cannot do that without your financial help. Later this month and in November, I will speak about an increased offertory program. Here is a scripture passage to reflect upon as you prepare to give each Sunday: "The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully." Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. 2 Corinthians 9:6-9

### OCTOBER IS RESPECT LIFE MONTH

During this month of October, we mark it as Respect Life Month where we are to focus on the dignity of human life from natural conception to natural death. The theme is Christ Our Hope: In Every Season of Life." Bishop Nelson Perez, of Cleveland, writes "Jesus is the anchor of hope to which we all cling". Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann, chairman of the Committee on Pro-Life Activities for the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, said this year's theme is particularly suited for these challenging times. "While attacks against human life seem to grow ever more numerous and callous, we know that Christ has conquered sin and death. Through our Christian hope in the resurrection, we are given the grace to persevere in faith." We know the attacks on the pre-born have certainly increased here in the state of New York with the recent passage of the Reproductive Health Care Act which allows abortion within the last three months of the child's birth. This is our state celebrating DEATH! Do you want this for our state? I certainly do not. Pope Francis reminds us that all life has inestimable value; even the weakest and most vulnerable, the sick, the old, the unborn and the poor, are masterpieces of God's creation, made in his own image, destined to live forever and deserving of the utmost reverence and respect. Let's not be a throw away culture. I encourage you to support life by participating in the Catholic Daughter's Spiritual Adoption Program beginning this Sunday and in the Prayer for Life Rosary Night sponsored by our St. Ann's Mother's Prayer Group and Catholic Daughters on Friday October 18, 2019 at 7:30pm in the church. May our efforts to protect life be fruitful as we continue to remember to always act and worship for greater glory of God! May God bless you and Mary keep you and your families always. St. Ignatius Loyola, pray for us!



¿Me cuesta dar las gracias cuando me hacen un favor? ¿Calculo cómo voy a devolverlo o me dejo llevar por el agradecimiento sencillo? ¿Vivo mi relación con Dios como una acción de gracias continua? ¿Por qué se dice que la Eucaristía es una acción de gracias?

En nuestra cultura damos las gracias cuando nos hacen un favor o nos regalan algo. Cuanto más inesperado o más gratuito, más sentidas son las gracias. Siempre es un reconocimiento de que hemos recibido algo de forma gratuita. Lo que se recibe de esa manera adquiere un valor tal para la persona que establece una relación con el donante que va más allá de cualquier consideración interesada o egoísta. El favor no se devuelve. Simplemente se establece una relación de gratuidad, de cariño, entre las personas. No hay cálculo de costes. Hay relación personal, un lazo que es difícil de romper.

Hay personas que, olvidándose de la gratuidad, tratan de convertir esa relación en una relación comercial. Y el favor se devuelve calculando los costes del favor recibido. Pero en ese caso la relación pierde su carácter de gratuidad y las gracias se desnaturalizan. No hay agradecimiento sino pago. En ese caso se pierde la relación. Devuelto el favor, "si te he visto no me acuerdo", como dicen el refrán.

Nuestra relación con Dios es una relación de agradecimiento. De él hemos recibido todo en total gratuidad. La vida, la libertad, el amor, la creación... No hay medida que pueda contar lo que hemos recibido. Como Eliseo, Dios no acepta nada, no le hace falta nada. En cierto sentido, nada de lo que hagamos le puede interesar. Él nos ha hecho el regalo de la vida y, en su amor total por nosotros, no tiene más interés que lo disfrutemos, que lo gocemos, que vivamos a fondo nuestra responsabilidad, que hagamos realidad la fraternidad entre nosotros y con toda la creación. Más allá de la devolución del favor -intento imposible con relación a Dios-, brota el agradecimiento, la acción de gracias. Ahí nos encontramos con la salvación. El que vive en "acción de gracias permanente" vive la salvación. Jesús cura a los 10 leprosos. Pero sólo del que vuelve dice que "su fe le ha salvado". Los otros están perdidos en su laberinto. Menos mal que Dios les quiere igual.


