# 32<sup>nd</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME LUKE 20:27-38 November 10, 2019

## BELIEF IN THE RESURRECTION IS THE CENTER OF OUR FAITH

Last Monday evening, we had our annual All Souls' Day Mass remembering all those who have died and gone before us this past year. During the Mass, we read each of the names of the funerals that were held here at Church. We also asked our parishioners, whose family member had funerals in other places, to call out their names. While each name was read, a candle was lit from the Easter Candle and given to each family, reminding them that new life from the light of Christ abounds for their loved ones. We do this each year marking the importance of All Souls' Day and the month of November, a month where the Church marks and prays for all the dead, especially for all those souls who are in purgatory waiting to enter into Heaven. We do this in faith and with faith, not to say goodbye, but until we meet again.

Luke's Gospel and the reading from the Maccabees this Sunday, is all about death and resurrection. In the Gospel of Luke, the Sadducees ask Jesus a question concerning marriage to ridicule the idea of the resurrection. They unlike the Pharisees, do not believe in the resurrection. The Sadducees follow only the first 5 books of the Bible, known as the Torah. They claim that since the Torah offers no clear teaching on the resurrection, it does not exist.

In his own genius way, Jesus answers them by saying that marriage is an earthly concept. He quotes Genesis 1:28 saying that the main goal of marriage in Judaism is to have children to replace those who will eventually die. However, in the age to come, replacement is not necessary because all who benefit from the resurrection will never die again. Jesus is also saying that if a spouse loses another spouse, it is okay to marry again. Jesus quotes Exodus 3 where God tells Moses that He is the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, who are already physically dead. He implies that God would not say this if they were actually dead. God is invoking their names because these three Patriarchs are alive with God beyond the grave.

As Christians, the doctrine of the bodily resurrection is central to what we believe. St. Paul tells us that if Christ has not been raised, then empty (too) is our preaching; empty (too) your faith" **1Cor 15:14.** What else would really motivate our earliest Christian martyrs who went to their graves confident that they will be called back to life. This was the same courage that Jonas Maccabees and his brothers had even before Jesus, in facing the tortuous actions of a murderous king. The fear of death was also conquered when Jesus conquered the grave. Each of us share in this victory over death by our Baptism. For death no longer holds us captive. That is why we can pray with St. Paul when he says to death, "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" May each of us lean into these words of comfort this week.

During the month of November, let us pray the early Christian hymn found in **Ephesians 5:14** that was usually recited at Baptisms. It reminds us that life does not end at the grave, but only begins in a new way, after death. "Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ will give you light" (1 Cor 15:55) I pray that this prayer gives each of us hope knowing that one day we will be with our loved ones and our God forever. Amen!

Remember to always act and worship for greater glory of God! May God bless you and Mary keep you and your families always. *St. Ignatius Loyola, pray for us!*

### Para la reflexión

La fe nos invita a creer más allá de lo que vemos, ¿creemos verdaderamente en la promesa de que Dios nos va a resucitar? ¿Dejamos que la idea de la muerte nos angustie o pensamos que no es más que un paso necesario para encontrarnos con el Padre Dios que tanto nos quiere?

La resurrección es algo muy parecido a ese amor eterno que se prometen los que se casan. Lo que sucede es que el amor que se prometen los que se casan a veces no es en realidad eterno más que en la intención. Se termina, se acaba. A veces las personas no son capaces de mantener sus promesas. No se trata de pensar en quién es el culpable. La verdad es que somos muy limitados y a veces no podemos dar más de sí. La resurrección, en cambio, es la promesa de Dios. Y él sí que puede hacer esas promesas. Y mantenerlas. Y cumplirlas. Él nos ha prometido a nosotros, sus hijos, la vida eterna. Nos ha dicho que vamos a vivir para siempre. Porque no nos creó para la muerte sino para que vivamos y tengamos vida en abundancia.

¿En qué va a consistir la resurrección? Pues no sabemos con certeza. Pero vamos a confiar en Dios, nuestro Padre, porque todo lo que venga de él será bueno para nosotros. Y de él no puede venir más que la vida. Eso es lo que dice Jesús a los saduceos que le preguntan por ese complicado caso en el Evangelio: ¿Por qué tenemos que suponer que la vida eterna va a ser como ésta, así de limitada, así de pobre? ¿No es Dios un Dios de vivos? El que creó este mundo, ¿no será capaz de crear mil mundos distintos donde la vida se pueda desarrollar en plenitud, en una plenitud que nosotros, con nuestra mente limitada por las fronteras de este universo, no podemos ni siquiera imaginar? Una confianza así es la que manifestó la familia de que se nos habla en la primera lectura. No saben ni el cómo ni el cuándo ni el dónde, pero están seguros de que Dios los levantará de entre los muertos. Y de que hará buenas todas sus promesas. También nosotros creemos en él y estamos convencidos de que Dios hará eterna nuestra vida y eterno nuestro amor.
