SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING (34TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME) LUKE 25:35-43

Thanksgiving, is the one holiday (holyday) where all people of our nation of different faiths, color and nationalities celebrate and come together as one and give thanks to our God for everything that has been granted to us. I share with you a proclamation given President Abraham Lincoln that resonates strongly, most especially today, in our troubled times. Without God, we are nothing.

PROCLAMATION OF THANKSGIVING BY PRESIDENT ABRAHAM LINCOLN

The year that is drawing toward its close has been filled with the blessings of fruitful fields and healthful skies. To these bounties, which are so constantly enjoyed that we are prone to forget the source from which they come, others have been added, which are of so extraordinary a nature that they cannot fail to penetrate and soften the heart which is habitually insensible to the ever-watchful providence of Al-



mighty God. In the midst of a civil war of unequaled magnitude and severity, which has sometimes seemed to foreign states to invite and provoke their aggressions, peace has been preserved with all nations, order has been maintained, the laws have been respected and obeyed, and harmony has prevailed everywhere, except in the theater of military conflict; while that theater has been greatly contracted by the advancing Armies and Navies of the Union.

Needful diversions of wealth and of strength from the fields of peaceful industry to the national defense have not arrested the plow, the shuttle, or the ship; the ax has enlarged the borders of our settlements, and the mines, as well of iron and coal as of the precious metals, have yielded even more abundantly than heretofore. Population has steadily increased, notwithstanding the waste that has been made in the camp, the siege, and the battlefield, and the country, rejoicing in the consciousness of augmented strength and vigor, is permitted to expect continuance of years with large increase of freedom.

No human counsel hath devised, nor hath any mortal hand worked out these great things. They are the gracious gifts of the Most High God, who while dealing with us in anger for our sins, hath nevertheless remembered mercy. It has seemed to me fit and proper that they should be solemnly, reverently, and gratefully acknowledged as with one heart and one voice by the whole American people. I do, therefore, invite my fellow-citizens in every part of the United States, and also those who are at sea and those who are sojourning in foreign lands, to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November next as a Day of Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the heavens.

And I recommend to them that, while offering up the ascriptions justly due to Him for such singular deliverances and blessings, they do also, with humble penitence for our national perverseness and disobedience, commend to His tender care all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners, or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife in which we are unavoidably engaged, and fervently implore the interposition of the Almighty hand to heal the wounds of the nation, and to restore it, as soon as may be consistent with the Divine purposes, to the full enjoyment of peace, harmony, tranquility, and union. Done at the city of Washington, this third day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and of the Independence of the United States the eighty-eighth.

From all of us here at St. Ignatius Loyola, priests, sisters and staff, have a blessed and joyous Thanksgiving. Please do not go to the stores on Thanksgiving Day.

May God bless you and Mary keep you and your families. May we strive to do all things for the greater glory of God. *St. Ignatius Loyola, pray for us!*



Miguel Angel Rivera Franco, is the fourth of six siblings. His parents are Maria Elsy Franco and Miguel Angel Rivera Benavides (of great memory). The young Miguel (Michael) was born September 13 of 1984 in Lolotique, San Miguel, El Salvador. He studied from 1st grade to high school in the Manuel José Arce school center in Lolotique.

In 2003, he entered the major seminary, San José de la Montaña, to continue his studies in Philosophy and Theology. He graduated in 2009 receiving his license in religious sciences by the Catholic University of El Salvador. In March 13 of 2010 he was ordained a Deacon in the Cathedral of Santiago de Maria in Usulutan. In July 2010 at the age of 25, Miguel was ordained a priest at Santiago Apostol Parish in Ciudad Barrios. (place where St. Oscar Arnulfo Romero was born). Father Miguel was the founder, manager and instructor of the radio hosts of the Catholic Radio Monsignor Romero 92.5 FM.

In 2011 he was sent to the archdiocese of San Salvador to coordinate with some activities of evangelization and also to study. He was an associate pastor in the Parish of San Juan Bautista in Cojutepeque.

In 2012, he received his master's degree in order to teach at the universities by the University of Don Bosco. He worked as a professor at various Catholic Colleges for three years in El Salvador. In 2014, he was hired to work as an associate pastor in the Parishes of Queen of the Most Holy Rosary in Roosevelt, NY and St. Martha Roman Catholic Church in Uniondale until 2017.



Then he went back to El Salvador to work for his Diocese. Now Fr. Miguel is back in the United States and has been assigned as an associate pastor for the Parishes of St. Ignatius of Loyola in Hicksville and Blessed Sacrament in Valley Stream, NY. He will serve at St. Ignatius Loyola on Wednesdays, Fridays, every 1st & 3rd Saturday of each month & on Sunday afternoon/ evevenng after celebrating mass at Blessed Sacrament. Fr. Miguel will serve at Blessed Sacrament on Tuesdays, Thursdays, 2nd & 4th Saturday & Sunday morning. Mondays will be his day off. As you can see, a busy schedule.

Father Miguel is a good soccer player. He also plays guitar, sings and has a good sense of humor. He is a friend, a brother in the community and performs his ministry with excellence as God and the Church requires it. And now he is here with us.



Respect Life News from Catholic Daughters of the Americas Court Queen of Angels No. 869 Spiritual Adoption Program Month Two - Developing Baby

"I'm dancing!"

The developing baby is now called a "fetus" which is Latin for "little one." She is making rapid progress developing all her external and internal organs. During the second month baby teeth form, and fingers and toes are developing. Her ears, nose, lips and tongue can now be clearly seen. Brain waves can now be recorded. The skeleton changes from cartilage to bone. The central nervous system is now functioning, and so forty muscle sets begin their first exercises. By 8 weeks all body systems are present. This little one is now jumping, flipping and turning - her first dance steps!

Each day for nine months, say this prayer for your Spiritually adopted baby:

Sumario reporte fiscal por el año de Agosto 2016 al 2019

St, Ignacio Loyola tuvo un operativo de perdida por el tercer año consecutivo con una perdida neta de \$17,435 por el año fiscal que termino en Agosto 31. 2018, esto mejoro en la perdida del año fiscal del 2018, que fue \$33,971, las colecciones bajaron 52% desde 2018 y han bajado 23% desde el año 2016 0 \$178,000 en ese tiempo.

Otros factores contribuyeron para estas perdidas, el aumento de salarios y gratificaciones, las colecciones de navidad y cuaresma, donaciones regulares, herencias, un positivo en aumentos en ingresos fueron las recaudaciones de fondos y el garage sale, el campeonato de golf, la rifa de los amigos de San Iganacio.

Mientras la parroquia tiene un operativo de perdida sobre los últimos dos años, la parroquia a podido reducir la deuda a la diócesis de Rockville centre de (\$2,051,389) en 2016 a (\$287,282) desde Agosto 31, 2019. Esto a sido posible por el éxito de nuestra campaña capital la cual a recaudado \$1,465,000. Hasta ahora y la cantidad de conciliación ofrecida por la diócesis de Rockville Centre que a llegado a \$1,200,000.

Aun cuando hemos bajado la deuda, la parroquia a podido completar varios proyectos que necesitábamos con este capital, desde el comienzo de la campaña, la iglesia a reemplazado las puertas de la rectoría, pintado dentro De la Iglesia, parqueo renovado, ventanas nuevas del convento, nuevas luces LED dentro De la Iglesia, reparación del campanario, compra de órgano nuevo, nuestra alarma de incendio esta ya en proceso y las dos últimos proyectos que son canales y caídas como la nueva carpeta en el altar estarán terminadas para Agosto 2020.

Este es un gran logro que sería imposible sin el soporte de los feligreses, nuestra esperanza es completar los proyectos de la campaña capital y eliminar la deuda al terminar el calendario del 2020.
