#### 2ND SUNDAY OF ADVENT Matthew 3:1-12

#### **ADVENT CHALLENGES US TO MAKE CHANGE IN OUR LIVES!**

Centuries ago, when a King wanted to make a tour of his region he would send a courier, who would go before him entrusted to bring a message to others to announce the King's coming and to help prepare them for his arrival. The people would go out into the village and beyond to clear the roads from debris or rubble to make sure that the King had a clear path to follow since there were no paved roads.

We experience the clearing of roadways, much to the chagrin of commuters, when the President or any Head of State comes to visit the City of New York. This has become a way of life for many New Yorkers. Much has to happen in order for the leader or dignitary to reach their destination as safely, quickly and efficiently as possible.

During the Second and Third Sundays of Advent, we will focus on a man whose main job is to help people prepare for the arrival of not just any leader, but the head of all peoples of the world, Jesus Christ. John the Baptist, whose name means favored by God, challenges us to clear out the paths that lead to our heart so that Jesus can enter fully into our lives. He tells us in today's Gospel from Matthew, that we cannot claim exemption from the work of discipleship or using it as a privilege in God's Kingdom just because we are baptized.

In order to clear a path for Jesus, John challenges us to repentance and conversion. Repentance means not only to be sorry for our sins and wrongdoings, but also to take the next step to change our actions. This is conversion. What is it that is preventing Jesus from fully coming into my life? What are the mountains and valleys that keep Jesus away from us?

The mountains can be the sins of arrogance, pride, selfishness, over self concern, where we feel we don't need God in our lives everyday. The valleys in our lives can be that of fear, depression and despair that falsely tell us we are no good and we have no one to turn to. Through repentance and conversion, we experience no more harm or ruin but rather peace and harmony as described by the prophet Isaiah in the first reading. Repentance and conversion also means putting faith in a king, as described by Isaiah, who will lead us in the right direction. A leader who is filled with the 7 gifts of the Holy Spirit who will help fill the earth with the knowledge of God. This King is now our Christ who is unlike any of failed kings of Israel who only thought of their own welfare and not that of the people of Israel and Judah.

Repentance and conversion allow us to see that God makes a way where there is no way. This Advent may we be open to the power of the Holy Spirit who renews and refreshes us so that we no longer belong to the shadows of a cluttered world, but to a new way to live in God which will bring us an eternity of light that will last forever.

VACCINATION

#### Statement of the Diocese of Rockville Centre Regarding Vaccinations

The Diocese of Rockville Centre has received a number of inquiries recently regarding the change in New York State Law regarding vaccination requirements for schoolchildren.

On June 13, 2019, Governor Andrew M. Cuomo signed legislation removing non-medical exemptions from school vaccination requirements for children. Public Health Law §2164, as amended by Chapter 35 of the Laws of 2019, which took effect on June 13, 2019, applies to students below the age of 18 attending all schools in the State of New York up to and including the secondary level.

Legal research obtained by the Diocesan Office of General Counsel has concluded that the new law does not apply to diocesan or parish programs and activities that are outside of the operation of actual school institutions. Therefore, Religious Education Programs, CYO Athletics, and other such diocesan or parish non-school programs do not fall under Public Health Law §2164 requiring proof of vaccination before attending "school". The New York State Department of Health has published guidelines and materials that specify further that the "new legislation does not apply to attendance at activities on school property that are open to the general public".

Therefore, the Diocese of Rockville Centre does not mandate proof of vaccination for attendance at, or participation in, such non-school programs.

#### Para la reflexión

¿Creo que este mundo es injusto? ¿En dónde veo la injusticia? ¿Contribuyo de alguna manera con mis actitudes y mi comportamiento a que siga habiendo injusticia? ¿Cómo? ¿Por qué? ¿Qué puedo hacer para promover la justicia en mi barrio, en mi familia, con mis amigos, en mi trabajo, en mi país?.

El Adviento, el tiempo que estamos celebrando ahora en la liturgia y que nos invita a prepararnos para la venida del Señor, nos ofrece una respuesta. De alguna forma, comienza reconociendo la situación. La primera lectura, del profeta Isaías, nos habla de uno que va a venir. Es una rama del tronco de Jesé, un descendiente de David. Tendrá el espíritu del Señor para gobernar conforme a sus preceptos. No juzgará por las apariencias sino que hará justicia a los débiles y dictará sentencias justas. Decir todo eso es reconocer claramente que la justicia que ahora hay en nuestra sociedad no es buena. No llega a todos por igual. Pero, la lectura del profeta Isaías, reconociendo que la situación actual no es buena, nos invita a vivir en la esperanza. Porque va a haber un día en que sí va a haber justicia para todos. Un día en que termine la violencia y todos nos volveremos hacia el que tiene el espíritu del Señor. En él encontraremos la justicia que necesitamos.

Pero es necesario un paso intermedio. Juan Bautista en el Evangelio nos lo recuerda. Es necesaria la conversión. Si esperamos al Señor, hay que empezar a preparar los caminos para su venida. Es decir, hay que vivir ya, aquí y ahora, como si Él estuviera ya aquí. Esa es la mejor preparación. Juan Bautista nos lo dice claramente: "Cambien su vida y su corazón". Porque estaría muy mal quejarse de que no hay justicia al tiempo que practicamos la injusticia entre nosotros. Si no empezamos ya ahora a practicar la justicia, quizá es que, jay!, en el fondo no la deseamos.
