Closing of Our Lady of Mercy School, Hicksville

We are deeply saddened by the announced closing of Our Lady of Mercy School, Hicksville. Established by the Sisters of Mercy nearly sixty years ago, this closing is a great loss to the students, parents, teachers, administrators, support staff and volunteers who have served the school so faithfully during its history. The school will close at the conclusion of the current 2019-2020 school year.


Unfortunately, the drop in enrollment and the decline in tuition income makes the goal of providing a quality education to nurture and develop students academically, emotionally and spiritually, unsustainable. From the 2012-13 school year to the 2019-20 school year, Our Lady of Mercy School has seen enrollment decrease 72% from 368 students to 104 students in Kindergarten through eighth grade. Over the same period, Our Lady of Mercy has seen enrollment decrease 61% from 469 students to 181 students in Nursery through eighth grade.

As enrollment has declined, the income from tuition and fundraising has also decreased, and the amount of parish and diocesan contribution has increased dramatically. From the 2012-13 school year through the 2018-19 school year, the parish has provided a total of \$2.36 million in operating support and the Diocese of Rockville Centre has provided almost \$500,000 in additional core contribution. The parish subsidy for the 2018-19 school year was 52% of total parish collections. In the current 2019-20 school year, the parish is anticipated to provide at least \$400,000 in operating subsidy and the diocese is expected to provide approximately \$200,000 in core contribution. This level of financial dependence on the parish and diocese is not sustainable.

Students from Our Lady of Mercy will be welcomed into any Catholic elementary school in the Diocese of Rockville Centre. There are a number of neighboring parish Catholic elementary schools that are prepared to welcome Our Lady of Mercy students into their communities. These schools include: Holy Family School in Hicksville, St. Edward the Confessor School in Syosset, and St. Patrick's School in Huntington.



Para la reflexión

¿Ha habido algún momento de mi vida en que me haya dado cuenta de verdad de lo que significa ser cristiano y seguir a Jesús? ¿Qué debería hacer para vivir mi bautismo con mayor fidelidad? ¿Trato de vivir como cristiano a lo largo de todo el día y con aquellos con los que me encuentro?

Lo que hoy es apenas en la mayor parte de las parroquias un echar un poco de agua sobre la cabeza del recién nacido, era al principio de la historia del cristianismo y lo es todavía en algunas parroquias, un sumergirse completamente en el agua. El agua es principio de muerte (en el agua nos ahogamos, no podemos respirar, lo que se echa al agua se disuelve, se deshace, deja de existir) pero también es principio de vida (científicamente se puede afirmar que la vida comenzó en el agua, el feto está envuelto en líquido, del agua se resurge limpio y puro). El Bautismo tiene pues un significado básico: expresa la muerte y la resurrección de una persona. El que se bautiza muere a una vida y al salir del agua comienza una nueva vida. Por eso la tradición cristiana hizo que en el Bautismo se impusiera un nuevo nombre a la persona. La nueva vida requería un nuevo nombre.

Todo es un signo. Nadie muere de verdad ni resucita de verdad. Pero hay momentos en la vida en que se requiere un signo de ese tipo que rubrique un cambio real de vida en la persona. A veces, aunque no se produzca una muerte física, se dan cambios en la vida de una persona que traen ciertamente un nuevo estilo y una nueva orientación.

Con ese sentido tan profundo se bautizó Jesús. Hasta entonces había vivido como uno más. Quizá se había retirado al desierto y allí había estado con el grupo de Juan Bautista o con otros grupos. Fue allí donde maduró su decisión, donde reconoció su llamada a anunciar la buena nueva del Reino. Por eso se bautizó. Fue una forma de refrendar públicamente su nuevo estilo de vida. El Bautismo de Jesús marca una frontera entre su vida anterior y posterior. Fue de verdad el comienzo de una nueva vida al servicio del Reino de Dios.

Para nosotros el bautismo no tiene ese sentido. La mayoría fuimos bautizados de recién nacidos. No recordamos nada de aquella celebración. No significó un antes y un después en nuestra vida. Más bien nos sentimos inmersos desde el principio en la tradición cristiana. Desde el principio de nuestra vida somos cristianos. Ahora se trata de llevar a la práctica diaria lo que nuestro bautismo celebró y significó. Como Jesús, estamos comprometidos a vivir de acuerdo con el Evangelio. A ser portadores de la buena nueva para todo el mundo.
