

GUIDE: LITURGICAL CELEBRATION "Celebrating 'Sunday of the Word of God'" By Father Nicholas Zientarski, S.T.D.

Fr. Zientarski is the Director of Worship for the Diocese of Rockville Centre.



In his recent *motu propio*, *Aperuit illis*, Pope Francis designated the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time as **Sunday of the Word of God**, when all Catholics should give special reverence to the Sacred Word, both individually and collectively as members of parishes. In the document, he writes, "Devoting a specific Sunday of the liturgical year to the word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world" (no. 2). The first celebration of this special, new day on the liturgical calendar is Sunday, **January 26, 2020**.

In reflecting on the *motu propio* and in consultation with the Liturgical Commission of the diocese, Bishop Barres recommends the following suggestions in which parishes may celebrate this speak Sunday:

• At Masses on this weekend, have a solemn procession with the Gospel book, with an extended Gospel acclamation and use of incense.

The priest or deacon takes the Gospel book and processes with it, led by a thurifer, and the prior or deacon then incomes the book before the proclamation

and the priest or deacon then incenses the book before the proclamation.

• Following the homily, have the people at Mass come forward to reverence the Gospel Book, similar to the way the cross is reverenced on Good Friday.

The Gospel book, preferably one that has an ornate cover, is held by the priest or deacon as people in the congregation come forward to kiss or touch the book.

- The lectionary or Gospel book may be put on display in a prominent place in the church. *A stand may be created and decorated for the placement of the book.*
- At some point (outside the liturgy), have an exposition and/or demonstration of Lectio Divina.
- As a practical matter, inspect lectionaries and Gospel books to see if any are in need of replacement.
- At the homes of parishioners, bibles can be placed in a prominent place and read.
- In church bulletins, pastors can explain in their letters the prominent place of sacred scripture within the Mass, both in the proclamation of the Word and within the prayers and texts of the Roman Missal

Given that January 26th is also Catholic Schools' Sunday across the diocese, children from the schools may be able to assist and take part in the activities listed above and a catechesis for them may be given on this day. 





Para la reflexión

Hemos escuchado a Jesús que nos llama a convertirnos, ¿qué significa eso para nosotros? ¿Qué tengo que hacer para convertirme y vivir como cristiano? ¿Qué deberíamos hacer como comunidad para ser testigos de Jesús en nuestro barrio?

Si ése fue el modo como Dios quería presentar su salvación a todo el mundo, desde nuestra cultura actual, le diríamos que se equivocó de medio a medio. Hoy hubiésemos planteado toda una campaña en los medios de comunicación, de lanzamiento simultáneo en los países más ricos y desarrollados del mundo (en los países pobres se lanzaría más tarde), que ofreciese con claridad los contenidos más importantes y orientados ante todo a captar la atención de los destinatarios. Para ello, se trataría de ofrecer en primer lugar los aspectos más suaves, fáciles y gratificadores del mensaje. Con suficiente antelación se habría preparado a un gran número de predicadores, conferenciantes y escritores que se entregarían a la tarea de presentar el mensaje de un modo más cercano a la gente. Pero Dios no hizo eso. Más bien lo contrario. En Jesús se acercó a los últimos. Nunca estuvo muy preocupado por el número de sus seguidores ni por su nivel social. Ni siguiera les puso las cosas fáciles. Sus primeras palabras, ponen frente al ovente una exigencia radical: "Convertios" o lo que es lo mismo, "cambiad de vida". Pero algo encontraron en él aquellas gentes sencillas y humildes que le siguieron. Con dudas y vacilaciones, pero le siguieron.

Hoy, también nosotros somos una pequeña comunidad. No ocupamos el centro del mundo. No tenemos los medios de comunicación a nuestro alcance. Ni falta que nos hacen. Apenas tenemos el Evangelio en medio de nosotros y la fuerza de Jesús para hacer lo que él hizo. Primero, escuchar su mensaje y tratar de convertirnos, de comenzar a vivir de acuerdo con el Evangelio. Y, segundo, ser portadores de ese Evangelio para todos los que nos rodean. No hay que temer porque seamos pocos o pobres. Así es como Dios quiere hacer presente su mensaje en el mundo. En nuestras manos está.
