Hello my friends, I want to thank Father Jim for the opportunity to write this week's Pastoral Letter. I apologize because it is a week late.

Last week January 21st, we started the 9 days for life, 9 days of prayer and in the middle, the March of Life in our Capital Washington where thousands of people gathered for the same cause including parishioners from our parish.

At every stage and in every circumstance, we are held in existence by God's love. The presence of an illness, disability, or any other challenging situation never diminishes the value of human life. God does not call us to perfection of appearance or abilities, but to perfection in love. Christ invites us to embrace our lives and the lives of others as true gifts.

Abortion tragically rejects the truth that every life is a good and perfect gift. Deserving protection, this violent practice ends the life of a human being at its very beginning and horribly wounds all those involved. But Christ came that we "might have life and have it abundantly" (John 10,10), taking on human flesh for the sake of our redemption, may our culture experience the power of God's transforming love. That all eyes may be opened to the incredible beauty of every human life.

Abortion is frequently a topic, in the news, political debates and everyday conversation with friends and family. Because the topic is controversial and an emotional issue, many of us feel intimidated when this topic arises, not knowing what to say.


From the first moments of existence, you had all the DNA that would determine your sex, facial features, physique, and the color of your skin, hair, and eyes. At 24 days, your heart began beating, by 8 weeks all your organs were present, and your unique fingerprints were forming. Ultrasounds show that by 18 weeks you could swim, somersault, suck your thumb, and cover your ears if you heard loud music. If you'd been born just 23 weeks after conception, your chance of survival would be 50-80 percent, by 25 weeks it would be over 90 percent, and that's still months before full term birth.

Now, if someone takes an innocent person's life after he or she is born, it's against the law; just minutes before birth, it's legal in most states and called an abortion. The only real difference is a declaration by the United States Supreme Court in Roe V. Wade (1973).

After four decades of legalized abortion, many children's lives have been ended, and many parents and family members suffer that loss- often in silence. Yet God's greatest desire is to forgive, no matter how far we have each strayed from His side. He said to us "don't be afraid, draw close to my heart": be assured that it is never to late to seek God's forgiveness in the sacrament of reconciliation.

My friends pray daily for the end of abortion, that all mothers and children experience the loving support of the church community, and that all who suffer after abortion find healing and peace. God bless you,

COMUNIDAD HISPANA



Para la reflexión

¿Somos capaces de mirarnos al espejo y aceptarnos como realmente somos: vulnerables y débiles? Cuándo nos relacionamos con los demás, ¿sentimos que nos tenemos que defender o nos mostramos como somos? ¿Creemos de verdad en la revolución de las bienaventuranzas?

Las tres lecturas de este domingo tienen un mensaje común: el Evangelio no es para los poderosos, para los orgullosos, sino para los humildes, para los que se saben pequeños. Es un mensaje que contradice lo que vivimos en nuestra sociedad. De ésta recibimos exactamente el mensaje contrario: sólo siendo fuertes podremos sobrevivir. La historia parece dar razón a esta forma de pensar. Sólo los poderosos parecen haber pasado a la historia. Los débiles han sido borrados. Simplemente no existen. Los medios de comunicación no hablan de ellos.

Jesús nos propone otra forma de vivir. Cuando proclama las bienaventuranzas, Jesús hace la más radical revolución de nuestra historia. Tan radical que nos cuesta vitalmente aceptarla. Tan radical que dos mil años de historia del cristianismo no ha logrado llevar a la práctica ese mensaje radical. Porque Jesús nos dice que los bienaventurados, los felices, los que viven bien, en el mejor sentido de la palabra, son los pobres, los que sufren, los que tienen hambre, los sencillos, los que siguen creyendo en la justicia, en la misericordia.

San Pablo remacha ese mensaje, invitándonos a mirar a nuestra asamblea, a nuestra comunidad. No está formada por poderosos ni aristócratas, ni poderosos. Independientemente del dinero que tengan algunos de nosotros, por debajo de las apariencias, somos personas normales, con sentimientos, con dolores, con pobrezas. Somos vulnerables aunque a veces pretendamos aparecer como fuertes e inalcanzables.

Entonces, ¿dónde está nuestro poder? Pues precisamente en esa debilidad reconocida y aceptada, porque sólo de ahí puede nacer la verdadera solidaridad, el amor comunitario, la caridad fraterna que nos proporcionará la verdadera seguridad. Cuando seamos capaces de amar, de ser misericordiosos sin límite, de quitarnos las corazas en que nos envolvemos, entonces viviremos auténticamente en el Reino de los Cielos.
