Faithful Protector of Mother and Child

The infant Christ "came into our world in a state of great vulnerability. He needed to be defended, protected, cared for and raised by Joseph" (PC 5). The humble and often hidden carpenter of Nazareth accompanied Mary in her pregnancy, assisted at the birth of the Messiah in a stable, presented Jesus in the Temple, fled with his family far from their homeland to protect them, and lovingly raised Jesus as his own son in the years to come.

While the angel of the Lord appeared to Mary to announce that she would bring forth the Savior of the world, it was revealed to Joseph in a series of dreams how God's plans would be brought to fulfillment. As Pope Francis highlights, "God trusted Joseph, as did Mary, who found in him someone who would not only save her life, but would always provide for her and her child" (PC 5).

Dear St. Joseph, help us to imitate your faithful trust and courage. Like every other human family, the Holy Family had to confront real and concrete challenges. Yet, "in every situation, Joseph declared his own 'fiat'" (PC 3). His "yes" to the Lord meant that regardless of the hardship and personal sacrifice to himself, he consistently chose to put the needs of Mary and Jesus before his own. Joseph's devotion helps reveal to us our own call to show special care for the lives of those whom God has entrusted to us.

During this Year of St. Joseph, each of us can find in him "an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble" (PC, Intro). Joseph shows us how to say "yes" to life, despite our own fears, frailties, and weaknesses. For it is Joseph who was "chosen by God to guide the

beginnings of the history of redemption. He was the true 'miracle' by which God saves the child and his mother" (PC 5).

May we, too, be miracles in the lives of those who are most in need, especially at the beginning and end of life. Dear St. Joseph, you who were "able to turn a problem into a possibility by trusting always in divine providence" (PC 5), help us to imitate your faithful trust and courage.

Today's readings bring these beautiful images to mind. In the Gospel, Jesus teaches his disciples about marriage: "God made them male and female. For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." While the readings focus on the relationship between man and woman, we are reminded that God created all of us – no matter our state in life – to love one another as he loves us. The capacity to love is in our DNA. Jesus invites us to be companions on life's journey, reflecting to others Christ's love for the Church.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Each year in October, our diocese invites married couples to a "Wedding Anniversary Mass." Friends and family are invited to join them as they celebrate milestone anniversaries – whether it be 5 years or 50. Just as we celebrate newlyweds, it's nice to recognize these couples – and the love that has endured well after the honeymoon ended. Just as they witnessed their love for one another on their wedding day, they have continued to do so through the ensuing years by their example. Despite the inevitable hardships, they cling to one another; through disagreements and quarrels, they find a way back to each other – and I suspect they laugh together too. By sharing their stories we, too, can witness to others a love that endures through thick and thin. In doing so, we help build up our families, our communities, and our Church.

WITNESS You may have heard of *The Moth,* a popular storytelling platform. Each of us has a story to tell, and recording family "love stories" can be a fun way to witness to our children and grandchildren what good relationships look like. Take some time to interview your parents or others in your extended family about how they met, how they've overcome the challenges they have faced as a couple, and how they have kept God at the center.



Initial Problems caused by religious teaching

In Paris also, Ignatius soon got a group of disciples. Their manner of living caused issues among the religious authorities, and he had to give an explanation to them . This incident finally convinced him that he must abstain from public religious teachings until he reached the priesthood.

Ignatian Spirituality on Finding God in all things

Finding God in all things is an important part of Ignatian Spirituality. In his Spiritual Exercises, he says: "Man is created to praise, reverence, and serve God our Lord, and by this means to save his soul. And the other things on the face of the earth are created for man and that they may help him in prosecuting the end for which he is created. ""All the things in this world are gifts of God, created for us, to be the means by which we can come to know him better, love him more surely, and serve him more faithfully." According to St. Ignatius, we should recognize God in all things, and when we see that God is all around us, every moment becomes another opportunity to serve our Creator. Ignatius mentions that finding God in all things helps us in three ways: know God better, love God more surely & serve God more faithfully. In our sorrows, we can experience His healing presence, and in our joys His graciousness. Usually, we consider good things in our lives as gifts from God. But St. Ignatius teaches us to consider each moment of our lives as a gift from God, whether it be happy or sad. According to him, we are given a choice to follow Christ in whatever we may be facing. In times of sorrow, we have to willingly pick up our crosses and in times of joy we have to celebrate the Resurrection with Him. God is with us every step of our life journey, from the moment of birth until the moment of death.



Lectura del santo evangelio según san Marcos (10,2-16):
