

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Portrayals of Jesus as a shepherd who cares for sheep often depict him carrying a sheep on his shoulders or holding a lamb in his arms. Those images are a source of great comfort, as is today's psalm: "The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want." But they don't quite capture just what hard work being a shepherd involves: tending to the flock in all kinds of weather, when the pastures are anything but verdant; waking in the wee hours to care for ewes and newborn lambs; watching some thrive and others die; not to mention being the poster child for the oft-quoted "smell of sheep." The crowd in today's Gospel lacked such a shepherd to tend and care for them, and thus "[Jesus'] heart was moved with pity for them." There are times when circumstances and events can trick us into thinking that an earthly power or perfectly-principled worldview will save us. That is when we need the Lord as our shepherd the most. Only he can save us; only he has saved us. So, in those times when we may feel lost, we can bring it all to Jesus in prayer. He is the Shepherd who knows what we need.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

I don't know about you, but I rarely miss a meal. When I do, I get cranky. And I don't like crowds of any kind outside of Wrigley Field. So imagine how exhausted Jesus and the disciples must have felt when, because crowds followed them day and night, they had "no opportunity even to eat." Even when they tried to get away and rest awhile, a vast crowd appeared. Rather than turn away, however, Jesus began to teach them – for they were hurting and in need of his care. Today's Gospel encourages us to be shepherds to one another, keeping others close. Pope Francis said it well during Holy Week 2013: "Following Jesus means learning to come out of ourselves ... to be the first to take a step toward our brothers and our sisters, especially those who are the most distant, those who are forgotten, those who are most in need of understanding, comfort and help." As we ourselves have been led by the Shepherd, we reach out to others who are in need of care.

THE MIRACLE OF THE MOST PRECIOUS BLOOD IN CROATIA

As we are in the month of July, traditionally dedicated to the Most Precious Blood of Jesus, let us try to know more about the Eucharistic Miracle of Croatia, where the wine got transformed into Blood.



In 1411, while celebrating Mass in the private chapel of Count Battyhany at Ludberg, Croatia, during the consecration of wine, the priest had a doubt on the process of transubstantiation. The wine in the chalice turned to blood, and the priest hid the chalice in the wall behind the main altar and as he was terrified, he kept it as a secret. On his deathbed, he confided in a friend. The relic of the miracle was taken to Rome, where it remained for several years, and the facts connected with the Eucharistic miracle were investigated by a commission, in the early 1500s, during the pontificate of Pope Julius II. However, the people of Ludbreg and the surrounding area, made pilgrimages to the castle chapel. Pope Leo X published a Bull on April 14, 1513, permitting veneration of the holy relic. He himself had carried the relic in procession through the streets of Rome, several times, and many people testified that they had received marvelous cures while praying in its presence. The relic was later returned to Croatia.

In the 18th century, northern Croatia was ravaged by a plague. During the session held on December 15, 1739 in the capital city of Varazdin, the Government issued a decree to build a chapel at Ludbreg in honor of the miracle if the plague ended. The plague was averted, but the promised vow was fulfilled, only in 1994, when democracy was restored in Croatia.

The chalice is on display in the main church. A copy of the Papal Bull and a copy of the Government Decree are in the Chapel of the Holy Cross where the miracle took place. Even today, thousands of the faithful are drawn by the precious relic of the miraculous Blood, and every year to commemorate the miracle, at the beginning of September the so-called "Sveta Nedilja - Holy Sunday" is celebrated for an entire week in honor of the Eucharistic miracle.

History behind the devotion to the Precious Blood of Jesus in the month of July

The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX. That year, during the First Italian War for Independence, Pope Pius IX went into exile to Gaeta. Don Giovanni Merlini, third superior general of the Fathers of the Most Precious Blood, who was with him, suggested to the Pope, that he create a universal feast to the Precious Blood to beg God's heavenly aid to end the war and bring peace to Rome. On June 30, 1849, to fulfill the vow made at Gaeta, Pius IX instituted a feast in honor of the Precious Blood on July 1, and extended the feast to the whole Church. Later the feast was removed from the church calendar in 1969, and incorporated to the feast of Corpus Christi. But to remember His blood spilt not only on the Cross but also in the Circumcision, Agony in the Garden of Gethsemane, Scourging at the Pillar of Flagellation, and the Crowning with Thorns, the feast was reinstated.

Lord Jesus, You became Man in order by your Passion and Death and the draining of your Blood on the Cross, might prove to us how much You, our God, love us. Protect us, dear Jesus, from ever running away from the sight of blood. Strengthen our weak human wills so that we will not only run away from the cross, but welcome every opportunity to shed our blood in spirit in union with your Precious Blood, so that in dving to ourselves in time we might live with You in Eternity. Amen

ST.IGNATIAN YEAR CORNER

Visions during the Sojourn at Manresa

St. Ignatius experienced a series of visions at day time, while at the hospital in Manresa. These visions were repetitive, and appeared as "a form in the air near him and this form gave him much consolation because it was exceedingly beautiful ... it somehow seemed to have the shape of a serpent and had many things that shone like eyes, but were not eyes. He received much delight and consolation from gazing upon this object ... but when the object vanished, he became disconsolate." He interpreted these visions as diabolical in nature. One day when he was sitting on the banks of the Cardoner River, "the eyes of his understanding began to open and, without seeing any vision, he understood and knew many things, as well spiritual things as things of the faith" (*Autobiography*, 30). He recorded his thoughts and experiences in a journal.

Ignatian Spirituality: Particular Exam

Ignatius declares that "(the particular exam) goes direct to the predominant sin or vice of our character; in order to vanquish its enemies, it begins by isolating them and attacks them one by one." Particular Exam is a Spiritual warfare - a battle against a particular sin. We have to keep track of how often we commit the sin which we are working to eradicate, so that we could systematically overcome that failure. A particular exam might need weeks or months. We have to spend time in analyzing the origins and "roots" of those habits/faults from our early life. Then we have to find out what triggers that now, and check whether there is any pattern of failure. We may feel that there is no progress at all, and the process can be slow and painful, but trust that if God wills it, it will happen. Real progress happens by deepening our relationship with Jesus, and by our constant efforts.



En aquel tiempo, los apóstoles volvieron a reunirse con Jesús y le contaron todo lo que habían hecho y enseñado.


Él les dijo: «Venid vosotros solos a un sitio tranquilo a descansar un poco.»
